Not often would a team, trailing by three goals to one, away from home, be sorry to hear the final whistle go. Such was the case at Park Avenue, Bradford, last Wednesday evening. Without any shadow of doubt we deserved at least to share the points if only for the magnificent fight back and transformation in the second half. Again, at Wrexham on Saturday, a determined second half display, after being 2—1 down at the interval failed to save a point.

Although on numerous occasions this season, the team has shown that it is capable of matching the best in football skills the fact still remains that too many silly goals have been conceded, goals which could and should have been averted, and too many relatively easy scoring chances have been fritted away.

Perhaps there is not so much wrong that a win or two could not cure. A return to full strength and a settled combination could also help as well as what, in football circles, is commonly known as 'run of the ball'. This has certainly not been evident so far this season. Let us not forget also that the side has been badly hit by injuries during the opening weeks of the season. Not that the reserve players have let the side down, on the contrary, they have more than pulled their weight. Consider for a moment the case of George Walker—he has filled the centre half berth admirably during Jack Marsden's absence but one cannot get away from the fact that he is primarily an inside forward who has scored almost sixty goals in the past three seasons. It may be that a new centre half will be signed in time for tonight's game which will allow George to move back to his normal position.

Whatever the composition of the team, give the lads your solid backing from the terraces tonight and cheer them on to that long overdue win. Last week, Wrexham, playing away from home, were defeated 8—0 but on the following Saturday 10,000 of their supporters turned up to cheer them on to victory at our expenses.

We extend a hearty welcome to our visitors from Swindon. Known popularly as 'the Moonrakers' (from the Wiltshire legend), 'the Robins' (from their colours), or (like Crewe) 'the Railwaymen'. They are making their first ever league visit to Brunton Park, although we did meet in the 2nd round of the F.A. Cup in December, 1949. The result on that occasion was a two goal win for Carlisle. At the moment they stand fourth in the table with ten points from nine games.

Once again we appeal to all supporters to please keep off the grass, especially at the end of the game.

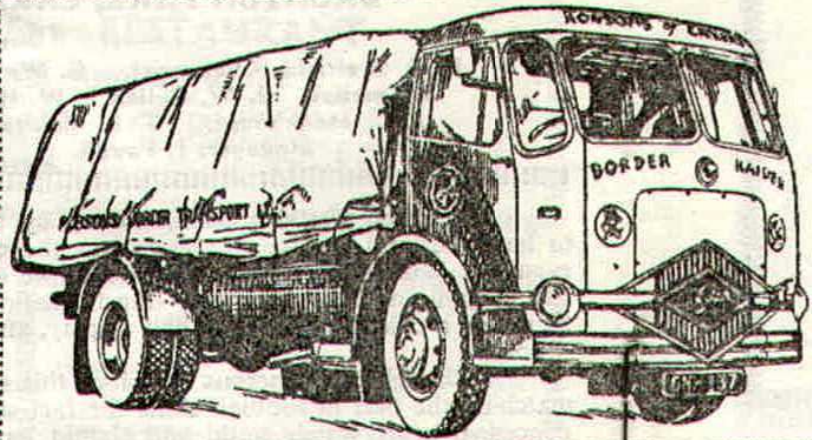

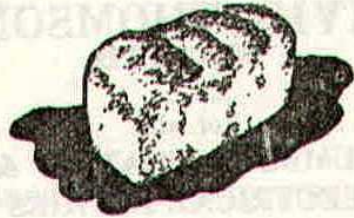

KEITH MORGAN—(Right-Half). A strong, attacking wing-half, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Played in every first team game during 1960/61 and missed only three games last year through injury.

MAURICE OWEN—(Centre-half). The team captain and oldest member of the team. Formerly a centre-forward, he has had a long and outstanding period of service with the Club. Has played in several representative games.

ERNIE HUNT—(Inside-Right). Joined the Club's ground staff from school. A member of the First Team at 16 years old, he is a player of outstanding ability for whom the Club has had many offers. A local boy, he was top goal scorer 1960/61 and again last year.

CLIFF JACKSON—(Outside-left). Swindon born, he joined the club direct from school. He was a schoolboy international and he made his debut in Swindon's First team at the age of 17. Has a very powerful shot.

BOB WOODRUFF—(Left-Half). Another local born player who came to the town direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. Has played at centre-forward and inside-forward in the senior side and his performances have made him a target for several transfer offers.

ARNOLD DARCY—(Outside-right). Joined the Club in November, 1956, from Wigan Athletic. In spite of his lack of inches he is a strong forceful winger with a powerful shot.

JACK SMITH—(Centre-forward). Joined the Robins from Watford during the 1960/61 close season. He was formerly with Hartlepool United. A strong, forceful player with the ability to get the unexpected goal.

ROGER SMART—(Inside-left). Another local born player who joined the club direct from the Swindon schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the Centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own. More recently converted to a wing-half, he made four first team appearances last season.

MIKE TURNER—(Goal-keeper). Just demobbed from the R.A.F. he joined the Club whilst still in the services from Dorchester Town. Took over in goal following the injury to O'Hara last season and is expected to make strong bids for the first-team position this season.
