Owen Dawson (Right Back). Born Hatfield, Herts. and migrated from Portsmouth in

June, 1962. A Youth International. Height 5 ft. 10 ins. and weighs 11 st.

John Trollope (Left Back). Local boy joined ground staff from school. Made his debut in 1960 when he was 16 years of age. Ever present for five seasons. Height 5 ft. 10 ins. and weighs 11 st.

Keith Morgan (Right Half). Born Trowbridge. A strong, attacking wing half. Came to Swindon as a youth player from Westbury. Missed very few games since 1962. Height

Mel Nurse (Centre Half). Recently signed from Middlesborough and was with Swansea Town. Many times Capped for Wales. He is a native of Swansea. Height 6 ft. and weighs 12 st. 12 lbs.


