





Professional at 17 years of age for Stourbridge, he did his National Service with the Royal Engineers at Aldershot and was an outstanding player for Southern Command who won the Command Cup while Jack was playing for them. It was during his Army service that Bristol City signed him in 1951.

Jack's mother and father are still living in his home town, he has one sister and he tells me his chief hobby is motoring.

Recently married to a Bristol girl, I would like to take the opportunity of wishing them every happiness together.



EDWARDS (I.L.) Signed two seasons ago from Chelsea. A native of Guildford.

This year's top goal scorer. DARCY (O.L.) Signed in December, 1956, from Wigan Athletic, A native of Liverpool, he previously played with Accrington Stanley.

Mr. HEAD (Manager) Appointed in October, 1956. Formerly assistant manager with Bury. Spent the major part of his playing career with Torquay United. Mr. COUSINS (Trainer) Joined Swindon as a player from Chesterfield in 1937.

Became assistant trainer in 1947 and first team trainer in 1949.


