We should certainly have made the scores level but for two fantastic diving saves by goalkeeper Briggs.

It was this player's second game of the season, and he certainly proved a great asset to the Swansea team, insomuch as every time he obtained the ball the Swindon goal was in danger. Every kick he took landed in our penalty area, and

was often difficult to deal with effectively.

We understand he was obtained from Manchester United on a free transfer. We seem to meet such players in top form when we play against them, for instance at Portsmouth.

To revert back to last Saturday's game: certainly, as stated in the programme that day, the fight, the spirit and the determination are all there. A little more confidence and we shall see once again the form and style of play of last season. We saw glimpses on Saturday and certainly at Swansea and Charlton.

Our opponents this afternoon, Derby County, were for many seasons an outstanding team in Division I, yet strangely enough they have never won the championship, but they were successful in the first Cup Final played after the war, when they defeated Charlton Athletic in 1946. A goalkeeper who later came to Swindon—namely, Frank Boulton—was a player with Derby that season, but he did not actually play in the Final.

They have produced some famous names in the football world: the great Steve Bloomer, Sammy Crooks, Albert Quanttrill, Harry Storer, Dally Duncan, Peter Docherty, Tim Ward, and many others. The last-named is now the successful manager of the present team. This season they have made an excellent start, and are in sixth position in the League.

As far as memory goes, we have only met on the two occasions when we played last season. Strangely enough, the two clubs have never clashed in the F.A. Cup. The results last year were 0—0 at Swindon and 0—3 at Derby. It is, therefore, our turn to take the points, and this we shall endeavour to do.

We frequently read in the Press about the number of managers, scouts and other club representatives present at a certain game. Then follows the stories and rumours about offers for players, transfers, etc.

Almost every one is fictitious and without foundation. The plain fact is, especially regarding evening games, that managers, scouts, etc. go along to see other teams play. It is not a question of watching certain players. Maybe at the end of a season one may be available, and they would remember seeing him.

In many cases it is merely a "busman's holiday", and is definitely relaxation after being with their own team and the tension and strain involved.

We hear a great deal about gate potential with the expansion of Swindon. Last Saturday our attendance was 12,501; quite good as numbers go, and very good when compared with other clubs. On that number the Club certainly could not maintain the present playing staff. The total, including apprentice professionals (after all, they are full-time), is 43.

Unfortunately, the gate potential is dependent on results — a winning team. If points are fewer than last year, Swindon is still in Division II and not many places away from the top half of the table.

For so long the cry has been: "Give us Division II football". Well, it is still there and, what is more, it was obtained by its team of local lads brought through from the Junior stages.

We trust we shall continue with present policy — namely, home-produced players — Swindon lads playing for their own home team, the ambition of every schoolboy.

Our Reserve Team gave a great display at Coventry on Tuesday, winning by five goals to nil. Every member of the team played well after a fast opening by Coventry, due in part to the announcement from Swansea regarding a one-goal lead. After half an hour, Swindon were two up, both goals scored by K. East. Then T. Wollen was carried off on a stretcher and

We are pleased to welcome the Directors, Officials and Players of Derby County Football Club to the County Ground for this afternoon's game.

Details of the players from whom today's team will be selected are as follows:—

BARROWCLIFFE, GEOFFREY (full back)

5ft. 10½in. 12st. 11lb. A local boy who signed for Derby County while playing for Ilkeston Town in October, 1950. Played with the Central League side the same season and made his Football League debut on 1st September, 1951 at the age of 19. Has also played at centre forward.

YOUNG, RAYMOND (centre half)

5ft. 10½in. 11st. 7lb. A former England schoolboys and Derby schoolboys player who made his debut in senior football at Doncaster in April, 1954. Signed as an amateur in May, 1949, turning professional in March, 1951. A cool, constructive and resourceful player.

PARRY, JOHN (inside forward/wing half)

5ft. 8in. 11st. 3lb. A member of the well-known footballing family of Derby who attracted the club's attention while playing for Derby Boys. Signed amateur forms in 1947 and turned professional in July, 1948, making his Football League debut in April, 1949 when only 17 years old. Is equally at home at wing half.

BOWERS, JOHN (inside or wing forward)

5ft. 9in. 10st. 7lb. Part-time professional, signed in February, 1957 and the son of Jack Bowers, former Derby County and England centre forward. Another member of the Derby Boys side who attracted the club's attention at the time. Is employed in the advertising department of the Derby "Daily Telegraph."

MOORE, LESLIE (centre half)

6ft. 1in. 12st. 7lb. Part-time professional who works in an insurance office in Sheffield. Joined Derby County from Worksop Town in November, 1957, and after three weeks made his Football League debut against Rotherham United at Millmoor Ground. A native of Sheffield, is a strong, forceful player who is rarely beaten in the air.

CULLEN, MICHAEL (inside forward)

5ft. 8in. 10st. 7lb. Born in Glasgow and played for Luton Town and Grimsby Town before signing for Derby County in November, 1962. A clever, scheming inside forward with plenty of craft.

BUXTON, IAN RAY (inside or centre forward)

5ft. 9in. 11st. Part-time professional, at present at technical college. Locally-born, and turned professional in March, 1959 after playing for the club as a junior. Had Central League experience as a junior and made quite a number of Football League appearances last season. Has also had considerable success on the playing staff of the Derbyshire County Cricket Club.

CURRY, WILLIAM MORTON (centre forward)

5ft. 8in. 11st. 9lb. Entered League football with his home team, Newcastle United, in 1955/56, scoring seven goals in 19 matches. During the following season he scored 25 times in 51 games. Has played for England (Under 23 team). Scored 23 goals in 40 games whilst with Brighton. Transferred to Derby County on 30th September, 1960.

WEBSTER, RONALD (wing half)

5ft. 9in. 10st. 5lb. Locally-born player who was signed in August, 1953 and turned professional in June, 1960. Has had considerable experience in the Central League side and can now be considered as an established member of the senior side, despite very unlucky breaks with injuries. A hard-tackling wing half who shows no reluctance to play the full ninety minutes.

MATTHEWS, REGINALD (goalkeeper)

5ft. 10in. 11st. 11lb. A Coventry-born player, transferred from Chelsea in October, 1961. Coventry City was his first club, which he joined after leaving school. Full International honours.

FERGUSON, ROBERT (full back)

5ft. 8½in. 11st. 9lb. Born at Dudley, Worcester and played with Newcastle United from the age of 16 years, until he joined Derby County in October, 1962. Has commanded a first-team place since his signing and is a strong, forceful tackler.

DURBAN, ALAN (inside forward)

5ft. 9in. 10st. 6lb. Born Port Talbot, and played with Cardiff City since signing professional. Capped last year and this year for the Wales Under 23 side. Played cricket for the Glamorgan 2nd XI.

HUGHES, GORDON (outside right)

5ft. 5½in. 11st. 2lb. Comes from Washington, Co. Durham and joined Newcastle United from Washington Juniors in 1956. Sturdily built, he is a fast, raiding winger, and very dangerous when in possession of the ball.

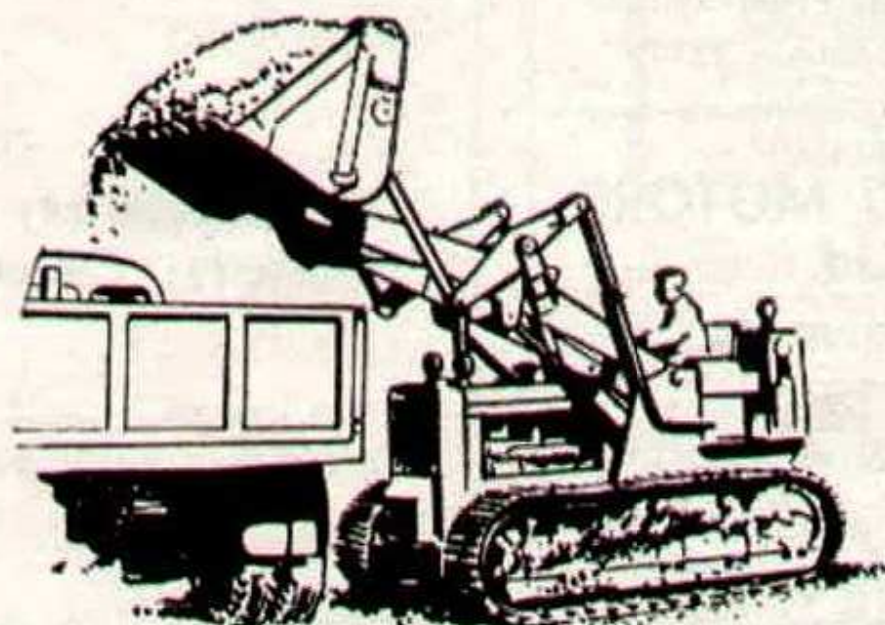

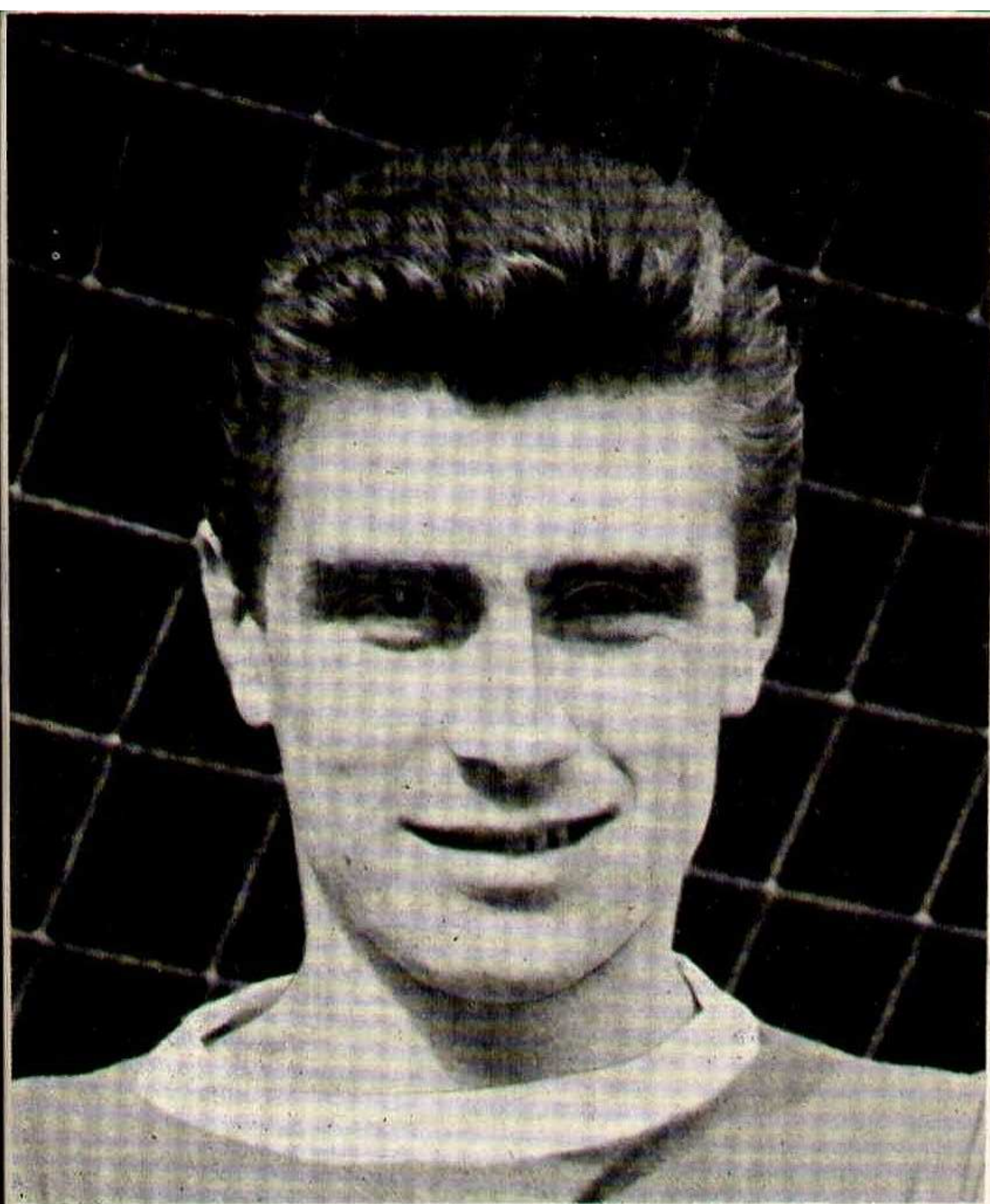
