CLUB NOTES

After the splendid win at Oxford, last Saturday's result was somewhat of a disappointment to the thirteen thousand spectators.

It was one of those occasions which makes football so unpredictable, and yet at the same time interesting. It was most frustrating to both players and spectators. Whilst Swindon enjoyed ninety per cent. of the play, it was soon obvious that things were not just going our way that day.

We lost the toss and so had to face a stiffish wind (which makes players very tired fighting against it), and we were also denied playing to our favourite end in the second half.

Swansea always looked dangerous during breakaways, and certainly played with determination and spirit. It is, however, a long time since we saw our defence so unsure. There was an element of luck about both our opponents' goals. The first came from a long goal-kick (why is it visiting 'keepers seem to be able to kick such lengths?), which was caught by a sudden gust, and swung over Mel Nurse's head. Even so, someone might have been covering, or chased back to harass Mc-Laughlin. The inside-left took his opportunity well and scored with an excellent shot. The second Swansea goal came from a lucky break. The ball ran just right for Allchurch from a rebound, and he seized his chance to score.

Whilst the result was not all we wished, the game itself was most entertaining and at times very thrilling. Shots headed off the line, crossbar hit, penalty missed, and, perhaps the most unusual thing of all, every Swansea player standing on his own goal line to defend an indirect free-kick.

The attendance was excellent (13,600), in spite of bad weather and International Rugby on the television programme.

Our supporters have been most loyal, but we certainly believe much is due to the fast, open attacking football, and the wonderful spirit shown by our team.

Last week, although many things went wrong, they kept pegging away — no moans, no grumbles, no arguments, no gamesmanship. Real hard grafting football — and goals. Just what the spectators want to see.

By winning 3—0 at Plymouth, the Reserves gave by far their best performance of the season. Here again, it was the fighting spirit and attacking football which produced this win. It now seems probable the Reserve team will preserve its place in the first division of the Combination. We sincerely hope so, as being in this division brings many famous clubs to the County Ground.

Many supporters feel it would be much better for the Club in general of all the Combination matches were played on Saturday afternoon, thus keeping continuity and the habit of watching football on Saturday. There is much to be said in favour of this argument, yet, strangely enough, our gates are bigger on Tuesday evening (often when it is cold and dark) than for those fixtures played on the Saturday afternoon. This fact, however, also applies to Third Division matches, but we do not think many would wish to see all our first team home games played on a Tuesday evening.

CHICK BRODIE (Goalkeeper)

One of the soundest 'keepers in the Division with fine positional sense. Only missed one game last season. Transferred in November 1963 from Northampton Town, with whom he won a Third Division Championship Medal.

GORDON PHILLIPS (Goalkeeper)

Former Junior who is only 19 but has already had Cup and League baptism. A fine future prospect.

ALAN HAWLEY (Right back)

A former Junior who was only 16 when he made his League debut in 1962 — Brentford's youngest-ever player. Has made steady progress and is now a first team regular.

ALLAN JONES (Left back)

Starting his third season at Griffin Park and has rarely been out of the side since transferring from Liverpool. Has been "watched" in past year by Welsh selectors.

MEL SCOTT (Half back)

Mel has been one of Brentford's best-ever captures and has been absent only twice since signing from Chelsea in March 1963. Skipper of the side and Supporters 'Player of the Year', Mel fills any defensive role with equal success.

WILLIE SMITH (Right back)

A Scot signed from Glasgow Celtic two years ago. After a year with the Reserves, came into the senior side for last 13 games of last season. A player with strong attacking flair.

PETER GELSON (Centre half)

Strong centre half of the old school who believes in preventing the opposing centre forward getting goal chances. A former Junior who missed only 4 games last season.

BILLY COBB (Left half)

An expensive purchase last season from Plymouth Argyle. Although signed as a left half, he spent much of last season at inside left and finished leading scorer with 18 goals. Had considerable First Division experience with Notts Forest.

MIKE BLOCK (Outside right)

Like Scott, transferred from neighbours Chelsea, who signed him as a Junior. Was elected 'Player of the Year' by Supporters after scoring 15 goals two years ago. Operates on either wing.

IAN LAWTHER (Centre forward)

Irish international who holds unusual distinction of being signed in House of Commons by Brentford's Chairman, Jack Dunnett, M.P. for Nottingham Central. Prolific goalscorer who previously assisted Scunthorpe, Blackburn Rovers and Sunderland.

TIM SOUTAR (Inside left)

Another former Junior who has one League game to his credit but has been making steady progress in the Combination side.

JOE GADSTON (Inside left)

A youngster hurriedly snapped up by Brentford after he had been released by West Ham. Has a good eye for the goal chance and was Reserves' leading scorer last season.

GEORGE THOMSON (Left half)

Signed from Everton in November 1963 as left back, but has also appeared at inside forward. A Scottish Under-23 international with Hearts.

JOHN DOCHERTY (Outside right)

In his second spell — rejoining the Club two months ago from Sheffield United. First signed by Brentford in 1959 from Scottish juniors, St. Rochs.

TOM HIGGINSON (Utility player)

Placed on transfer list at end of last season, but stayed on to win back place. Longest serving player having joined from Kilmarnock in 1959.

Get well soon, Frank, I'm not at all expert at this game.

It is with real regret that I have to record the recent death of one of our older and most respected Committee members — Joe Clements, of Maidstone Road. After many years of sterling service in our Club, he will be sorely missed. Many regular supporters will remember him dispensing cushions from the kiosk under the old stand, although he has had to take a much less active part over the last year. A floral tribute was sent on behalf of the Supporters' Club, and the funeral at Christ Church was attended by Miss B. Ranger, Mrs. L. Smith and Mr. D. Pearce, our Chairman. A short silence was observed at the Committee meeting on Monday last.

I cannot say that I am disappointed at the result of the cuptie with Coventry City. I still think that with a football pitch instead of an ice rink we would have won. Nevertheless, good luck to them in the next round. Our way is cleared for an uninterrupted and concentrated attack on promotion to Division II. Let's play around with a few figures for a moment. With 20 matches left to play, the last 7 league matches produced 8 points. On average, a further 24 points makes a total of 53 for the season. However, since Xmas, 5 matches produced 7 points, an average produces 28 points and a total of 57 points. Finally, the last 4 games produced 7 points, which on average would produce 35 points and a final total of 64 points, and that is normally promotion level.
