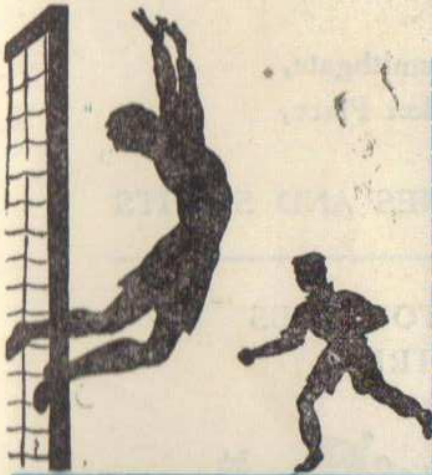

OUR VISITORS.

LAST SEASON WAS SWINDON'S BEST FOR YEARS.

Ground :—County Ground, Swindon.

Colours :—Red with White Edging. White Shorts. Black Stockings with Red Tops.

Members of the League Three (Southern Section) since it was formed in 1920-21, Swindon Town have never reached any great heights.

In their very first season in the League they finished with 52 points, and not until last season did they manage to top that figure.

In fact, last season was one of their best for several years, for they finished fourth with 57 points—only three behind Brighton and Hove, who gained promotion.

Quite naturally the good run drew bigger crowds to the County Ground, and the average home "gate" was 12,040.

Twice Swindon have managed to reach the last four in the F.A. Cup, and at one time earned the title of "giant-killers."

THE MEN FROM SWINDON WHO MAY BE IN ACTION TONIGHT.

SAM BURTON (goalkeeper). A product of local football. Joined Swindon in 1945. Played for the Wilts. Junior Eleven which reached the Final of the Counties Tournament, 1944-45. An ever-present last season. Stands 6ft. and weighs 13½st.

JOHN NEAL (right-back). Signed from Hull City, after spending one season with King's Lynn, in 1957. Represented the Southern League against the Northern League last season. An ex-professional sprinter. Stands 5ft. 9ins. and weighs 10st. 11lb.

WALTER BINGLEY (left-back). Born in Sheffield. Signed in the early part of the 1958 season from Sheffield Wednesday. An ever-present since. Was with Bolton previously. He stands 6ft. and weighs 12st.

REX TILLEY (right half-back). Signed during the close season from Plymouth. Born in Swindon. Stands 5ft. 11ins. and weighs 10½st.

JOHN FOUNTAIN (right half-back). Born in Leeds. Signed from Sheffield United in 1957. He stands 5ft. 9ins. and weighs 10½st.

GEORGE HUDSON (centre half-back). Signed in September, 1948, from Portsmouth, and gained his League place in the latter half of that season. A native of Havant (Hants.). He stands 6ft. 1½ins. and weighs 15st.

JOHN STEPHENS (outside-right). Secured in the close season from Hull City. At the age of 22 he has already been capped for Wales Under-23 Side. Stands 5ft. 8ins. and weighs 10½st.

ANDY MICKLEWRIGHT (inside-right). Was with Bristol Rovers and Bristol City before joining Swindon in the 1955-56 season. Born in Smethwick. Stands 5ft. 10ins. and weighs 11st. 5lbs.

JAMES KELLY (centre-forward). Signed from Preston North End last season, and played in the last 11 games. Stands 6ft. and weighs 12½st.

BOB EDWARDS (inside-left). Last season was second highest goalscorer with 15 goals. An ever-present last year. Joined the town in 1956 from Chelsea. Stands 5ft. 11ins. and weighs 11st. 10lbs. Born at Guildford.

ARNOLD DARCY (outside-left). Born at Blackburn. Secured from Wigan Athletic during 1956-57. Ever-present last year. Played as an amateur for Accrington Stanley in 1952-53 season. Stands 5ft. 8ins. Weighs 10st. 5lbs.

RAY CHANDLER (goalkeeper). Signed from Bristol Rovers in 1956. Born at Bath (Somerset). Stands 6ft. and weighs 13st.

LEW CLAYTON (right half-back). Signed from Bournemouth during the 1957 season. Born in Royston (Yorks.). Stands 5ft. 8ins. and weighs 10st. 6lbs.

VINCENT JACK (centre half-back). Signed from Bury in 1956-57. Tallest player on Swindon's books, standing 6ft. 3ins. and weighing 12st. 9lbs.

MAURICE OWEN (left half-back). Born at Abingdon. Shortly after signing as a professional for Swindon in 1947, he was the target for many offers from clubs in the First Division. He is 5ft. 11ins. tall, weighing 10st. 13lbs.

ALAN MOORE (outside-right). Signed from Coventry City. This will be Alan's second season with the Town. Very experienced, having seen service with Nottingham Forest, Hull City, Chesterfield and Sunderland. Born at Hebburn. He stands 5ft. 7ins. and weighs 10st. 9lbs.

JOHN RICHARDS (inside-right). Signed from the Army during the 1957-58 season, and was top goalscorer with 17. Stands 5ft. 11ins. and weighs 12½st.
