There has been a certain amount of interference around the entrances, all the rear of the terracing not available, and also no back to the lower part of the stand. We do thank you most sincerely for your forbearance, and also your true spirit of sportsmanship. While the back was wide open, we know of no incident where anyone tried to gain access to the ground by climbing under the rail. Well played everyone!

On several occasions it has been most pleasing to be congratulated by our visitors upon the sportsmanship of our spectators. The applauding of good play whether by the home team or opponents is appreciated. Excellent. Do please keep up the good work, especially today.

Sometimes, with the "knock-out" principle involved, cup-ties tend to become a little keener. Please refrain from barracking any player, and also the referee and linesmen. Remember, the officials have a very difficult job, and they certainly do their best. Decisions often have to be made in a split second. "No referee is ever wrong." Please can we have just as good a name for sportsmanship from the referee as from the visitors.

One final appeal to all spectators. Please refrain from climbing over the rails at the end of the game. At this time of the year tramping on the pitch can badly affect the ground. Also, it only creates a bottle-neck in the north-west corner, where there is no opening from the ground. Lastly, and most important, any interference with players or officials could result in the closing of the ground. Please therefore, uphold the good name of Swindon Town F.C. Real sportsmanship at all times to everyone.

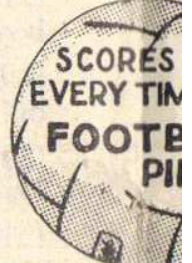

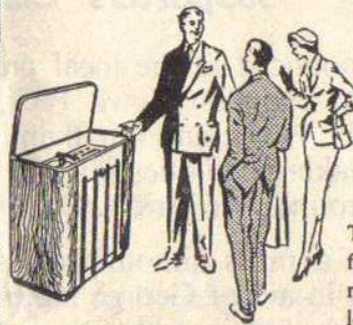
