Swindon included several very young boys, but the older professionals brought the best out of them. Kelly at centre forward, in addition to having a good game, brought Jackson, Hunt and Corbett very much into the game with some astute passes. The gate was excellent, 2,637 spectators paying for admission. Such numbers encourage the young lads, and the vocal support given helps the development of these players.


