In a hard match played in very blustery conditions at Mansfield on Monday evening we gained another well earned point, and but for a last minute equaliser we would have come away with both points. The superstitious members of our Supporters will probably attribute the loss of this point in the last minute to the fact that it was our thirteenth successive league match without defeat, but taking the match generally a draw was a fair result in weather conditions which were all against good football.

This evening we welcome the members of Swindon Town back to Carrow Road for our league fixture postponed from 24th January last. Our two matches with Swindon in the 2nd Round of the F.A. Cup proved amongst the hardest of the season, but with a continuation of the form shown against Brentford last Saturday, we hope to close the gap further between Plymouth, Hull, Brentford and ourselves.

The Reserves, who already have the Norfolk Senior Cup to their credit, make a further bid for Cup honours when they entertain Clacton Town in the semi-final of the East Anglian Cup here on Monday evening, 13th April, kick-off 7.15 p.m. Clacton have a number of players with league experience in their line-up, but victory for our lads will give them another Cup Final, against either Peterborough or Bedford Town.

To-morrow evening Norwich Boys make one of their annual appearances at Carrow Road when they entertain Colchester and N.E. Essex Boys in the Mascot Cup match. The kick-off is at 7 p.m., and we hope that there will be a good crowd to cheer the boys on.

## TWENTY-FOUR YEARS AGO

With less than a month of the 1934-35 season to go, Norwich City assured themselves of a place in the middle of the Second Division in their first season in the higher sphere when, on 6th April, they completed a fine double over Southampton, whom they had beaten 4—1 at the Dell earlier in the campaign.

This time, at the Nest, manager Tom Parker's old club fought pluckily but were unable to prevent the Canaries from getting an early advantage and steadily improving on it. Duke, Burditt and Robinson returned to the City line-up and with Russell unfit Williams went to the left wing.

The thirteenth minute was lucky for the Canaries, for in it Vinall, who had just previously been temporarily knocked out, shot them into the lead with an acute shot from a Houghton pass. Houghton added a second after receiving the ball from Williams and only two minutes later brilliant work by Warnes, who had an outstanding game, paved the way for Vinall to add a third.

Desperate defensive work by Southampton kept the score to 3—0 at the interval and although the visitors improved afterwards (despite an injury to left half Lockett) they were unable to prevent Houghton from heading City's fourth goal. The match was watched by a crowd of only 8,200.

That day also saw a great display by the Scottish national side, who beat England by two clear goals in front of a crowd of 129,693 at Hampden Park. Despite the size of the attendance the receipts were only £7,307! For the record hunters the teams were—

The Scottish goals came, one in each half, from great headers by Duncan.

The other big national sporting event that day was the Boat Race, and it provided another victory for Cambridge. In choppy water and against a head wind, they beat Oxford by  $4\frac{1}{2}$  lengths in 19 minutes 48 seconds.

A 20—1 outsider, Canteener, ridden by Steve Donoghue, won the Newbury Silver Coronation Cup by a short head from Young Native (100—6) with Gordon Richards' mount, Montrose (100—7) third.

Locally, City "A" and C.E.Y.M.S. met in their Norfolk Senior Cup semi-final replay, and again there was a tough, defensive battle. At half-time City had the lead through a goal by Embleton, but "Church" came very near to equalising through Dunthorne, who shot wide with only Hall to beat. Just before full time Deacon put C.E.Y.M.S. on terms, however, and it needed extra time to see City through to the final, Goffey getting the deciding goal.

There was only a small crowd at Gorleston where Lowestoft had a great chance to narrow the gap between themselves and the Norfolk and Suffolk League leaders. It was 1—1 at half-time but afterwards Gorleston showed their true form to run out 6—2 winners. Kelf (2), Woods (2), Bonney and Strong (penalty) were their scorers, Jones (2)

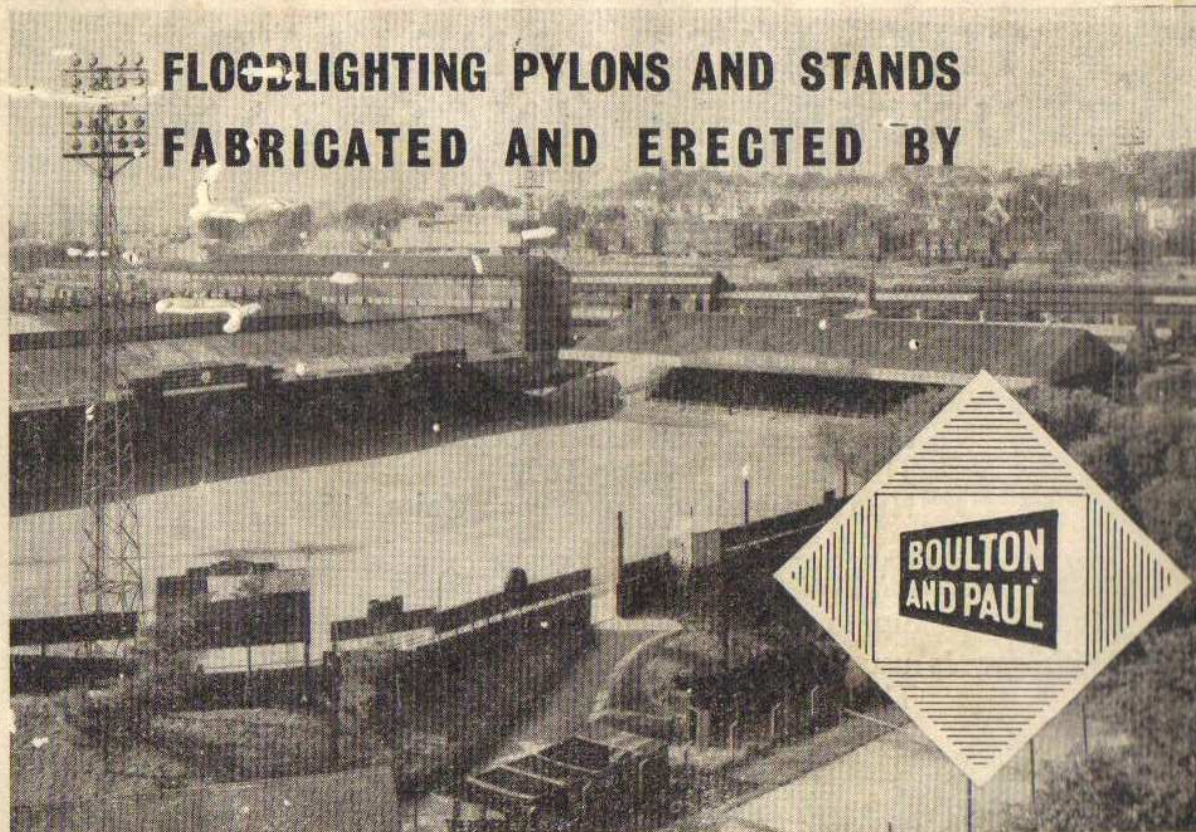
