## PICKING UP POINTS AND POINTERS

No one can say by any stretch of imagination that Barnsley have been blessed with the gifts of Lady Luck in their first Third Division games.

So many hopes were based in the effectiveness of the workings of Bert Tindill and Jimmy Baxter that the injury to Bert in the first game of all, against Brentford, was a heavy blow.

Until the injury, the Barnsley attack moved smoothly and purposefully. Some critics have said it was the best brand of soccer seen at Oakwell for sometime.

Supporters were just acclimatising themselves to this style when Tindill was injured.

### UNLUCKY AGAINST BRENTFORD.

Even then, we were unlucky not to collect at least one point from Brentford. Both their goals were scored against the run of play, and both followed incidents in which the ball was almost in their own goal.

For the match at Swindon the forward line had to be re-jigged and we did well to take a point from our opponents ground.

Tindill lined-up against Colchester but he suddenly had a recurrence of his rib injury and so once more the attack was thrown out of joint.

So really we have still to see the settled forward combination properly in action.

### THE ADVANCE OF LUNN.

Congratulations must be offered to Jack Lunn, who has succeeded Arthur Kaye on the right wing.

Jack has made an excellent start to the season by scoring a goal in each of the first three matches. He is playing with tremendous confidence, showing that he is determined to make the first team outside right position his own.

Each of his goals has come from a great shot which has left the opposition goalkeeper bewildered. Jack's great advantage is that he can shoot with either foot and has power in both.

Like men in form, Lunn is obviously enjoying his soccer. And is having his reward for patiently understudying Arthur Kaye for some years.

### RESERVES TOUGH GAMES.

Owing to the shortage of playing staff some of the younger players have been having their chance with the Central League side. And the efforts they have made have been praiseworthy to say the least.

They started off with a heavy 8-1 defeat at Liverpool. While many sides would have been discouraged by this, our lads got on with the job and were unlucky not to share the points with Manchester United. They fought very hard only to lose 2-1.

But they eventually took their first point of the season when they held Preston North End Reserves to a 1-1 draw at Oakwell on Saturday.

A very creditable performance for a side so young and in many cases without a great deal of experience.

# WELCOME TO SWINDON TOWN

Ground: County Ground, Swindon.

Manager: Mr. BERT HEAD

Until last Wednesday's game at the County Ground, Swindon, neither Barnsley nor the Wiltshire club had met each other since 1912 when they clashed in the semi-final of the F.A. Cup

And just a recap of that encounter, which produced two exciting games before Barnsley went through to the final of the F.A. Cup to become eventual winners.

In the first semi-final game, watched by 78,000 people on Chelsea's ground, there was no score. The replay took place at Nottingham before a 30,000 crowd, and Phil Bratley scored the all important goal which took Barnsley into the final.

Barnsley then defeated West Bromwich Albion 1-0 in a replayed final.

## FOUNDED BY CLERGYMEN.

In actual fact, both Barnsley and Swindon were founded by clergymen. In the case of Barnsley it was the Rev. T. T. Preedy while Rev. W. Pitt was responsible for the formation of the Town.

He launched the club as an amateur organisation in 1881. But in 1894 Town switched to professionalism and were one of the original members of the Southern League.

Twice they won the Southern League championship. In 1920 Swindon moved into the Third Division and on several occasions since then they have gone near to winning promotion.

One of the all time greats who figured with Swindon, whose nicknames are either the Robins or the Moonrakers, was H. J. Fleming. Fleming an English international, was one of the finest ball artists in the game.

## EX-SHEFFIELD PLAYERS.

Goalkeeper Sam Burton is a product of local football, joining Swindon in 1945. He stands 6 ft. and weighs 13½ stone.

Right back Fred Thompson is a strong defender while Walter Bingley, the left back, was formerly with Sheffield Wednesday. Walter was previously with Bolton Wanderers.

Another ex-Sheffielder in the side is John Fountain. John, born at Leeds, joined Swindon Town, from Sheffield United. He stands 5 ft. 9ins. and weighs 11 stone.

Ken Mellor, the centre half, was previously with Mansfield Town. But before that he was with Leicester City.

Colours: Red Shirts, White Shorts.

This season's result: Swindon 1, Barnsley 1

He joined his present club in the closed season. Left half Rex Tilley is having his second season with the Wiltshire club. He spent six seasons with Plymouth Argyle but is a Swindon born player.

John Stephens, outside right, has been capped for the Wales Under-23 side. This is his second season with Swindon whom he joined from Hull City. Inside right John Richards was signed from the Army during the 1957-58 season. Last season he played in all the inside forward positions and on the right wing.

## EX-ROTHERHAM UNITED.

Centre forward David Layne was signed from Rotherham United during the closed season.

Jimmy Gauld, a dangerous inside left was signed from Plymouth while outside left Arnold Darcy, born at Blackburn, joined the club from Wigan during the 1956-57 season. He played as an amateur for Accrington Stanley in the 1952-53 season.

Also with the club are George Hudson, a strong pivot, who weighs 15st., wing half or inside forward Bob Woodruff a former member of the Swindon schoolboys team, John Skull, a fast outside right, who was previously with Wolves and Owen Medlock, a former Chelsea goalkeeper.
