CLUB NOTES

No doubt many supporters were surprised to read of the transfer of John Richards and Bob Edwards. Both were grand club members, and we were sorry to lose them. On the other hand, as all supporters realise, something almost desperate had to be done in view of the serious loss of revenue during the past two months.

The position is still critical, because the money received from the transfers will immediately be swallowed up in fulfilling our present commitments. Nothing will be left over to reduce the Bank Overdraft, Loans or Mortgage arrangements, and each week the wage bill is over £600.

Shareholders will know from their Balance Sheets that the total expenditure last year was £56,000, an average of £1,077 per week, Summer and Winter.

The average weekly expenditure during the past six months was £1,264, and the last gate totalled just over £700 gross, and usually, that is the chief income for a fortnight, plus the money from the Supporters' Club. Expenditure **must**, therefore, be reduced. At present the Club could field three teams of professional players, but that number must be lowered, if the Club is to continue to function.

We ask all supporters to continue to be real supporters, and also to be patient. The tide will surely turn. The one shining light is the number of promising young players now on the books.

This afternoon a special collection is to be made on behalf of World Refugee Year. Charity begins at home; but surely the plight of these people, still in camps after 12 years of peace, is pitiful. We

Another point which rather intrigued us in the Official Notes last week, was to read that the winning goal in one match was scored from a penalty five MONTHS from time!
