OUR VISITORS

VIC ROUSE (Goal)

Born in Swansea and signed from Millwall in 1956. Vic has represented the Full Welsh International XI, and also the Under 23 team. First club was Millwall, and signed professional in 1953.

BILL GLAZIER (Goal)

Born at Nottingham, Bill's first club was Torquay. Joined the ground staff in 1961 after playing as an amateur with them. Has represented the F.A. Youth XI and the South East Counties League. Signed pro' in October of 1961.

JOHN McNICHOL (Right Back)

Born at Kilmarnock and signed from Chelsea in 1958. Gained a League Division 1 Winners Medal while with Chelsea, after having played for Newcastle and Brighton & Hove. First signed professional forms in 1946. Has played as a forward and wing half, as well as at full back.

ROY LITTLE (Left Back)

Born in Manchester and signed from Brighton & Hove, Roy has also played for Manchester City, with whom he gained a Cup Winners and a Cup Losers Medal. Roy has been a professional since 1949, and has made about 200 League appearances.

ROY LUNNIS (Right Back)

Palace is Roy's first professional club, having previously been with Carshalton Athletic. Signed pro' in 1960 and born in London. A number of first eleven appearances during the past two seasons.

BERT HOWE (Full Back)

Born at Charlton, and previously with Faversham Town, Bert signed pro' in 1958. Also a number of League games to his credit. Just out of the Army after completing National Service. League debut v. Darlington in 1959.

TERRY LONG (Right Half)

Signed in 1955 from Wycombe Wanderers. Born in Buckinghamshire. Terry has played in most positions on the field. Voted the most consistent player by supporters, in 1961, together with J. Byrne. Has held a first eleven place for the past six seasons.

EDDIE WERGE (Outside Right — Wing Half)

Born in Kent and transferred from Charlton in 1961, Eddie has represented London Youths and Kent Schools. His only other club being Bexleyheath & Welling. First signed pro' in 1955.

BRIAN WOOD (Centre Half)

Signed on a free transfer from W.B.A., Brian has made terrific progress during the 1961/62 season, at the end of which he was the regular pivot. Born at Poole in Dorset, he first joined the Brum ground staff after leaving school in 1957.

GEORGE PETCHEY (Left Half)

Transferred from Q.P.R. in 1960, George started his career at West Ham, and after 4 years switched to Shepherds Bush, where he stayed for 7 years. Has held a first eleven place ever since his transfer, in 1960.

RONNIE ALLEN (Wing Forward — Centre Forward)

Needs no introduction. Ronnie has played on five occasions for England, and also holds a Cup Winners Medal won with W.B.A. in 1954. His first club was Port Vale, but was transferred to the Brum for a record £20,000 fee. Joined Crystal Palace at the end of the 1960/61 season, and has made over 500 League appearances and has scored over 300 League goals. Also a keen golfer, having been Professional Footballers Champion twice.

ALAN STEPHENSON (Centre Half)

Made his League debut on 24th March 1962, versus Bradford (P.A.) at Selhurst Park. Result 0—0. Captain of Junior XI, Alan made numerous appearances in the Combination XI during Season 1961-62. One of the brightest prospects ever to emerge from the Junior XI.

ROY SUMMERSBY (Inside Right)

Transferred from Millwall in 1958. Roy has represented London Schools, and made his League debut at the age of 17. First signed as a professional in 1952. Often doubles inside forward with wing half. Also a keen golfer and cricketer.

DENNIS UPHILL (Centre Forward)

Now with his sixth club, Dennis started his career with Spurs in 1949. Then after spells with Reading, Coventry, Mansfield and Watford, he was transferred to the Palace in 1960. Oddly enough, he was born in Bath.

ANDY SMILLIE (Inside Left)

Andy started his professional career at the age of 17, with West Ham, and while with them he gained many Youth honours, including an England Under 20 Cap. 21 First Division appearances. Born on the Isle of Sheppey.

PETER BURRIDGE (Inside Forward — Centre Forward)

Transferred from Millwall, where he played an active part in their promotion from Division 4. Previously with Leyton Orient, and born at Harlow. Captained Millwall at the end of their promotion season. A prolific goalscorer, having been top marksman at the Den for two seasons.

DON TOWNSEND (Full Back)

Transferred from Charlton Athletic, where he had spent all his professional career, having first signed pro' in 1950. Born at Swindon in Wiltshire, Don was a well liked character at the Valley.

STAN FORSTER (Inside Left)

A regular Combination XI player during the Season 1961/62. Transferred from Margate in 1961, this being his only other club. Born at Aylesham in Kent. Also a member of the Junior XI who won the Youth Tournament in Amsterdam in 1962.

JOHN JACKSON (Goalkeeper)

John has represented London and England Grammar Schools, as well as an England Amateur XI. Captain of London G.S. and St. Clement Danes G.S. A fine keeper who made numerous appearances in the Combination XI during Season 1961/62. Born in Hammersmith and first signed pro' in March 1962. A part-time pro' until signing fulltime in July 1962.

GILBERT DOWSETT (Centre Forward)

Born in Chelmsford. Signed professional for Tottenham in 1952.

Transferred to Southend in 1955 and stayed with them for one season, was then transferred to Southampton for whom he also played for one season. In 1957 signed for Bournemouth and remained with them until 1962 when he was transferred to Crystal Palace.

CLIFF HOLTON (Inside Forward)

Born at Oxford. Signed professional for Arsenal in 1947 and played for them until 1958 when he was transferred to Watford. Remained with Watford until 1961 when he transferred to Northampton Town. With Northampton one season before signing for the Palace in December 1962.


