SWINDON TOWN

SWINDON TOWN are playing for the future, and have some of the most promising youngsters playing in the Football League today.

Their policy, vigorously pursued by Manager Bert Head, may well pay big dividends in a few years time, and bring Second Division football to the town for the first time in the club's history.

Swindon realise, however, that to bring the youngsters along it is necessary to have experienced men playing alongside them.

Two Swindon stalwarts still with the club are goalkeeper Sam Burton, and former centre-forward Maurice Owen, now directing affairs from the centre-half position.

Both are local men. Burton came from Swindon and Owen was born not far away in Abingdon, Berks. Owen is the oldest member of the team, and could have played in top-class football for, shortly after joining Swindon in 1947, he refused offers from Arsenal and Wolves.

Burton was in the Wiltshire Youth side before joining the Town in 1947.

Newcomers this season include Ken McPherson, centre-forward from Newport County, who has also played for Notts County, Middlesbrough and Coventry City.

Inside-forward Ralph Hunt was with Grimsby Town last season. He was a leading scorer with Norwich City for many seasons, and also played for Portsmouth and Derby County.

Jack Smith, another forward, was signed during the close season from Watford, and formerly played for Hartlepool United.

Right-back Ken Jones has taken over from Terry Wollen, since joining Swindon in March from Crystal Palace.

Sam Burton, goalkeeper, has been with Swindon since 1945 when he played for the Wiltshire County Youth team.

Bill Teague, goalkeeper, a recent signing who made one first team appearance last season, after completing his National Service.

Ken Jones, right-back, joined the club from Crystal Palace in March. A Welshman, he was a Welsh Under-23 team trialist.

John Trollope, left-back, a local product who joined Swindon straight from school. Got into the first team at the start of last season when he was 16, and never missed a match.

Keith Morgan, right-half, is a strong attacking player who joined the club from Westbury, Wilts., and was ever present in 1960-61.

Maurice Owen, centre-half and captain, and the oldest member of the side. Joined the club as a centre-forward in 1947, and refused offers to join Wolves and Arsenal.

Bob Woodruff, left-half, another local player who was signed from the Swindon Boys team. He was ever present last season and has played at centre-forward and inside-forward. He has been the target of many clubs.

Peter Chamberlain, half-back, a utility player who has been with the Town for three seasons and was signed from Leicester City. He

scored five goals in one game from the left-half position.

David Corbett, outside-right, is another product of the club's youth policy. A fast and direct player, David recently became a full-time professional.

Ernie Hunt, inside-right, joined the groundstaff from school, and made the first team when 16. He was top scorer last season, and at 18 is a much sought-after player.

Jack Smith, inside-forward, joined the Town from Watford during the Summer. He was previously with Hartlepool United.

Ralph Hunt, inside-forward, another new signing from Grimsby Town. He was a leading scorer with Norwich for several seasons, and has also played for Portsmouth and Derby County.

Ken McPherson, signed at the start of the season from Newport County for £3,000. Ken has also played for Notts County, Middlesbrough and Coventry City.

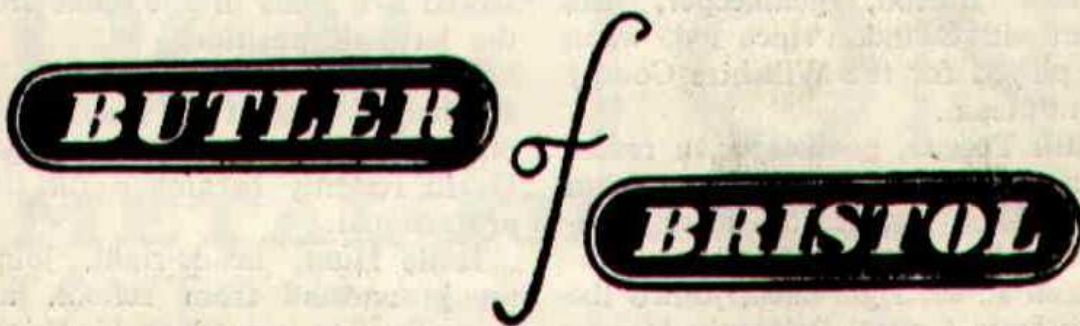
Cliff Jackson, inside-forward, is Swindon born and joined the club straight from school. A schoolboy international, he made his first team debut when 17.
