As Mansfield Town won at Swansea we did not rise in the League table but narrowed the gap between ourselves and our fellow relegation candidates. After the recent goal shy display of our forwards it is interesting to note that our front line got seven goals in a spell of just over an hour from the second half of the Oxford game to the first half of the Southend match with all five forwards scoring and Ian Lawther hitting an unusual hat-trick in 12 minutes. Today we face stiff opposition from Swindon Town. Our visitors were last here on 7th October, 1961, when a Johnny Rainford goal gave us a 1-0 victory. Only one survivor of our team that day is still on our staff. Our team then was Cakebread; Wilson, Gitsham; Higginson, Dargie, Coote; Rainford, Brooks, Francis, Edgley, McLeod.

#### PEN PICTURES

Swindon Town may be represented today by the following players:

JOHN TROLLOPE (left back). Born Swindon. A local boy who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of the Season 1960-61 when he was 16 years old, and was ever-present during that season and season 1961-62. Maximum appearances in the League side during 1962-63-64-65.

KEITH MORGAN (right half). Born Trowbridge. A strong attacking winghalf, who joined Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Made maximum appearances during 1962-3-4.

ROGER SMART (wing half). Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the Club direct from the Swindon Schoolboys' team. At 17 he made the centre-forward berth in the Reserve team his own, later converted to a wing-half.

OWEN DAWSON (full back). Born atfield. Signed from Portsmouth, Hatfield. June 1962. Was a former Youth International.

WILFRED SHERGOLD (forward). Born Swindon. Another product of the Swindon youth policy. He is fast and can play in almost any position in the forward line.

DONALD ROGERS (forward). Born Paulton. A much sought-after player. An England youth player who it seems is designed for further honours.

KEITH EAST (inside forward). Born Southampton. Signed from Portsmouth in the close season 1964. A strong, forceful player. He scored 20 goals in 26 games for the Club's reserve team which gained promotion to Division I of the Football Combination last season.

DENNIS BROWN (inside forward). Born Reading. Joined the Club from Chelsea for a very substantial fee in November 1964. A fast raiding insideforward he made several appearances at centre-forward last season.

ERIC WEAVER (forward). Born Rhymney. Played as an amateur with the Club and also Trowbridge Town in the Southern League. He joined Swindon as a professional in August 1965. A useful player in most positions in the forward line.

PETER DOWNSBOROUGH (goalkeeper). Signed at the commencement of the season from Halifax Town where he was a product of local football. A fearless, agile player, who has done much to strengthen the Town's defence.

MEL NURSE (centre-half). A recent signing from Middlesbrough. He needs little introduction to football followers. A strong forceful player. He has many Welsh International caps to his credit. His ability and experience has done much to strengthen the Town's defence.

Tom Curley who scored his first League goal for us against Southend was signed from Glasgow Celtic on a free transfer.

Southend United have failed to win here in 11 post-war Third Division games although they did win here 2-0 last season in the Football League Cup. On Monday next we go to Southend for the return game (k.o. 7.15 p.m.).

Ian Lawther has now reached double figures this season with 9 League and 1 League Cup goals.
