Good evening Ladies and Gentlemen, Boys and Girls.

First may I on behalf of the Directors, players and staff, of Peterborough United, wish all our supporters a very happy Christmas. Well, since our last home game, two away matches have been played, at Bournemouth and Doncaster. One point out of these two fixtures is anything but satisfactory, for it was the same old story over again, costly defensive lapses, and missed chances.

Now to the Bournemouth game, a game that we should have won, but had to be satisfied with one point. We created enough chances to come away with the two points, it was never an exciting game, in fact it was one of the duller games we have taken part in this season. Goal scorer — **JOHN MASON**.

At Doncaster last Saturday, bad defensive lapses allowed Doncaster to take a two goal lead in the first ten minutes. We pulled a goal back, making the score 2-1, then just on half time another defensive slip cost another goal. In the second half we had enough chances to pull the game out of the fire, Doncaster only making three or four raids into our half the whole of the second half. Goal Scorer: **J. BYRNE**.

The Reserves who have played three matches since our last programme have done quite well, especially in their last two match at London Road here, when they had four young amateurs in the side, beating Plymouth 3-2 and Leicester 3-2. On Monday evening in the Quarter Final of the Combination Cup, at White Hart Lane against 'Spurs' Reserves we lost 3-1. We could not say we were unlucky, for the Spurs deserved to win. They were winning 3-0 when we pulled a goal back, and then we had one or two chances, and might have got a draw out of it in the finish, but it would have been against the run of play had we done so.

The United Counties side also have not had the best of luck. They were knocked out of the F.A. Youth Challenge Cup competition by Norwich City, who were a more experienced, and physically stronger side, but still the youngsters gave a creditable performance. Credit must be given to them for they are holding their own in the United Counties League. It is late in the games when they are losing through heavy grounds, and physical strength, but I am sure they are gaining good experience which I am sure will hold them in good stead for the future. Results: Norwich at home, lost 1-0. Wisbech away, drew 3-3 and Bletchley away lost 4-2.

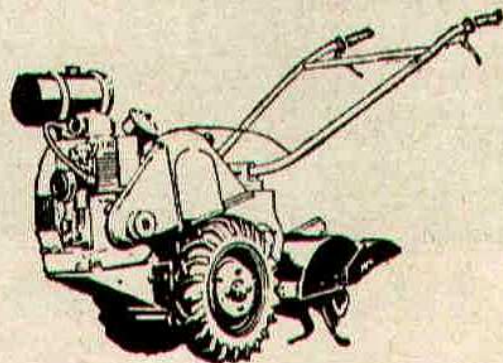
SUPPORTERS' CLUB NOTES

PEN PICTURES

TONY HICKS (goalkeeper). Born Swindon. He has been with Swindon for five years. He joined the club as a schoolboy and progressed through the ranks of the junior teams before becoming one of the three senior goalkeepers.

JOHN TROLLOPE (left-back). Born Swindon. Another local player who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of the 1960-61 season when he was just 16 years old, and was ever present during that season. A strong player who has proved his worth in a good defence.

MEL NURSE (centre-half). Signed from Middlesbrough at the beginning of last season. He is a strong forceful player and is an International with Wales. His ability and experience has done much to strengthen the team's defence.

STAN HARLAND (left-half). Born Liverpool. Signed during close season from Carlisle United. He is a forceful player and is able to go forward to back up the forwards in attack.

ROGER SMART (inside-right). Born Swindon. Another local born player who joined the club direct from Swindon Schoolboys team. At 17 he was appearing regularly at centre-forward in the reserve team, but he excels as a deep lying inside-forward or wing-half.

DENNIS BROWN (inside-left). Born Reading. Joined the club from Chelsea for a very large fee in November 1964. A fast inside-forward with a deadly shot.

DONALD ROGERS (outside-left). Born Paulton. A player of outstanding ability. He has long been the target for many of the English First Division Clubs. He has played for England Youth Team and also the England Under 23 XI.

JOE BUTLER (full-back). Born Newcastle. Joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August, 1965. A tenacious player whose speed and ability amply makes up for his lack of inches. He joined the club's Junior Team and graduated to the senior ranks before joining the Town.

ROD THOMAS (full-back). Born Glyncoerrwg. A former youth player with the club, whose speed and strength has made him a reliable defender. Made his debut in the First Team last season.

BRUCE WALKER (outside-left). Born Westwood Lay. Joined Swindon from County football. Though he is not a big player his ability and speed makes him a menace to any defence.
