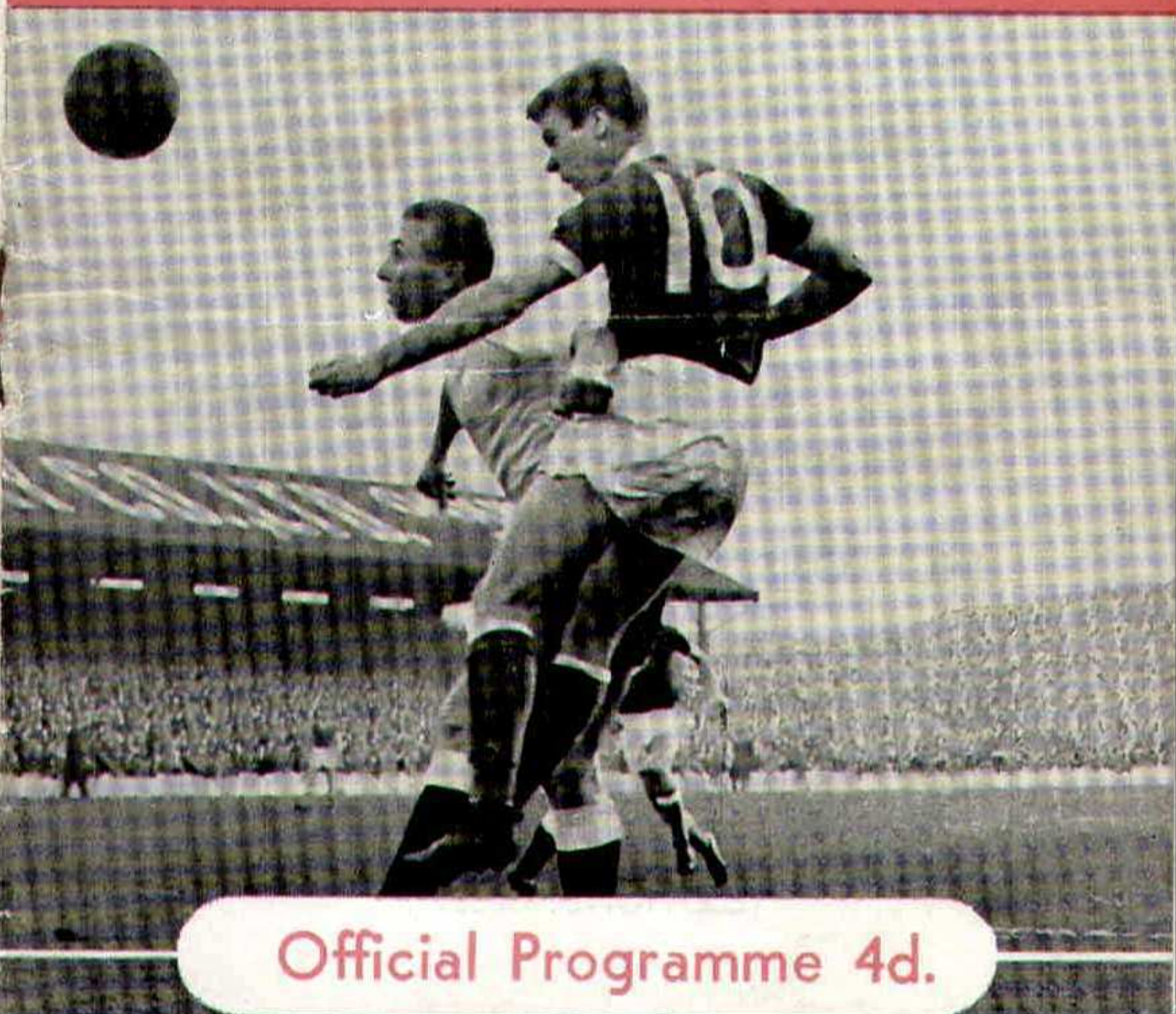

Swindon Town

Swindon Town manager Bert Head started his players' training this season with a two week spell at Weymouth.

The Swindon party went into camp under canvas and the players had to do their own fatigues. Mr. Head was delighted with the way the scheme worked out.

One of the chief benefits would appear to be that it engendered enormous team spirit among the players.

MIKE O'HARA, goalkeeper, joined Swindon from Luton last season, and appeared regularly until injury near the end of the season.

TERRY WOLLIN, right back, a local boy who made his debut when 16. Has played the majority of first-team games for the past two seasons. *JOHN TROLLOPE*, left back, another local, joined the club from school, and got his chance at the start of the 60-61 season.

KEITH MORGAN, right half, is a strong tackler. Played every game of 1960/61, and missed only three — through injury — last year. Centre half, *MAURICE OWEN*, captain is a former centre forward, and has given long and outstanding service. *BOB WOODRUFF*, left-half, another local product, has also played at centre-forward and inside-forward with the senior side. A target of several transfer fee offers.

Outside-right *MIKE SUMMERBEE*. Born at Cheltenham, is another result of Swindon's youth policy. Wanted by several other clubs. *ERNIE HUNT*, inside-right, is of outstanding ability. Leading goalscorer for his club last season. Centre-forward, *JACK SMITH*, signed from Watford during the 1960/61 close season. Previously with Hartlepool. Strong, and with the ability to get the unexpected goal. *BILL ATKINS*, inside-left came to Swindon from Aston Villa in 1959. Demobbed from the Army last year and quickly made the position his own. Outside-left, *CLIFF JACKSON*, is Swindon born and a former schoolboy international.

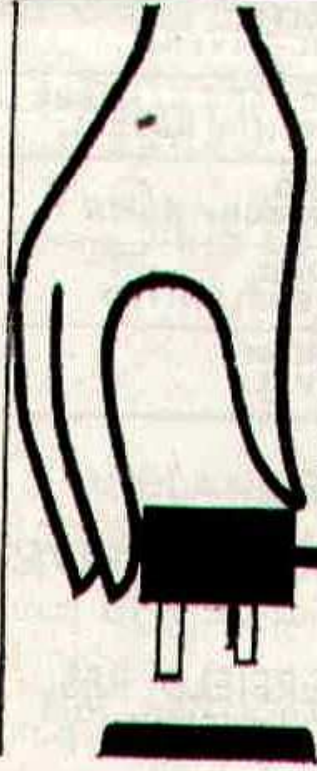

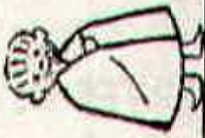

Roy Lax, Ralph Potter and Ernest Dennis were re-elected to the Board of Directors without opposition At the annual meeting of shareholders a profit of £2,357 was reported Norman Rimmington our former first team goalkeeper became head trainer while Douglas Hubbard, a former Football League linesman and qualified coach became assistant trainer Tony Leighton (Doncaster Rovers), Jim Hosie (Aberdeen), Eddie O'Hara (Morton), Barry Murphy (South Shields) and Peter Griffin (Dennistoun Waverley) were all signed on for the coming season . . . Bobby Smith, son of Gavin Smith who was well known as a regular post-war outside right for Barnsley was signed on as a full-time professional . . The attendance at our friendly game with Halifax Town, which took the place of the normal Reds v. Blues practice game was 3,697, which was well above the normal figure for pre-season practice matches
