TWO MINUTES FROM GROUND

CLUB NOTES—continued

Our opponents have, to date, played 24 games, won 14, drawn 5, lost 5, with goals scored 56 and against 39. A fine record which they will be keen to improve this afternoon.

Hull City has a fine stadium at Boothferry Park, much of which was built during their boom period, 1949-56, when they were members of Division II of the Football League and reached the quarter-finals of the F.A. Cup.

The amenities of the ground are constantly being added to, by first six pylon lights costing £48,000 (the best in England), and a new £100,000 cantilever stand. The record attendance figure is 55,000.

The present team is composed of many players obtained by paying large transfer fees. This particularly applies to the forward line, which includes one local player, Chilton (centre forward), outside right Henderson (obtained from Middlesbrough), and inside right Wagstaffe (transferred from Mansfield for a fee of £40,000). The left wing pair of Houghton and Butler were sold by Manager Danny Williams, manager at that time of Rotherham United, for a total of £90,000. The half back line of Simpkin, Milner and Jarvis cost nothing in fees, but the player who makes the greatest appeal to us is the captain and right back, Andy Davidson. He joined Hull whilst serving in the R.A.F. This is his only club, and he has made over 500 first-team appearances. We wish him well, and trust he will play in another 500 games. Football could do with more men of his calibre and loyalty of service.

The present manager is Mr. Cliff Britton, one time with Everton and a great England wing half. His first professional club as a player was Bristol Rovers.

Other famous names have filled the managerial chair at Hull, namely Major Frank Buckley (of Wolves fame), Bob Brocklebank, Horatio Carter and W. McCracken.

Well-known players who wore the amber and black shirts were Don Revie (now manager of Leeds United), Neil Franklin (England centre half and now manager of Colchester United), and the one and only Stan Mortenson.

Earlier this season when Swindon visited Hull, the home side won by the narrow margin of one goal to nil.

In Season 1962-63 Swindon won 2-0 at home, early in the season. The away game in January was postponed with the score at 0-0, then the replay was the last league game; score Hull City 1, Swindon Town 1.

Next week we visit Peterborough and then on 22nd January entertain Coventry City in the Third Round of the F.A. Cup.

The County Ground has frequently seen the downfall of our cup opponents. Last year's league game remains one of the outstanding matches of the season.

May we see a repeat performance.

On the last Saturday of the month Swindon visit near neighbours and rivals, Oxford United. The game promises to be a very close affair.

Has five seasons of League football behind him. Always prominent in the Tigers' scoring records, notching 27 goals last season. Many clubs have sought the services of this fine player, who was born at Sproatley near Hull.

CORNER, Norman

Signed in 1962 after trials with City and made his 1st XI debut for the Tigers in Season 1963/4. Has also played at wing half. A young player who is showing great promise. Born at Horden, Co. Durham.

HEATH, Terry

Signed from Leicester City during the close season of 1964, after four seasons with the Filbert Street club. Born in Leicester.

HENDERSON, Ray

Was with Middlesbrough before being transferred to Hull City in June 1961. A very intelligent positional player who can make the best of a half chance. Born in Wallsend.

Was signed full-time after having trials with Hull City and made his 1st XI debut at Easter 1963. Another young player in whom the Tigers have great faith.

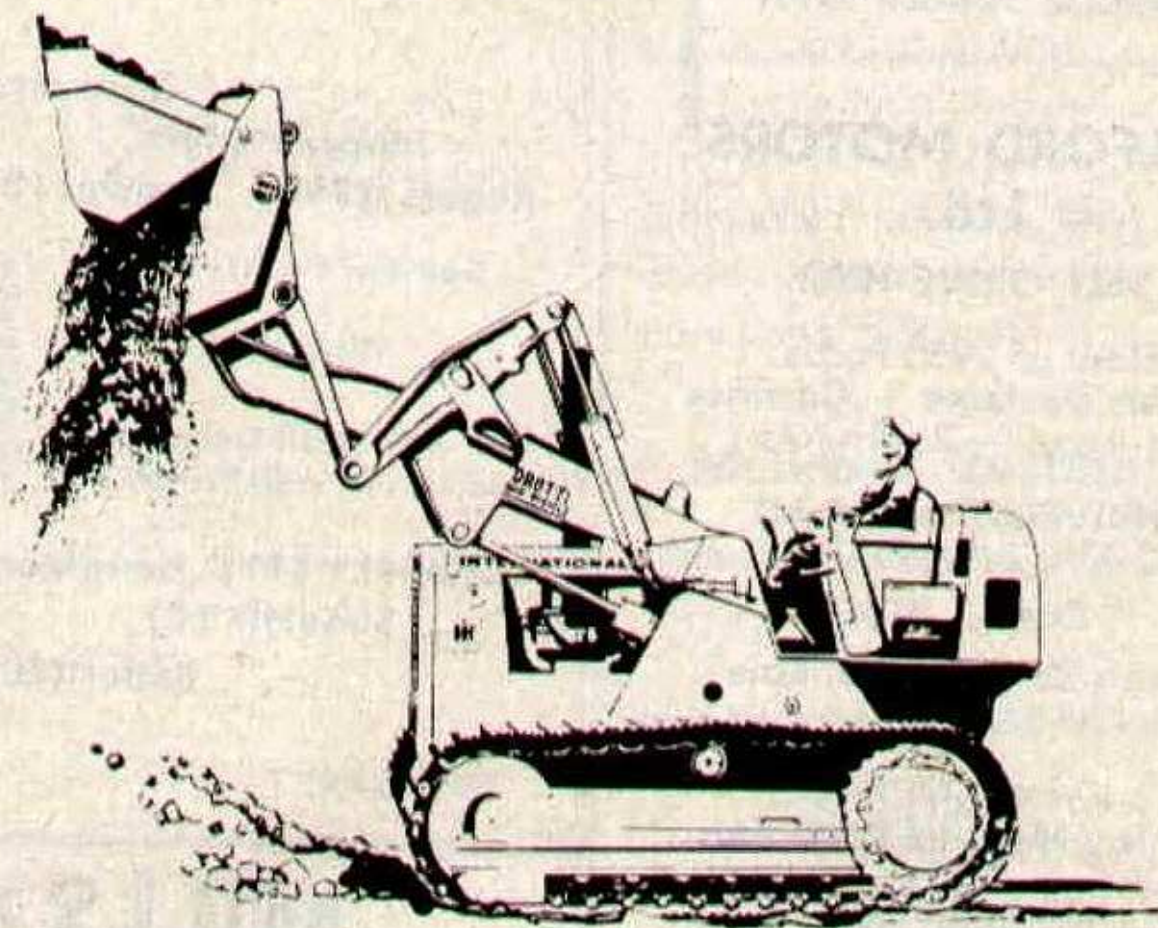

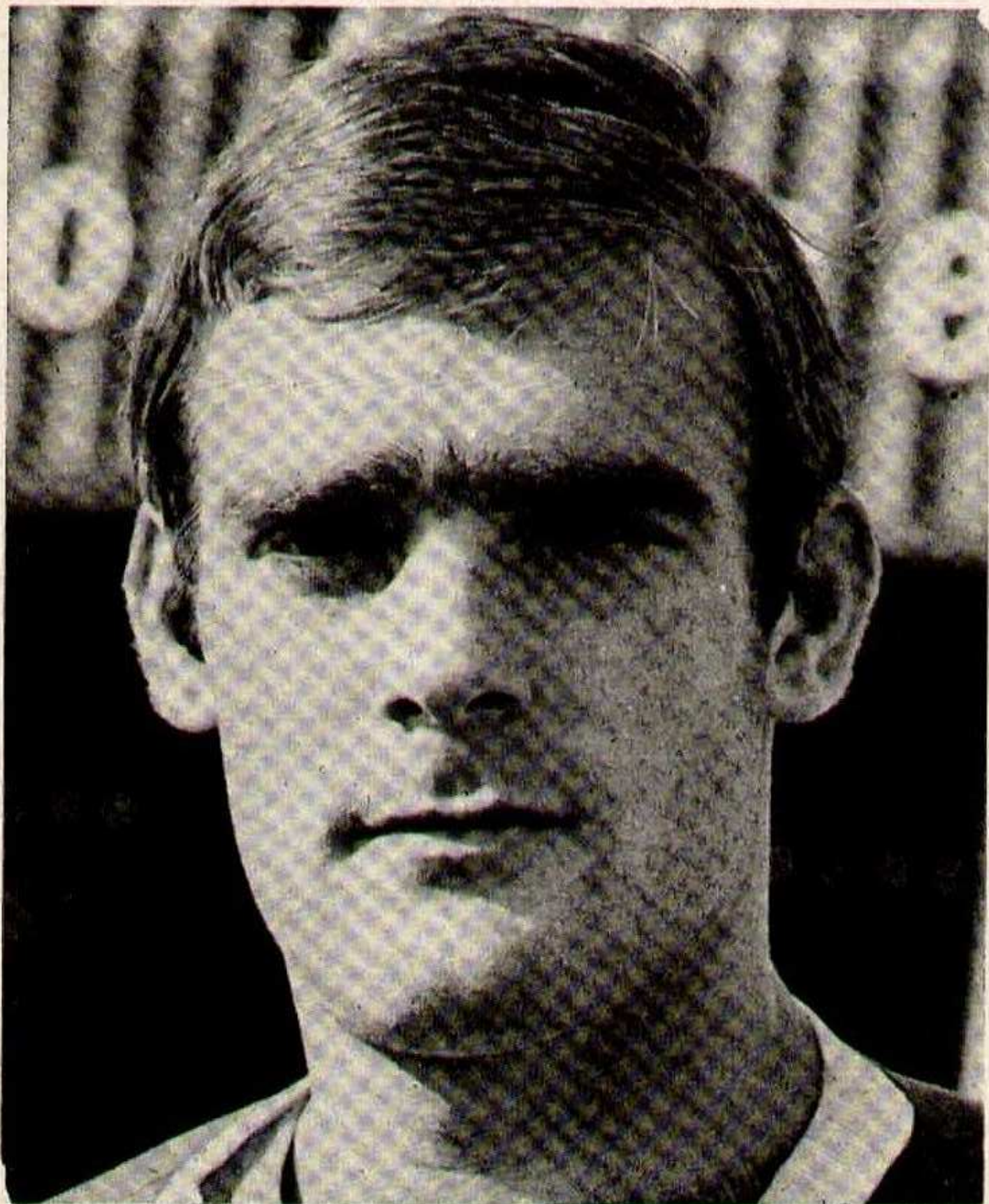
