MARGIN NARROWING AT THE TOP

When the time comes to ponder on the results of the present, dare we say, promotion season, one of the outstanding memories will undoubtedly be the victory over Derby County at the Baseball ground. Played on a pitch which was a veritable sea of mud, the Wanderers excelled themselves in recovering from a two goal deficit at the half-way stage to eventually triumph by three goals to two.

Here was team work at its best, and the players are to be congratulated on overcoming the conditions and a strong County side in achieving another "double."

The two precious points gained, when at the same time the three clubs above us had to be satisfied with a point each, brought us to within five points from the leading club, Newcastle United.

Northampton Town having lost to Swindon Town in mid-week, gives the Wanderers three matches in hand over each of the three clubs. The inference is obvious, and everyone is keyed up for an all-out effort in this last phase of a memorable season.

Yet another club makes its first-ever appearance at Burnden Park this evening. Swindon Town, members of the Football League since 1920-21 season, are spending only their second spell in Division II.

Their policy of the last several years, like ourselves, has been the furtherance of youth. Two seasons ago reward was forthcoming when they gained promo-

tion, along with Northampton Town, from Division III, where they had languished for 36 years. Again was this policy testified in the following season when the club reached the final of the F.A. Youth Cup.

To Mr. Bert Head, their manager, and directors, we offer a welcome to Burnden Park, and look forward to an entertaining evening's play.

Tonight also marks the possible return of Wyn Davies, who has missed the last three games through injury. Understudy Francis Lee and Dennis Butler, filling the outside-right berth, have given valiant service during the centre-forward's absence, maximum points having been gained from those matches.

Wyn has also been chosen to play for Wales next Wednesday, and with the Wanderers meeting Charlton on Monday at Burnden Park, he will surely be making a hectic come-back.
