I know you will give that assistance tonight. Rest assured, the lads will appreciate it and respond. You will see tonight what our defence had to contend with in the persons of the big, goal grabbing Ralph Hunt and McPherson and the artistic cultured youngster, Ernie Hunt. A formidable trio. There are weaknesses, however, on which we shall concentrate and base our hopes. The game and individual performances were in my opinion admirably and accurately reported in "The People." The Swindon crowd were great sportsmen, naturally disappointed at not winning, but giving our lads, especially "Lofty Smethurst great credit.

Finally, in the excitement of our Cup-tie let us not overlook the grand win registered by our Reserve side at Bletchley. Well done lads! Here's hoping for a great game—a welcome to the youngsters

#### **OUR VISITORS**

Tonight we extend a hearty welcome to Third Division Swindon

Town for the F.A. Cup 1st Round Replay.

Swindon's last visit to this ground was in 1904 for a Southern League game. We entertained the Robins four times from 1900-04. During that time we beat them 10—I on one occasion, but we are not sure which season.

Swindon were one of the nine clubs that founded the Southern League in 1894-95; and they played in the S.L. until they were founder members of the Third Division (South) in 1920-21. They have yet to finish in the first three and have had to apply for re-election three times.

Last season they entertained Bath City in the 1st Round of the F.A. Cup. The result was a 2-2 draw. In the replay at Bath they won 6-4. Will history repeat itself? In the 2nd Round they lost 1-0 at home

Record attendance at Swindon is 28,400 when Stoke visited them in the Cup in 1952. Record receipts £2,787 versus Manchester City, January, 1939. Last season their league attendance average was 11,019, the fourth best in the league; the Robins suffered only 4 'home' defeats, and only won I away game, this was at Southend. This season only one defeat at home, by Portsmouth, and two away wins at Northampton and Grimsby.

They recently defeated Birmingham City 2-0 in the League Cup at

Swindon, after a 1-1 draw at Birmingham.
