SWINDON TOWN F.C.

The curtain comes down today on the Saints 29th season in the Second Division, and it is most fitting that Swindon Town should provide the opposition, for as many of you reading these notes may not know, they were the first club to appear at the Dell in a Football League match, nearly 45 years ago. The Great War had then been over nearly two years, and with the Saints and the Robins, old and respected rivals in the First Division of the Southern League since its inception in 1894, became founder members of the Third Division (South). It was an exciting time for local soccer fans and they turned up in force in the evening of August 31st 1920 (a Monday) to see the Saints, who had drawn 1-1 at Gillingham the previous Saturday, embark with justifiable optimism on their new programme. And they were suitably rewarded for the Saints walloped Swindon 4-0 and one sports writer enthused: "Swindon were made to appear slow and inept with Dominy and Barrett in great form on the right wing."

The Saints team is worth recalling:- Allen; Parker, Titmus; Shelley, Campbell, Turner; Barrett, Rawlings, Dominy, Moore, Foxall. I have no record of the Swindon team but I know that it included that fine inside forward Harold Fleming, probably the best-known 'name' ever associated with the Wiltshire club, who won nine England caps. It was he who, by finishing as top scorer in that first League season, materially helped Swindon finish fourth in the table, only two points and two places below the Saints. The following year, of course, the Saints, completing a "double" over Swindon, won promotion, and over 40 years were to pass before they met again in the League.

True, their paths crossed in the F.A. Cup—in the fifth round in February 1948 at the Dell, and although Swindon had already caused a bit of a stir by beating first Burnley at Turf Moor and then Notts County at home, the honours went deservedly to the Saints. There must be many on the terraces today who remember that that match attracted a 29,000 crowd and that Charlie Wayman gave the Saints a 1-0 interval lead. George Curtis, now managing Stevenage Town, the Southern League club made it 2-0 early in the second half and centre half Ithell put through his own goal to make it a sad day for Wiltshiremen everywhere.

Five years later it was Third Division soccer again for the Saints and although they had a long, hard haul before regaining their rightful status, Swindon, now under the management of that live-wire Mr. Bert Head decided that it was high time the County Ground fans too saw better soccer.

In 1962-63 came the great revival and it is part of the recent soccer history how Swindon, finishing as Third Division runners-up to Northampton made a tremendous impact in the Second Division in their first season, playing football which would have delighted old-timers such as Fleming, Grenville Morris (winner years ago of 21 Welsh caps), Scottish full back John Walker, Harry Kay and other stars of another era. Not to mention, of course, the Rev W. Pitt, who back in 1881 started Swindon as an amateur club for the young men of his Parish. He, like many others, was one of the pioneers to which the game owes so much.

As this is the last game of the season I can only hope that a year hence the Saints will be celebrating the one achievement which has too long eluded them, promotion to the First Division.

FROM THE BOARDROOM

The fixture arrangements this season brought us an Easter programme of two away matches and one at home. The first of the away matches last Saturday, April 17th against Leyton proved rather a disappointing affair, in spite of the fact that for the seventh match in succession the Saints were undefeated. The goal-less draw, played under nasty conditions due to a violent, gusty wind, might easily have been a victory if a few of the many chance set up by the Saints had been successfully finished off, for at least four good chances went begging in the first half. When Martin Chivers did score, what to everybody, except one linesman, appeared to be a perfectly legitimate goal, the referee after awarding a goal, changed his decision, to Leyton's relief and Saints' consternation. The welcome point helped to keep the Orient at the upper end of the relegation zone, but still rather apprehensive over their remaining fixtures.

The other away match at Ipswich on Easter Monday brought the first defeat in eight games. Played on a pitch, probably the heaviest this season, in a mixture of blinding hailstones, heavy rain and sunshine, Ipswich beat the Saints by 2-0 and showed that they are now a very capable side. Saints played attractive football but lacked finishing powers. Even George O'Brien shot wide from the penalty spot!

It is possible that by the time these notes appear, the Reserves may have got their reward of promotion to Division one of the Combination. They deserve great credit for their really excellent displays all through the season. Under the enthusiastic and expert captaincy of the ever-green Tommy Traynor, the wonderful team spirit shown by both the experienced and young players in the side has been very heartening and will, I hope, bring its reward.

Congratulations to Terry Paine, who has been selected to go on the European tour with the English party from May 3rd—17th. He will visit Yugoslavia, West Germany and Sweden, and no doubt add to his ten full England Caps.

We welcome to the Dell to-day for our last league match this season, our old friends and rivals, Swindon. Whatever the outcome of the holiday programme has been for our visitors, we have a keen desire to avenge the 2-1 defeat they inflicted on us at Swindon on October 13th last, so a keen, interesting struggle is expected.

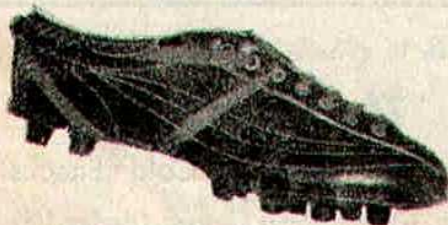

TEAM MANAGER'S NOTES

At both our away Easter games, at Leyton and Ipswich, we should have had a better return for the football we played. At Leyton, Martin Chivers had what appeared to be a good goal disallowed at an important phase of the game, through a very debatable off-side decision, and at Ipswich George O'Brien, usually so sure from the spot, hit the post from a penalty, when a goal at that time would have put us right back in the game.

At this time of the season, Football Clubs that haven't achieved what they wanted, are looking back through the season on what might or might not have been, and we at this Club are no exception. Away from home, with an average of almost a point a match, we have had some good results, but it is at the Dell where we have been most disappointing, and hit hardest, with defeats from Middlesbrough, Crystal Palace and Newcastle, and drawn games with Leyton, Derby, Portsmouth, Huddersfield and Cardiff; our biggest set-back coming after Christmas, when we could only get five points from five games at a vital stage of the season.

Our Reserve boys' narrow win over Millwall at the Dell on Easter Monday now means that we need one point in our remaining home game against Leyton Orient to win the League, and complete a very creditable performance.

It is typical of football that after 41 games our match with Swindon to day virtually decides whether they or Portsmouth go down into the Third Division, therefore we can expect a real fight on our hands this afternoon.
