to play an exhibition match to open Ninian Park. As supporters well know it is now one of the best equipped grounds in the country, with stands covering three sides of the pitch. Cardiff, throughout the football world, has always enjoyed a fine reputation as a great club, not only to play for, but also to visit.

Many of us have very happy memories of season 1951-52, when in Round 3 of the F.A. Cup Competition we defeated Cardiff by 1-0 after a draw of 1-1 played on Saturday, 6th January, 1952, before a gate of 36,000. The captain of the city at that time was left back Alf Sherwood, a great character in Welsh Football, and the manager, Mr. Cyril Spiers.

The team today contains many famous names, including John Charles and his brother Mel Charles, and incidentally the present manager is Mr. George Swindin, who for many years performed excellently as goalkeeper for Arsenal F.C.

No doubt all our supporters are following with great interest the struggle for promotion from the top four clubs of Division 3, with varying memories of this time last year. The decline in the fortunes of Coventry City have no doubt been noted. Once a team gets into a "bad" run, everything seems to go against the club, and it is difficult to get out, as we ourselves know. Fortunately we seem to have begun to get back on the winning trail, having taken five points out of the last six.

CLUB NOTES—CONTINUED

Whatever happens in Division 3 we shall certainly be pleased to meet old friends and rivals, whichever two of the four clubs, Crystal Palace, Coventry, Watford or Bournemouth gain promotion. They are all within easy distance of Swindon and in most cases, almost like "local derbies." At one time most clubs in the division thought the strongest candidates for promotion were Coventry and Watford. At this moment, however, Crystal Palace must be well in the running now that club has a lead of four points, and the second place very open, with perhaps Watford the favourites. Coventry, however, could still return to early season form, and Bournemouth (probably our best friends) have begun a successful run at the right period.

What a fight would have ensued, had the "four-up" come into being, with both Bristol clubs in fifth and sixth positions, and our near neighbours Reading also in the hunt. Certainly some attractive matches would have been staged, with corresponding high attendances.

Details of the players from whom today's team will be selected are as follows:—

GRAHAM VEARNCOMBE (Goalkeeper)

Cardiff boy. Welsh International — has been with Cardiff from youth days. Was out of football for 12 months while in the Merchant Navy. Is yet another of the Cardiff City footballers who graduated from the local schoolboy team and Cardiff City has been his only first class club. Twice capped for Wales and reserve on many occasions.

DILWYN JOHN (Goalkeeper)

A product of Cardiff Schools Football playing for Radnor Road and Cardiff Boys. Made his first team debut against Chelsea the season before last and played 21 First Division games that season. Regained his first team place in the latter half of last season.

ALEC MILNE (Left Back)

This strongly built Scot was signed from Arbroath towards the end of the 1956-7 season and made his first senior team appearance towards the end of that season. Has played for Scotland B team, unfortunately received a knee injury against Bristol Rovers in the Football League Cup, which kept him out of football for most of last season.

TREVOR EDWARDS (Right Back)

Born at Penygraig. Previously with Charlton Athletic and is a mature and experienced player. He has played at full back, half back and centre forward. Capped twice for Wales and captained the Welsh team against Scotland in 1958/59.

OUR VISITORS—CONTINUED

TREVOR PECK (Left Back)

Joined Cardiff City from Llanelly 4 seasons ago; a player of undoubted ability but has been unfortunate in sustaining injuries. Originally a centre half back but was tried at left back at the back end of last season and should make the position his own this season.

ALAN HARRINGTON (Wing Half or Full Back)

Yet another product of local football and born at Cogan, a stones throw from Ninian Park. Has had a brilliant career since making the first team in 1951. Has been capped on numerous occasions for Wales and is equally brilliant at either full back or wing half.

RON STITFALL (Right Back)

The longest serving member of the Cardiff City team at the present time is Stitfall. Among the many local products at Ninian Park, he was signed as an outside right at the age of 14. He signed professional in 1947 and moved into the rearguard with such success that apart from a few outings as leader of the attack, he has subsequently remained there. Stitfall won his first Welsh International Cap against England in 1953 and has represented the Principality in games with Continental teams.

BARRY HOLE (Left Half)

Son of former Swansea Town and Welsh International Billy Hole, he is another product of Swansea. He made his debut for the first team 4 seasons ago and has made considerable progress since. Was a first team regular last season and gained his first full International cap for Wales against Ireland last season.

COLIN BAKER (Wing Half)

Born in Cardiff; one of the famous local products who succeeded an equally famous international namesake (Billy Baker) when he made his debut in the league side in 1953; has been a regular in the first team ever since capped for Wales since 1959 and also played twice for Wales Under-23 XI.

RICHARD SCOTT (Wing Half Back)

21 years of age, started his football career with Norwich City, joining their ground staff at the age of 15. Of fine physique he should prove an acquisition to the City. Can also play at centre forward. Born at Thetford, Norfolk.

GARETH WILLIAMS (Wing Half)

Born at Fleur-de-Lys. Made his first team debut against Bournemouth in a Football League Cup Tie the season before last. A strong and capable player; made 13 appearances for the first team last season.

JOHN CHARLES (Centre Half)

One of the greatest footballers in the world. Big John's career has been described as fabulous; started his football career with Leeds United then transferred to Juventus and brought back by Leeds United last year. Transferred back again to Italy in the middle of last season to Roma. He has now joined Cardiff City and is captain for this season.

ALAN McINTOSH (Outside Right)

A former Welsh Amateur International. Made his league debut for the City in February the season before last. Played regularly at outside right all last season.

MEL CHARLES (Centre Forward)

Learnt his football with Swansea Boys; eventually signing as a professional for Swansea Town. Transferred to Arsenal in March 1959 for a record fee of that time £40,000. A versatile player — can play in any position in the half back line and also centre forward. Has played for Wales on 33 occasions.

OUR VISITORS—CONTINUED

IVOR ALLCHURCH (Inside Left)

Started his career with Swansea Town. Joined Newcastle four years ago and transferred to Cardiff City at the commencement of last season. He is now playing as well as ever. When playing for Wales last season against Scotland at Ninian Park, Ivor beat Billy Meredith's record of 51 appearances for Wales.

DEREK TAPSCOTT (Inside Right)

A native of Barry, South Wales, Tapscott was with his home town club before moving to Highbury in 1953. He made his debut for Arsenal against the City in April 1953 and scored two goals in that game. Joined Cardiff City in 1958. Has been one of the Club's leading goalscorers. Played for Wales on 17 occasions.

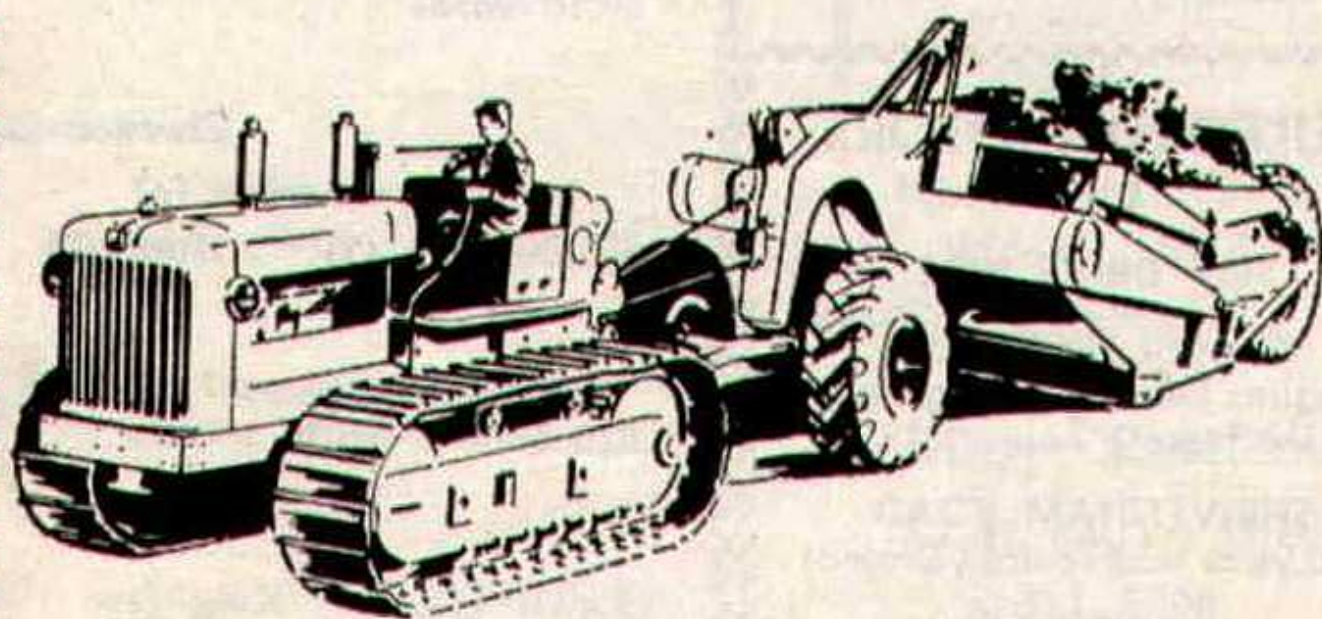
PETER KING (Outside Left)
