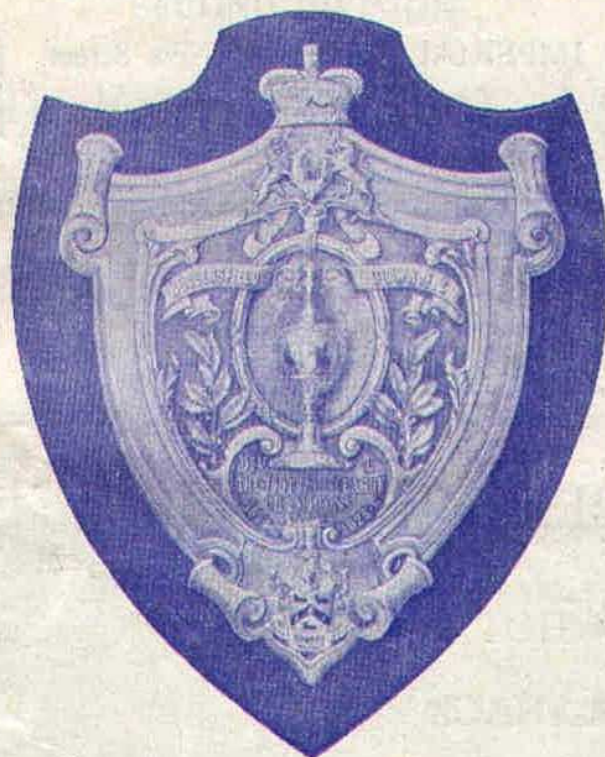

SPOTLIGHT

THE 1963-64 Soccer season nears its half-way stage with no clear-cut break, as yet, in the depressing run of fortune that seems to have overtaken our Second Division affairs.

But surely, after last Saturday's Cardiff story, the turning in the lane must come soon. "Luck seems to be deserting us on every side at the moment", was a comment made in our last "Spotlight" chapter. It seems, however, that at that stage Town's injury jinx was just beginning.

First came those ankle injuries involving Derek Stokes, Kevin McHale and Bob Parker. Then, in the Norwich game, John Bettany's collision with Terry Allcock which necessitated another dose of the stitch treatment. Next, the shock news that Bob McNab would have to enter hospital for a knee operation and that Mike O'Grady was having to take specialist's advice on a troublesome back complaint . . . and then, the proverbial "last straw" and biggest

setback of all, skipper Ray Wilson's mishap at Cardiff last Saturday.

If there's another Second Division club with a casualty-list anything like Town's, we will, indeed, be very surprised.

Was it any wonder, therefore, that our manager was anxious not to be in too big a hurry in playing Town's West Riding F.A. Senior Cup game with Leeds United?

Town are fifth from the bottom of the Second Division. Clearly, the priority requirement of the moment is to fight a way clear of this crisis-spot before taking on any other fixture commitments. And to be successful in that fight, it's vitally important that Town get no more injury setbacks.

The "Spotlight" team are hoping that by the time these notes are in print there will be more encouraging news about Ray Wilson's progress. Meanwhile, it's fingers crossed in

today's important clash with one of the most talked-about teams in the country, Swindon Town.

The Wiltshire lads have really set off with a "bang" in this, their first Second Division season and there's no use pretending that John Coddington and his colleagues will have other than a rare old fight on their hands this afternoon. At the time of going to print, Bert Head's youngsters are fourth from the top of the table. In fact, they have lost only three games of the eighteen they have played and, incidentally, two of the sides which did manage to turn the tables on Swindon - namely, Northampton and Preston North End - were also victorious against Town.

Another interesting fact is that Graham French, the former Town junior and ex-Shrewsbury player who TV viewers will recall had such a splendid game for England Youth recently can't get in Swindon's first team because of the sparkling consistency of Don Rogers.

The eighteen-year-old French has been the subject of transfer talk between Swindon and Chelsea this past fortnight. The player saw Tommy Docherty, the Chelsea manager, on his return from the Canary Islands with the England Youth team and asked for time to consider the move. But, as yet, nothing has materialised.

Can Town reproduce the slickness and incisiveness they showed in the first half of last Saturday's game? What effect will Wilson's absence have on the side? The next ninety minutes should provide the answer to these questions. At all events, let's hope that the ray of revival that appeared before that cruel set-back will re-emerge in today's encounter.

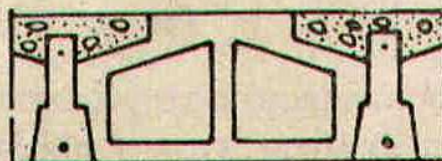

Introducing . . .

THE Wiltshire club are the sixth to visit Leeds Road this season that began their English League career in the Third Division South. That was in 1920 when they were one of the original 22 teams. Three times they had to apply for re-election, but in 1958 they were among the 24 that made up the new Third Division, from which they were promoted last season with Northampton.

Mr. Bert Head's homespun team have made a fine start in their first campaign in the Second Division – and this without any venture into the transfer market. Seven members of the side are virtually local products and the whole team cost only £4,000.

Last season Swindon rejected a total of £100,000 for five of their players – inside-right **Ernie Hunt** (24 goals last season and top scorer with nine this time), right-winger **Mike Summerbee**, full-back **John Trollope** (an ever-present last term), wing-half **Bob Woodruff** and inside-left **Roger Smart**.

These five, along with team captain **Keith Morgan** (right-half) and **Don Rogers** (outside-left), are all shining examples of Swindon's youth policy and another such product who has been introduced this season is **Willf Shergold**, a fast, play-anywhere forward, who has deputised for Smart in the last two games.

So far this season Swindon have not had to make any change in defence. Goalkeeper **Mike Turner**, who took over between the posts after the injury to Mike O'Hara last season, joined the club from Dorchester Town while still in the R.A.F., from which he is now demobbed. Trollope's full-back partner is **Owen Dawson**, an erstwhile centre-forward, who came from Portsmouth, and at

centre-half is **Ken McPherson**, also a centre-forward originally, who was secured from Newport County in August, 1961. McPherson is a native of West Hartlepool, as is centre-forward **Jack Smith**, who joined the Robins from Watford in season 1960/61. A strong, forceful player, Smith had nineteen goals last season.

Swindon began this season with six victories in a row and an unbeaten run of nine games. Their first defeat was at Northampton (0-4) on September 28th and since then as visitors they have lost only at Preston (0-1). They have won at Portsmouth (4-1), Grimsby (2-1) and Plymouth (4-2) and drawn at Leeds (0-0), Manchester City (0-0) and Middlesbrough (1-1).

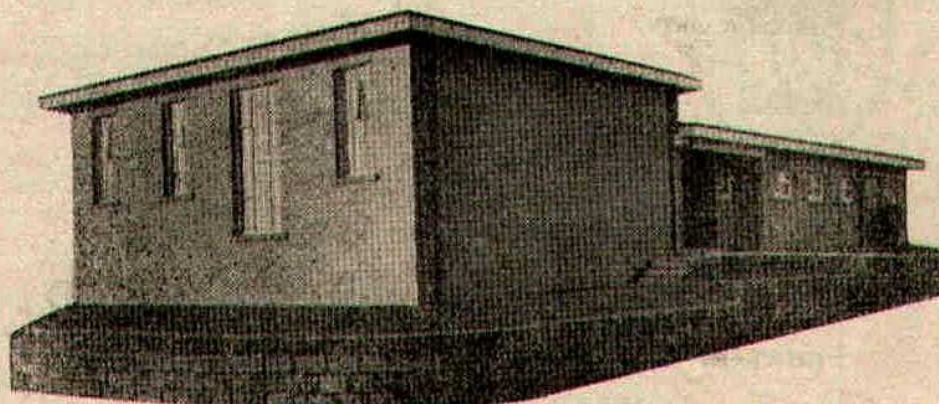

AFTER having played five games without a change, Town had to find deputies for both Willingham and Boot, both injured. Gordon came in at right-half and Mills (signed as an inside-forward) at left-half. For Stoke Gallacher (transferred from Sunderland during the week) made his debut at inside-left.

Town were the more forceful side early on and Baird missed badly after Barlow and Price had created an opening.

Stoke were more ready to take their chances and in the 17th and 18th minutes became two up. First the brilliant Matthews forced a corner from which Sale headed City into the lead and Steele followed with a second after Soo had brought the ball through.

More Town pressure followed but, except for two shots by Beasley and Barclay, goalkeeper Wilkinson was not seriously troubled. Stoke's forwards continued to be more incisive and after Mountford had twice

foiled Matthews the young maestro returned to tee up another goal for Sale a minute before the interval.

In the second half Town raided for long spells. Hayes hit a post from a free kick and Wilkinson twice saved smartly from Barlow before Mills (who had changed places with Baird) reduced the lead from a cross by Price. After 75 minutes Sale headed Stoke's fourth goal from another corner kick by Matthews.

FOOTBALL LEAGUE'S JUBILEE BOOK

HISTORIES are something dull. No one will say this of *The Football League's Jubilee Book* just issued to mark the pioneer competition's 75th birthday. It is a thriller with about fifty illustrations – some in colour – to light up great teams, games and players.
