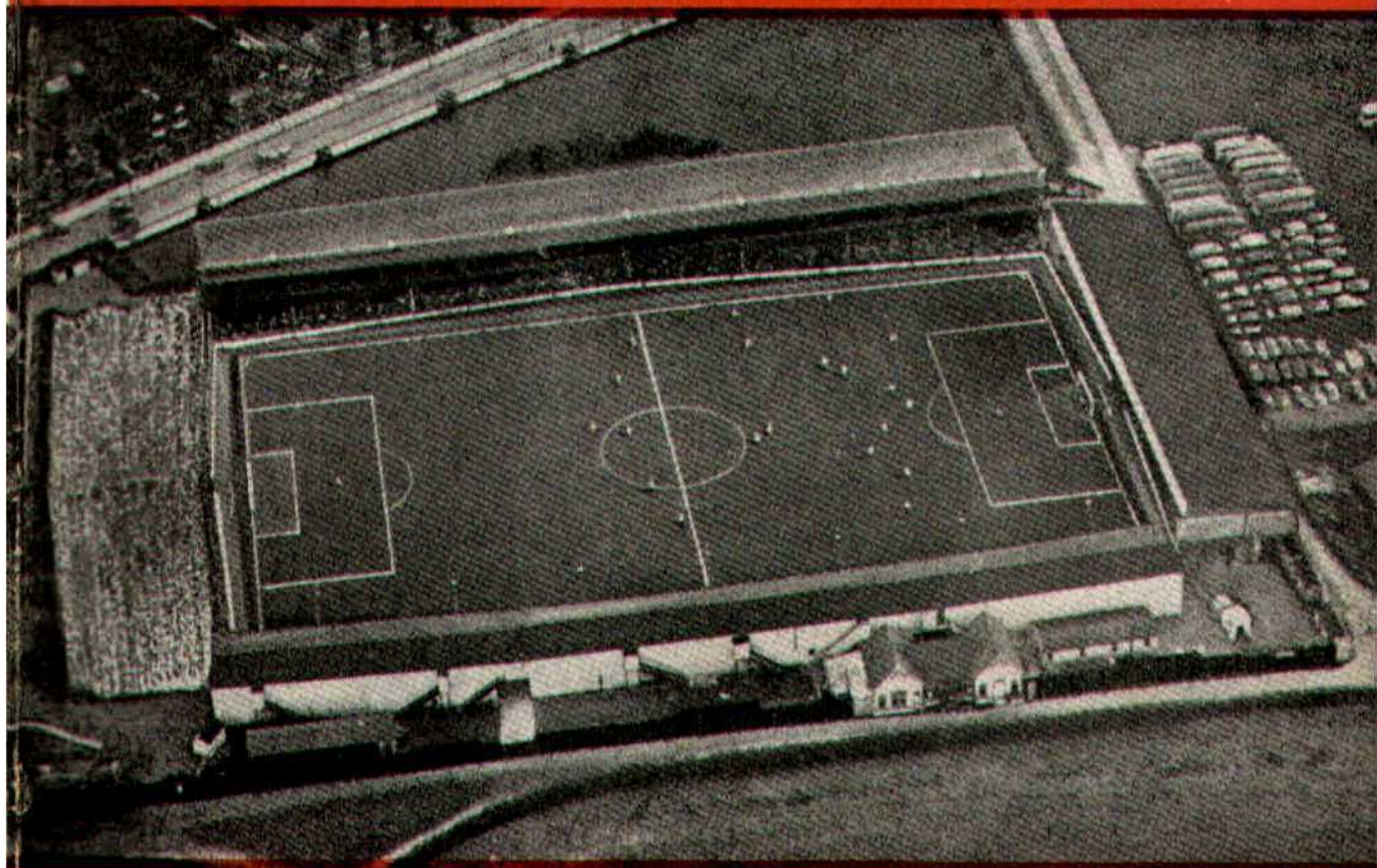

**BOBBY HILL.** 5 ft. 9 ins., 11 stone 2 lbs., born in Edinburgh. A product of Scottish Junior Football, he joined the Club from Easthouses Lily F.C. in June 1955.

**BOBBY HUNT.** 5 ft. 11 ins., 11 stone 5 lbs., born in Colchester. Graduated from the Youth side and signed as part-time professional in November 1959.

**RON HUNT.** 5 ft. 9 ins., 12 stone, born in Colchester; played as an amateur with the Club before turning part-time professional in October 1951.

**MARTYN KING.** 5 ft. 11 ins., 11 stone 2 lbs., born in Birmingham. Played for Oxford Univ. and Pegasus before turning pro in September 1958; at present in the R.A.F.

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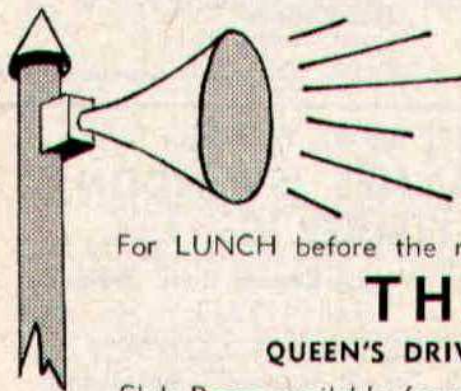
