failure on the part of Wrexham to form a defensive wall. Nevertheless, let us give tribute to a splendidly-placed shot, and also to the way our lads struggled to overcome their bad spell. No-one can deny they gave everything. In fact, at times they seemed to try too hard.

It would appear some of our young players are feeling the strain of two matches per week. In fact, it really works out at three games in eight days. They are such a grand bunch of lads, they just won't "give in."

This evening we begin the cup-tie season. We entertain Darlington, What memories that brings back to our older supporters! We last played them in season 1910-11 in the third round of the F.A. Cup. That year we defeated Notts County (home) 3-1, then Arsenal (home) 1-0, Darlington (away) 3-0, and lost in the fourth to Chelsea (away) 1-3. The writer of these notes can just remember seeing flashes of the games at Darlington and Chelsea in the famous News Reels on the screen of the then "Silent Movies".

At that time Swindon Town was certainly on the crest of the wave, and known throughout the football world. The previous season, 1909-10, we reached the semi-final of the F.A. Cup, losing 0-2 to Newcastle at Tottenham. The season after, 1911-12, we again reached the semi-final, defeating such famous teams as West Ham and Everton. That was the year we played two stirring games with Barnsley, finally losing 0-1 at Nottingham. It is almost certain that the famous

Harold Fleming played one game with a broken bone in his foot. It was also the era of Sam Allen — a name still revered in football.

Like Swindon, Darlington is a railway town and will be fellow sufferers in the run-down of railway workshops. Their position is much worse than Swindon's, as the present scheme is to close both workshops. We trust industry will soon readjust itself in that town and in Swindon, and the football will not suffer.

Our opponents' record this season is not quite as good as ours. They have gained eleven points from ten games, whilst Swindon have thirteen points from eleven games. Our goal average is much better: 20-11, and Darlington 14-15. If the forward line gets quickly into its stride, we may get a repeat of the Brighton game.

#### **OUR VISITORS**

#### DARLINGTON A.F.C.

The Club was formed in 1883 and turned professional in 1908.

In 1910/11 Darlington, then a non-League club, started in the first qualifying round of the F.A. Cup and went through to the last 16, a feat no other non-League club has equalled.

Darlington were founder members of the Third Division, Northern Section, winning promotion to the Second Division in 1924/5.

In 1957/8 they again reached the last 16 of the F.A. Cup, after beating Rochdale (away) 2-0, Boston United (home) 5-3, Norwich (away) 2-1, Chelsea (home) 4-1 after a draw 3-3 at Chelsea.

In 1934 Darlington won the Third Division Cup.

They have also won the Durham Senior Professional Cup on numerous occasions.

Famous players who commenced their career with Darlington are: Charlie Roberts, English International when playing for Manchester United, and Bob Thynne, Scottish International centre half.

Other famous players who started their careers with Darlington were: Jack O'Donnell (Everton), Mark Hooper (Sheffield Wednesday), Ray Wood (Manchester United) and Cliff Mason (Sheffield United).

Famous amateur players who played for Darlington were: T. S. Rowlandson, R. G. Brebner, F. N. S. Creek, A. G. Doggart (now Chairman of the F.A.) and R. Healey.
