Today a collection will be made on behalf of the funds of the Swindon Cricket Club, whose finances are in need of a boost.

The weather experienced during the past few cricket seasons has not been conducive to good attendances at matches, and other summer attractions have also had a detrimental effect.

The Swindon Cricket Club enjoyed a great reputation in the past and, with the standard of cricket in Wiltshire generally improving, it is hoped to re-establish the local club on a sound financial footing.

It is hoped, therefore, that there will be a generous response today.

An interested visitor at the County Ground during Easter was the former Town goalkeeper, Ted Nash, who was on Swindon's books from 1919-20 to 1929-30. A product of local school and junior football he was at first deputy to Fred Hinton and Len Skiller, and made his first appearance in the first team at the age of seventeen.

On Skiller's retirement he became the regular goalkeeper and, apart from short periods of displacement by such players as Oswald Randall and Jack Bourne, he held his place until 1930 when he was transferred to Brentford.

Of recent years he has become a well known "scout" with Brighton and, more recently, we believe, with Southend.

He will also be remembered in the cricketing world as a wicket keeper and a forceful batsman with Swindon and the Wiltshire County team.

We are very pleased today to make the acquaintance of Huddersfield Town. Apart from the meeting earlier in the season the only match which we can trace between the two Clubs was a cup-tie in 1912-13, which Swindon won by 2—1.
