Club Notes

This afternoon we start, once again, what everyone hopes will be a protracted Cup run.

Last week our colleague, the writer of the Supporters' Club notes, referred to the last visit of Bradford and the beginning of the great Cup run in 1924. We feel we must join in this reminiscence.

Actually when Bradford played us in 1924 they were members of Division 3 (Northern Section). At the end of Season 1920-1 they were relegated from Division 1. Season 1921-22 saw them occupying 21st position, and Bristol City in 22nd position. Bristol, therefore, came in Division 3 (South) and Bradford became members of Division 3 (North). In the following season (1922-23) Bristol City won Division 3 (South) and were promoted back to Division 2. Bradford gained second place to Division 3 (North). The promoted club from that section was Nelson, who were relegated to Division 3 (North) the following season, and eventually in 1931 failed to gain re-election, when finishing bottom of that league.

Now to season 1923-24, the one with which we are concerned. It

was an excellent one for Swindon, because in addition to the great Cup run, we finished in sixth position in Division 3, with 47 points. The club promoted from our section was Portsmouth, with 59 points from 42 games. Bradford, at the end of the season, occupied fifth position in the Northern Section, with 52 points from 42 games. The promoted club from that section was Wolverhampton Wanderers.

We would not agree with the writer that "the fortunes of both clubs are at lower ebb than on the previous visit of Bradford' Even in those days, money in football was not very plentiful. We are sure that Swindon Town is certainly in a much stronger position than in 1924. Our club was well known for its cup-fighting tradition. The writer of these notes has vivid memories of the fourth round game against Burnley. Swindon might easily have won that match and figured in the Semi-final. Incidentally, members of the team-Dickenson. Cooper, Denyer, Johnson and Davies—are still living in Swindon. Other players on the books well-known to supporters were Archer, Nash and Daniels. Five of

At the moment Kettering are members of the Premier Division of the Southern League, being promoted from Division I last season after finishing champions of that Division.
