Club Notes and News

The run of the draw in the F.A. cup has again turned the way of Scunthorpe United, and after being drawn away from home in the past two seasons, we now meet Barnsley in the third round at the Old Show Ground on Saturday, January 4th.

It is pointed out to supporters that the kick off for this game is at 3 p.m.—the latest time allowed by the F.A. for an afternoon game in the cup. Should there be a replay it will take place at Oakwell on the following Tuesday, January 7th with the kick off at 7-15 p.m.

For the Od Show Ground match, seats in both stands will be bookable in advance, but admission to all other parts of the ground will be by payment at the turnstiles in the usual way. The usual first team admission charges will be in force.

On the west stand centre section seats will cost 6/6d, with the wing seats at 6s. On the east stand the centre portion seats will cost 6s. and the wing sections 5s.

Tickets will be available from the club offices from Saturday, December 21st onwards.

Barnsley have claimed their full allowance of 25 per cent of the seats, and supporters wishing to have seats are advised to make early application. As this is a cup match season ticket holders will have to pay for their seats, but they will be held mreserve for them until Monday, 30th December. Any unclaimed seats after that date will be available for sale to the public.

Our next Second Division game at the Old Show Ground should be one of the most attractive of the season, for our visitors will be Manchester City who will be making their first visit to the 'Old Show Ground. This game takes place on Saturday, December 28th, with the usual 3-15 p.m. start

After the form shown at Charlton, and the drawn game against Grims-by at the Old Show Ground, it was disappointing to lose by 3—1 at Newcastle last week, but on the day Newcastle were the better team.

It was with great regret that all at the Old Show Ground learned of the death of Mr. Sam Kennedy, who was first elected to the board of directors in 1946, and apart from a break of five years had remained on the board until the time of his death.

Today we welcome Swindon Town to the Old Show Ground, and look forward to a fine game, against a team which has certainly made an early mark as members of the Second Division.

This is Swindon's first season in the section, having won promotion as runners up to Northampton Town in last season's third division championship battle.

Swindon made a fine start to the season, and are now holding down fourth position in the league with 26 points from 21 games. It is a record of which they have every reason to be proud.

Swindon are now reaping the full benefit of the youth policy which Mr. Bert Head adopted as soon as he was appointed manager of the Wiltshire club. The majority of their players have come up through the club's nursery teams, and they now field the youngest average age team in the division.

Furthermore they have deservedly won a reputation for attractive football, played at great speed —a fact which they demonstrated when beating United by 3—0 at Swindon on the opening day of the season.

Goalkeeper Mike Turner joined the club from non league club Dorchester and has quickly developed into one of the division's most accomplished 'keepers.

Full backs Owen Dawson and Norman Trollope have quickly settled to the demands of Second Division football, Dawson was formerly with Portsmouth, while Trollope has been developed through the Swindon Nursery teams.

with full caps.
