Our opponents scored a well-taken goal in the first minute, then our lads really went to town, scoring five in succession: Darcy, Leggett, Stephens, Shergold (2) in that order. A penalty goal by Brighton, and so half-time 5-2 in our favour. After the interval, Stephens and Shergold scored again, and Brighton replied through their right half.

After a spell in the reserves, Ken was brought into the first team as a wing half, a position in which he has given a number of outstanding displays. One of Southampton's costliest players, Tony joined the "Saints" from Leicester City in 1961. Has played with remarkable consistency since he has been at The Dell, missing only one game in two seasons. An extremely safe player, both in the air and on the ground, his great asset seems to be his power of recovery. He has toured with the England party.

CLIFF HUXFORD

Born in Stroud, Gloucestershire, Cliff joined the "Saints" from Chelsea in an exchange deal. Was a member of the promotion-winning side from the Third Division in the 1959/60 season. An extremely strong player in the tackle, and one who never knows when he is beaten. Made 48 1st XI appearances last season.

Terry, a native of Winchester, joined the "Saints" from school in 1957. Capable of playing on either wing, he has really made his name on the right. He has represented England Under-23 side on several occasions and made his full international début in June 1963 against Czechoslovakia. A very gifted player who appears to have a great future ahead of him.

GEORGE KIRBY

Formerly with Everton and Sheffield Wednesday, George came to The Dell from Plymouth Argyle in September 1962. A very forceful type of leader whose heading ability is first class. Scored a hat-trick in four minutes against Middlesbrough last season. Made 33 appearances last season, scoring 13 goals.

JOHN SYDENHAM

Born in Southampton, John joined the "Saints" from school. Gained four Youth International caps and has also represented the England Under-23 XI and the Army XI. A very speedy winger who made 40 appearances last season, scoring 4 goals.

TONY GODFREY

Born in Newbury, Tony joined the "Saints" after leaving school. Signed professional in 1958. Made 40 1st XI appearances during the 1961/62 season, and 6 appearances last.

MARTIN CHIVERS

Born in Southampton, Martin signed professional last season. Ideal build for a centre forward. Scored one goal in 3 1st XI appearances and 25 goals in 31 reserve team appearances.

JOHN McGUIGAN

Formerly with St. Mirren, Southend, Newcastle Utd. and Scunthorpe Utd., John is the most recent signing. A versatile player who has occupied all forward positions with the exception of the right wing. Made 40 League appearances for Scunthorpe last season, scoring 7 goals. Born in Motherwell.



Leading goalscorer for the past two seasons, George joined the "Saints" from Leeds Utd. in 1959. Made 42 League appearances, scoring 22 goals last season, and also scored 7 goals in the F.A. Cup Competition. Born in Dunfermline.

DAVID BURNSIDE

Signed for the "Saints" in September 1962 from his only other League club, West Bromwich Albion. Made 32 appearances last season, scoring 14 goals. Played for the England Youth Team in 1957 and was later capped for the England Under-23 XI. Born in Bristol.

TED READ

Born in Gillingham, Dorset. Ted joined the playing staff as an apprentice professional before signing forms in 1960. A consistent full back who made 18 reserve team appearances last season.

IAN WHITE

Formerly with Glasgow Celtic and Leicester City, Ian joined the "Saints" in 1962. A useful, all round wing-half who made 11 first team appearances, scoring one goal.

MIKE HENNIGAN

Joined the "Saints" from Sheffield Wednesday in 1962. A useful, hard-tackling centre half who made 33 appearances in the reserve side last season.

DENIS HOLLYWOOD

Born in Govan, Denis is a player who seems to have a great future ahead of him. He was selected for the Scottish International Youth XI last season and represented them in all games during the International Youth Tournament. Made 4 1st XI and 25 reserve appearances last season.

TOM HARE

Signed from Faulthouse Utd. — a Scottish junior club in 1963. A busy type of wing half, very hard in the tackle.

HARRY PENK

Born in Wigan, Harry was signed from Plymouth Argyle in 1960. A very steady player who is capable of playing on either wing.

FOOTBALL LEAGUE'S JUBILEE BOOK

Histories are something dull. No-one will say this of *The Football League's Jubilee Book*, just issued to mark the pioneer competition's 75th birthday. It is a thriller with about fifty illustrations—some in colour—to light up great teams, games and players.

The highlights and humours of the early days are summarised; the growth to 92 clubs is covered in a fascinating cavalcade of the League's star performers. A chapter on the League's outstanding teams explains why these sides are placed on the pedestal. A chapter on pioneers cites the players who made new moves—men like Alex James (Arsenal), Wm. R. ("Dixie") Dean (Everton), Don Revie (Manchester City), and also Billy McCracken (Newcastle United) whose off-side tactics revolutionised the game.

This Jubilee Book has been complied by Ivan Sharpe (with half a century of experience on and off the field as background) with the collaboration of Alan Hardaker, the Football League Secretary, and the Headquarters Staff, who are responsible for the concluding statistical section containing every league match result since the last war.

This colourful panorama tells young and old all they ought to know about the League that showed the way for the rest of the world.




