Club Notes

One of the worst Saturdays of the year for weather—rain, rain, incessant rain, and the pitch almost covered by water, and yet the gate was almost 9,000. Thank you, supporters, for the splendid attendance. Although the covered accommodation at the County Ground is now very good, many of you must have got very wet on your way to the ground.

We are sure you felt the journey worthwhile, because although we could not play our usual style of football, the game itself was a good one, and most interesting under the conditions. We thought also, that Notts County gave an excellent and very sporting display.

The result (from our point of view) was a good one, and thoroughly deserved. We have now gained ten points out of the

last six games (five of them played at home), and only one goal has been scored against us, and that one at home by Hull City. To date with one more home game to be played only fifteen goals have been scored on the County Ground by visiting teams. By far the lowest number against in the whole of Division 3, the next one being Bury with 17 goals scored against them at home.

Swindon is now placed 16th in the League; and while comparatively safe from relegation, we could still be overtaken by the teams below, and yet occupy the vital fourth place from the bottom. Many unlikely events have to take place for this to happen, but we sincerely hope the lads will this evening make doubly sure and complete this sequence of home games with a resounding win, even if our opponents are Torquay. Supporters' Club Notes

In these last Official notes of the season, we would first thank those who have borne with us so patiently during the season, and who have patronised our various activities so generously and so regularly.

We would also thank the Directors and Officials of Swindon Town F.C. for their kindness in allowing us to occupy these columns regularly, to enable us to publicise our work and to keep in touch with our members.

By this means we have been able to make various appeals which might not otherwise have been possible, and to establish sundry useful contacts in the town and the surrounding district.

The support forthcoming from friends in the country areas contributes greatly to the general success of our efforts, and has strongly impressed representatives of other Supporters' Clubs whom we have been privileged to meet from time to time.

In spite of temporary anxieties from time to time regarding the League position, we think all supporters will agree that this has been a more enjoyable season than for a number of years past, and we thank the players for their efforts to entertain us.

We have found new friends in the young players introduced into the team, and the old favourites —Maurice Owen and Sam Burton —have established themselves more firmly than ever in our affections.

We have just read in our Sunday paper that the Club needs to increase its average gate by 5,000 if financial worries are to be relieved.

Having regard to the average which has been maintained while the Club has occupied a comparatively low position in the League, we feel confident that the additional 5,000 will arrive with a successful season. We hope that this will be 1961-62.

TORQUAY UTD. ASSOCIATION F.C. LTD.

Formed in 1921 by the amalgamation of two prominent local Clubs-Torquay Town and Babbacombe.

2. Played in the Southern League until elected to Football

League in 1927—Division 3 (Southern Section).

3. Have only had to apply for re-election once — end of

first Season 1927-28.

Highest final position in the Football League—Division 4. 3 (Southern Section)—was equal first with Ipswich Town 1956-57 but second on goal average.

Relegated to Fourth Division on formation of that 5.

- Gained promotion to Third Division of Football League 6. 1959-60 by finishing in third place (first four promoted).

Reserves resigned from South Western League at end of 15. 1954-55 Season and joined the Western Football League.

Reserves winners of Division 2 of Western Football 16.

League 1955-56.

Reserves winners of Western League Division I and 17.

Western League Professional Cup 1959-60.

Club won Devon Senior Cup 1921-22, 1946-47 and 18. 1959-60; the first time by the First Team, the second time by the Reserves and the third time by the "A" team.

Club won Devon Professional Championship 1946-47, 19. 1947-48, 1948-49 and 1957-58, and held it jointly

with Exeter City 1954-55.
