In welcoming Swindon Town this morning, we extend to them the Compliments of the Season.

Swindon Town — or as they are known to their own supporters, the "Moonrakers" — were founded by the Rev. W. Pitt in 1881 for the young men of his parish. In 1894 they turned professional and joined the Southern League in which they played until 1920. Becoming one of the original members of League Division III in 1921, Swindon have as yet to move into higher spheres, but in the last two seasons have been strong challengers for promotion.

Their League career may be indifferent, but the same cannot be said of Swindon's F.A. Cup achievements being semi-finalists in 1910 and 1912, quarter-finalists 1911 and 1924 and reaching the Fifth Round in 1919 by beating Newcastle United 2-0 and Burnley 3-2.

SAM BURTON (goalkeeper): Product of local football. Joined Swindon in 1945. Played for Wiltshire Junior eleven which reached final of Counties Tournament 1944-45. Ever present last season. Stands 6ft., weighs 13½st. JOHN NEAL (right-back): Signed from Hull City, after spending one

JOHN NEAL (right-back): Signed from Hull City, after spending one season with King's Lynn, in 1957. A keen tackler, fast in recovery. Represented the South, in North v. South League III Representative Match last season. Has been a professional sprinter. Stands 5ft. 9ins., weighs 10st. 1lb.

JOHN FOUNTAIN (right-half): Born in Leeds. Signed from Sheffield United in 1957. He stands 5ft. 9ins., weighs 10%st.

GEORGE HUDSON (*centre-half*): Became a Swindon player in September, 1948, and gained his league place in latter half of that season. A native of Havant (Hampshire), was a professional with Portsmouth before joining the "Robins." Must be one of the strongest centre half backs in the League. He stands 6ft. 1½in., weighing 15st.

ANDY MICKLEWRIGHT (*inside-right*): Was with Bristol Rovers and Bristol City before joining Swindon in 1955-56 season. Born in Smethwick. Stands 5ft. 10ins., weighs 11st. 5lb.

JAMES KELLY (*centre-forward*): Signed from Preston North End at the start of the 1958 season, making his league debut then and completed the last eleven games of the season. Stands 6ft., weighs 12½st.

BOB EDWARDS (inside-left): Last season was second highest goalscorer with fifteen goals. He was ever present last year in the club's best year for some seasons. He joined the Town in 1956 from Chelsea. Stands 5ft. 11ins., weighing 11st. 10lbs. Born at Guildford. ARNOLD DARCY (outside-left): Born at Blackburn. Joined the "Robins"

ARNOLD DARCY (*outside-left*): Born at Blackburn. Joined the "Robins" from Wigan Athletic during 1956-57 season. Ever-present last year. Played as an Amateur for Accrington Stanley in 1952-53 season. Stands 5ft. 8ins., weighs 10st. 5lbs.
