A member of the first team at 16 years old, he is a player of outstanding E. Hunt ability for whom the club has had many offers.



GOSSIP

By HARRY DITTON (News of the World)

Way back in August I wrote 'We may well be on the threshold of the most exciting era

in the long history of the game'. How right I was!

Maybe that sounds as though I preen myself on being 'the clever guy who told you so'. I assure you I don't. On the contrary I confess that in spite of what I wrote in August the excitement since has come in such large doses that even I am left breathless and staggered by it all.

For instance the 'take-over bids' for players alone makes this a season without parallel; something I never contemplated. Do you realise transfer fees have reached the fantastic figure of nearly £3,000,000 in the past seven months—a tremendous amount of 'lolly' even

in the language of a Clore or in terms of a train robbery!

Personally, I never cease to be fascinated by these flittings of umpteen thousand pound stars from one club to another. By and large they are usually good for the clubs whether they

happen to be buyers or sellers and they are good for the players.

What makes this seasons crop of transfers still more interesting and exciting is the fact that Fred Pickering, Alan Mullery, Ian Ure, John Kaye, Alan Peacock and in fact the overwhelming number of the players who have boosted the 'kitty' to near the £3,000,000 mark cost their former clubs only a signing-on fee. Surely the moral here is obvious—it still pays to produce your own players!

That reminds me of something else—the exciting progress that has been made this season by several young players who were virtually unknown last August but who, by present-day

transfer values, must now be worth a mint of money.

Space does not permit of a mention of them all but high in the list must be two young outside lefts, George Best of Manchester United, and John Sissons of West Ham United. Such is my own high rating of them—both are what I choose to call 'naturals'—that not only must their own managers, Matt Busby and Ron Greenwood, be laughing but they must surely have been noted by England team manager, Alf Ramsey, busily team building for the 1966 World Cup series.

Another young winger who has impressed me considerably is Stephen Earle, the Fulham outside right, while Bill Shankley of Liverpool, knew a thing or two when he promoted inside forward Alf Arrowsmith and took a cool £50,000 from Wolves for that fine ball player Jimmy

Melia.

Among wing half backs few are weighing in with such consistent performances as Ted Bovington of West Ham, while Phil Beal was proving such a 'hit' at Tottenham until injury put him out of the side that he looked like saving free spending and ambitious Spurs the £70,000 they are reported to have paid for Mullery.

And if you go to Sunderland they'll tell you they have the tops in young Martin Harvey and they aren't far wrong. It's likely too, we shall be hearing a lot of Blackpool's Micky Rowe who, in spite of fleeting appearances, plays with a maturity far beyond his years.

This does not exhaust the list of up and coming youngsters by a long way but it must suffice for today except to add just this; when one considers all the ramifications of Soccer the intensity of competition, the sky's the limit, ambitions of certain clubs and so on—it's still nice to feel, and to know, there's room at the top for any lad determined enough and dedicated enough to get there.

FROM THE BOARDROOM

Today we welcome Swindon Town, our near neighbours. They started the season with a magnificent run of victories, and we were the first side to win at Swindon. Their early promise has not been maintained, but they will certainly be all out to try to reverse our 2-1 win, and a hard match is envisaged.

CHELSEA

TEAM MANAGER'S NOTES

- PROGRAMME QUESTIONS -

Mrs. L. MEREFIELD of Southampton asks:- "What is the policy of the Management on playing tactics. Supporters become extremely irritated on seeing the same errors week after week."

ANSWER-

Our playing tactics are directed to the strength of the players in the side, they are elastic and adaptable to the strengths and weaknesses of our opponents. I like players of all round ability; by that I mean, forwards who can work in defence, create and score goals, defenders who can get the ball and use it with purpose to develop attacking movements, and join in when necessary. Consequently this is built into the style of the team, in which the players are allowed to express their ability within the framework of our system of play. But when the pressure is on their play, the particular limitations that are characteristic of individual players will show themselves. Whichever football team you support, you have to face the fact that owing to the human element, football is a game of errors and those that are made in the team are tried to be overcome by teamwork.

Mr S. A. CULHAM of Romsey asks:- "For quite a number of seasons it has been very noticeable that the majority of your playing staff have been under average height. Have you a reason for this."

ANSWER-

When going after a player one always tries to bear in mind that old adage that all things being equal, a good big 'un will always come out best against a good little 'un! I look for players of all round ability, and in my case, when going into the transfer market, the taller players have not measured up to the ability of those of smaller stature available at the time. Height can always be an advantage on the field both in attack and defence, but unfortunately it does not always go with ability. Smaller players are often sharper and more compact with their technique. Remember, it is not always the size of the man in the fight, but the size of the fight in the man that matters.






