DAVIES, REGINALD (Goalkeeper)

Now commencing his fifth season with Millwall. Joined the "Lions" in May 1958 from Walsall. Previous to his service with Walsall was on the books of West Bromwich Albion. Has appeared 171 times for "Lions" League side. Born Tipton, Staffs.

JOHN, DENNIS (Right Back)

New signing from Scunthorpe United, also seen service with Swansea Town, where he was born. Came to Millwall in June this year.

CRIPPS, HARRY (Left Back)

A Londoner from Plaistow, Harry began his career with West Ham United as a boy and became a "Lion" last season after two seasons with the "Hammers". He captained Millwall's very successful second string last season.

HARPER, DAVID (Right Half)

Has been with Millwall all his career to date. Started in the Youth XI, gained his Youth International cap as a centre half. Victim of some bad injuries during last season, but now fully fit. Born close to The Den at Peckham.

BRADY, RAY (Centre Half)

Brother to Pat, the full back. Ray joined the "Lions" before his brother from Transport F.C. and at the commencement of his career with the "Lions" occupied one of the full back positions. Took over at centre half when former player Ray Brand became injured and has made this his regular position.

ANDERSON, DESMOND (Left Half)

A Scot who joined the "Lions" from Hibernians with which club he had been for four seasons. Des, a very good ball-player, was an inside forward but soon became adapted as a wing-half during his first season with the "Lions". Born Edinburgh.

BROADFOOT, JOE (Outside Right)

Now commencing his fifth season with the "Lions". Began as a Junior with the Club, but soon made rapid progress to the League side. Has now made 174 League appearances in four seasons. Born at Lewisham.

TERRY, PAT (Centre Forward)

Born in Lambeth, Pat has been with several clubs, Charlton Athletic, Newport County, Gillingham and Northampton. Transferred to Millwall in February this year and in 17 League appearances notched 15 important goals.

JONES, DAVID (Inside Left)

Born Norley, Cheshire. Dave began with Crewe Alexandra as a youth, proceeded to Birmingham City from which club he was transferred to the "Lions" in December 1959. Joint leading goalscorer last season with 22 goals.

SHORT HISTORY OF CLUB

Formed in 1885 from a small club known as Millwall Rovers, who played their games on a piece of ground in Glengall Road, Millwall. Soon secured a private ground at the rear of the "Lord Nelson" in the Isle of Dogs. In 1893, following many seasons of success both in Cup and Amateur Leagues, the Club adopted professionalism. A year later they won the Southern League, dropping only 4 points out of a possible 32. This success was repeated the following year. In the season 1899-1900, the "Lions" wrote another page of club history by reaching the semi-final of the F.A. Cup, being beaten by Southampton 3-0, after a goalless draw. In 1901, the "Lions" moved to another ground in the Isle of Dogs and opened against Aston Villa. In 1902/3 season Millwall once more reached the semi-final of the F.A. Cup when they met Derby County at the Aston Villa ground and lost by 3 goals to 1. In the seasons which followed until they came to The Den in New Cross, the "Lions" achieved many other successes. From 1910 onwards the Club made rapid progress, spending many seasons in the Second Division, and then the Third, and unfortunately finally the Fourth. Now back in the Third after winning the Fourth Division Championship last season.
