

Hullo everyone. We hope you have all had a very happy Christmas, and all the good things disposed of. As these notes went to Press over a week ago, we cannot comment on the match played aginst Ipswich Town on December 22nd. Let up hope we were able to gather another two points to put in our League stocking. The season is now half way through, and we look back over the last four months with perhaps a feeling of not bringing off what we expected. Today we welcome our very old rivals Swindon Town. It is always a happy occasion when our two teams meet, and we are sure that the match today will be quite a thriller.


