CLUB NOTES

After the excitement of the Cup (even if it is the League Cup), we return to the serious routine of League football—the whole stature of British football.

Our opponents today have seen many “ups and downs”. A number of our older supporters will remember them as Clapton Orient, or the “O’s”. Incidentally, the club was founded in the same year as Swindon, namely 1881.

Most of you will remember them as members of Division 3 for long periods, 1929-39, and 1946-56. Many are the battles we have had, both here and at Brisbane Road.

In season 1955-56 they gained promotion from Division 3 (South), at the time when one club from each of the North and South Divisions went up.

Leyton occupied top position out of the 24 clubs with the fine record of

Even so, they only gained promotion by one point over Brighton, in second place.

At the end of that season (1955-6) Swindon had to seek re-election to the League, being in bottom place:

Times have certainly changed for the better, really, in both cases, as Swindon is now in Division 2, and Leyton, although now also in this division, enjoyed one glorious season, and were promoted to Division I. Unfortunately, they were only in that august company for a short period, being relegated immediately, but nevertheless had the honour of playing in the Premier Division of the League.

At present they occupy tenth position, having gained thirteen points (six less than Swindon) from twelve games.

Their away record is not quite as good as their home, but they are a team to command respect. No game is easy in this division.

At present their trainer, "Bill" Gore, is in charge, in a temporary position for the third time, although it is understood he prefers his proper position. The present state of affairs has come about through the departure of Manager Mr. Carey to Nottingham Forest. A fine man, we wish him well, but no doubt it has created difficulties for Leyton.

We trust they will enjoy their visit to Swindon, which we hope will revive happy memories.

All Supporters will wish to congratulate the Directorate and Management of Swindon Town F.C. on the excellent accounts just published for Season 1962/63. It is good to see a handsome profit on the year's working, without the donation from this Club, which, however, looks very comfortable in the Appropriation Account.

We can, however, look with satisfaction also on one or two items in the Income and Expenditure Account, particularly perhaps on the profit of nearly £900 from programme sales.

Already this season, too, our members have been busy in this direction, over 52,000 having already been sold by our representatives.

We would endeavour to make it clear that, apart from the sales and the contribution of these notes, our duties in connection with the programmes do not extend further. The quantities of programmes published are decided by the Town F.C. Board, having regard to their estimates of prospective gates, average sales in the past, and other contributory factors. If, on occasions, any particular matches produce more than the anticipated gates, with a resultant shortage of programmes, it is futile for disgruntled supporters to visit our headquarters with complaints and, in a few instances, unpleasant remarks or abuse.

We give preliminary notice that on 16th November, when Newcastle United visit the County Ground, the half-time collection will be given to the St. John Ambulance Brigade. We all have the highest regard and admiration for the very valuable work of this organisation at football matches, and elsewhere, and have no doubt that there will be a generous response to the appeal.
