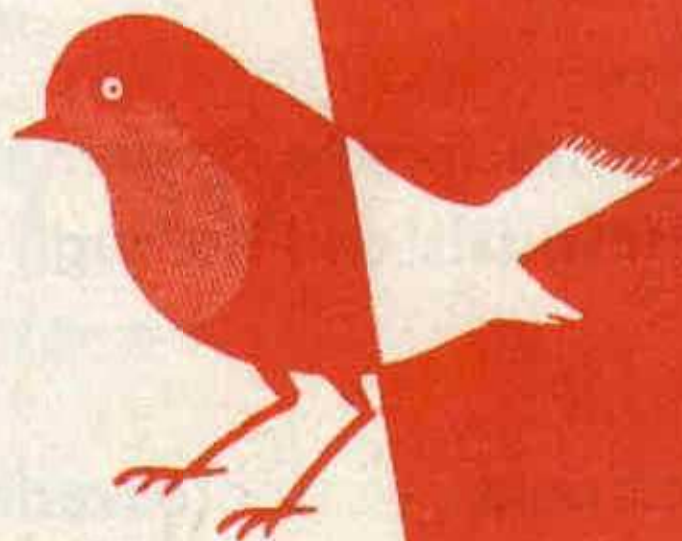

CLUB NOTES

Truly a great beginning to the season — our first in Division II of the Football League.

After the convincing win against Scunthorpe, we made the long and tedious journey to Grimsby. This meant two overnight sessions, and three days away from home. However, going on results it was well worth while. Although almost 200 miles from Swindon, we were pleased to welcome a handful of our supporters who met us outside the ground. We wonder what their feelings were at half-time with Swindon one goal down, and having taken a real hammering from the home team. We were certainly over-run by a strong, big, enthusiastic team who made good use of the long ball down the middle of the field, which was most frequent and always looked dangerous. However, Grimsby scored only one goal, although the inside-left, Tees, headed against the crossbar with Turner out of goal and on another occasion when McLean was right through our defence John Trollope miraculously appeared from "nowhere", and cleared off the penalty spot.

Whatever happened at half-time quickly brought results. Swindon took control of the game, and completely dictated the play. Not so much the long ball, but our own style of play, with everyone fighting hard for the ball and using it to good

effect. Although well on top, a goal didn't seem to come our way, although there were several "near misses", then in the 70th minute, the ball "broke" just right on the edge of the penalty area for Roger Smart, who promptly turned and shot into the bottom right-hand corner of the net. So we were on terms, the most we hoped for at half-time. However, two minutes later Ernie Hunt brought the ball through the middle of the field, and when everyone was expecting a pass to the right winger, shot from fully 40 yards into the bottom left-hand corner, with the opposing goalkeeper diving much too late to save. From then onwards Swindon was well on top.

The team arrived back in Swindon late on Thursday afternoon, thus allowing one day home, before setting off again for Portsmouth on the Saturday.

The trip down was rather worrying as the coach carrying the team encountered a two-mile "traffic jam" at Andover. It took just an hour to get through. Thus the lunch at Winchester was a very hurried one, to set off early to avoid further traffic congestion at Portsmouth. However, as everyone knows, everything turned out for the best with a great victory of 4—1, even if we did have a couple of lucky "let-offs" in the first half.

Now a word to our supporters: what a great following, and such marvellous support. It was as good as a home game to Swindon. The encouragement was tremendous, and undoubtedly helped the team to give such an outstanding display. Visiting clubs always remark on our enthusiastic supporters, and how they help the team, and now here it is away from home. We can assure you all that the players were delighted they were able to put on such a show for you who travelled 140 miles for the game. The result not only made their day, but they hoped it had made yours as well. They realised how you had helped, and hoped they had provided some recompense for your efforts.

A lean built but sturdy pivot who graduated through the Club's nursery sides. A local boy and one Club man. Popular choice captain.

KNIGHTS, TONY (Left Half)

Another product of local football. Tony has played in most positions but is recognised as a half back.

Signed from Workington last February. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers. Played major role in helping Grimsby to escape relegation with some fearless, brilliant "keeping".

Product of St. Mary's Boys' Club, Gateshead. Aged 20 made rapid progress through Juniors and kept place in League after making debut last March. Fast hard-tackling player.

CLIFTON, BRIAN (Wing Half)

Joined Grimsby Town from Southampton last October; had bad luck to suffer cartilage injury in club debut. Returned to make left half spot his own with sound, all-round displays.

WELBOURNE, DUNCAN (Wing Half)

Product of Scunthorpe junior football. Joined Grimsby six years ago and made League debut in September, 1957. Tireless, courageous performer.

BOGIE, MALCOLME (Utility Forward)

Club's other close-season signing from Hibernian, for whom he made occasional Scottish Division I appearances.

Formerly with Manchester City, Grimsby signed him from Crewe in April after he had lost place in their League side. Held place with his speedy, never-say-die style.

FOSTER, RONNIE (Inside Forward)

Grimsby's most expensive purchase when signed from Leyton Orient last December. Made debut 4½ hours after completing transfer. Experienced ball-playing man who acts as link man in attack.

McLEAN, GEORGE (Centre Forward)

Signed from Norwich City in September, 1962 for small fee. Formerly with Rangers he settled down after a shaky start to emerge as one of Division's most dangerous leaders. Big and strong, he has fierce shot in either foot.

YOUNG, DICK (Centre Forward)

Joined Grimsby after month's trial. Formerly played for South Shields and Newcastle United. League debut at Walsall in September, 1962 and two weeks later got hat-trick against Derby County.

HILL, BRIAN (Outside Left)

Signed in July, 1960 from Ollerton Colliery. Formerly played for Mansfield Boys. League debut against Torquay in April, 1961. Last season introduced into first team and rapidly made name as promising raiding winger.

TEES, MATT (Centre or Inside Forward)

Close season signing from Airdrie for whom he played 43 games in two seasons. Replacement for former goal-getter Ron Rafferty and like him is good with his head.

It was pleasing too, to read his testimonial to Mr. Leslie Newman, of the Borough Press Ltd., for his constant assistance. Mr. Newman has been known to the writer since our school-boy days, as an enthusiastic and loyal supporter of the Town.

We both commenced our supporting activities in season 1919/20, when football was resumed after the war. That was the final season before the formation of Division III of the Football League in 1920/21.

We mention this as a matter of interest, as Grimsby Town, our visitors this evening, were also pioneers of Division III, and, during that season, a rather unusual event occurred in one of our matches with that Club.

Owing to a very high wind, a Grimsby defender found difficulty in taking a free kick, and the referee permitted Harold Fleming, the Town's captain, to stand less than the prescribed distance, so as to place a finger on the ball, to keep it "dead" for his opponent to take the kick.

In later seasons, Grimsby Town soared to Division I status, during which we met them in a memorable Cup tie, which resulted in a win for Swindon in the replay here, following a draw at Grimsby.

Since then, Grimsby have visited Swindon as opponents in Division III, and we are very pleased to renew acquaintance in another sphere.

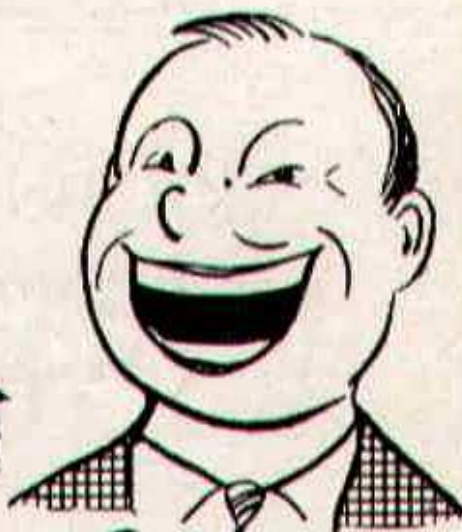

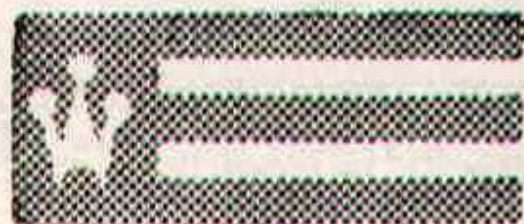
