CLUB NOTES

Today we entertain Brentford, and next Saturday Coventry City. On the 23rd January we visit York City, the following week we play at Mansfield, and on Saturday, 6th February we are due at Bury.

Three games away in succession create a difficult problem for the team. The financial side of the Club will also be affected. Three weeks without any income from first team games, is a very serious problem, especially in the present state of affairs. The strictest watch has to be kept on expenditure, and economies made wherever possible.

The young lads brought into the first team on Monday, 28th December, 1959, certainly rose to the occasion, and spectators enjoyed one of the best games of the season.

The form was repeated against Bradford City last week, but unfortunately we lost by the only goal scored. The team certainly deserved to draw.

Although the Reserves were defeated 5—3 by Shrewsbury most spectators really enjoyed the game. There was plenty of incident, good football, and of course, eight goals. The gate too, was one of the best for a Reserve game.



OUR VISITORS

Like most clubs Brentford have had a long and chequered career. The club was formed in 1888 in a boathouse at Kew Bridge. At that time the members belonged to a rowing club and sought an extension of their activities by taking up a winter sport. Feeling ran high for rugger and soccer, and soccer won by one vote. Sole surviving founder-member is present President Bill Dodge who, although 93 still attends home games.

although 93 still attends home games. The club embraced professionalism in 1900 and four years later their present ground at Griffin Park was opened.

Brentford became founder members of Division 3 (South) in 1920 and in 1929/30 set up a record which has never been equalled by winning all their home games. Even this achievement did not gain them promotion, for they finished no less than 7 points behind Plymouth Argyle. But the BEES set up another record (since beaten by Charlton) by rocketing

But the BEES set up another record (since beaten by Charlton) by rocketing from Third to First Division in two seasons—1933-5. They held their place in the top sphere until the first season after the war, and plunged into the Third Division in 1954.

Since Malcolm MacDonald took over the Manager's reins two years ago, the club's fortunes have improved and in each season promotion has been missed by only one place.

Some famous players who have worn the red-and-white striped shirts include Patsy Hendren, Billy Scott, Leslie Smith, Dai Hopkins, Joe Crozier, Duncan McKenzie, Dave McCulloch, Bill Gorman, Tommy Lawton, Archie Macaulay, Malcolm MacDonald and Peter Broadbent.

Programme sales can be assisted by spectators having the correct money ready whenever possible. We endeavour to cover all entrances adequately, but occasionally spectators enter the ground without having purhased programmes, and then experience difficulty in obtaining them.

The experiment of having programme sellers inside the ground was not very successful, when tried several years ago, especially when crowds were larger, as the sellers experienced difficulty in moving among the spectators.

Supporters are, therefore, advised to obtain their programmes before passing through the turnstiles, to avoid possible disappointment, although supplies are kept at the Cushion Huts.

We are grateful to those members of the Committee who regularly sell programmes, and we know that the Directors and Officials of Swindon Town F.C. appreciate their work.
