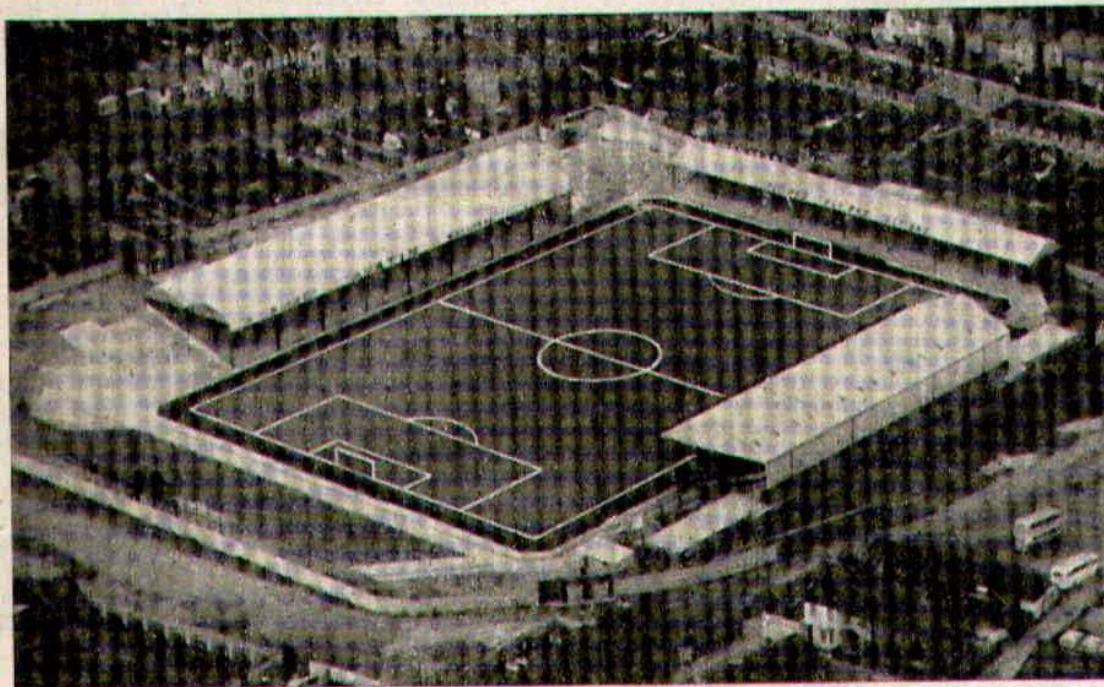

The printing times of programmes and the fixture list are necessarily such that they prevent us from discussing news but merely allow us to comment upon history, and the Port Vale game is ancient now. We will just remark that Corthine and Fryatt both netted handsomely.

We were informed on Wednesday morning that the team would include Wall, Houghton and Kellard but Fryatt would not be playing and Stenhouse would be travelling with the team.

Sam Burton (Goalkeeper): Product of local football joining Swindon in 1945. Played for the Wilts. Junior Eleven which reached the final of Counties tournament. Stands 6ft. and weighs 13½ stone.

David Richardson (Full-back): Joined Swindon this "Close Season" from Grimsby Town. David was born in Billington, Co. Durham. He stands 6ft. and weighs 12½ stone.

Keith Morgan (Wing-half): Another teenager produced through the ranks of the "Robins" youth teams. A County youth player he made his debut in 1958-59 season. He stands 6ft. 1in. and weighs 12½ stone.

Peter Chamberlain (Centre-half or Full-back): Joined Swindon from Leicester in 1957. Born in Liverpool. Peter also plays in the forward line. He stands 6ft. and weighs 11½ stone.
