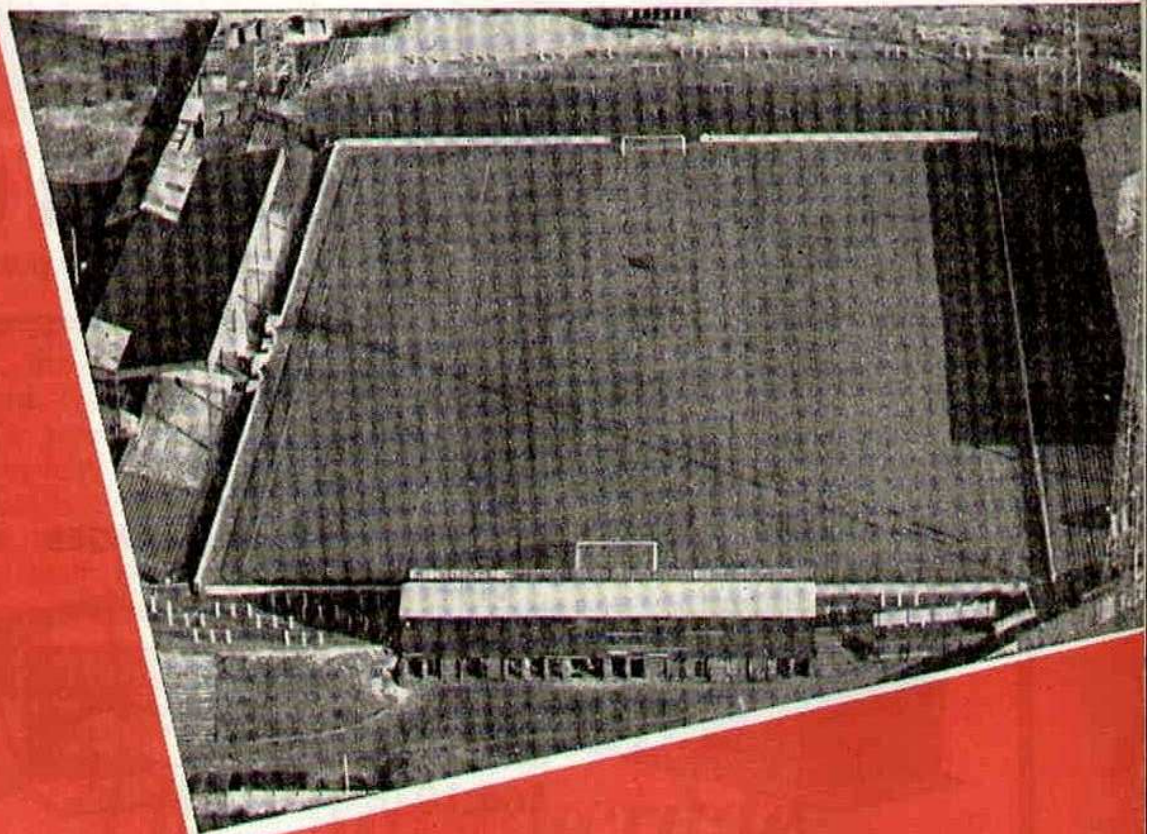

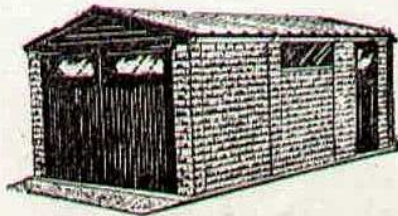

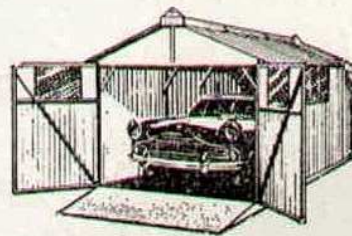

The Rovers visit to Watford again failed to improve our away record but it must be said that the score did not reflect the play. Keith Webber scored a splendid goal to equalise an early score by the homesters but Watford were soon back in front. The second half was strenuously fought but the third goal to Watford was the subject of strong protests by our team and this was the turning point of the game. Despite our forwards efforts, a packed defence gave them little scope although one shot was cleared off the line. Only five goals had been scored against our opponents at Vicarage Road prior to this game and there is no doubt but that they are masters in defence.

The Reserves won their third game of the four Knock-out Cup ties played to date and Rotherham United, who fielded a strong eleven, were again the victims by three clear goals, Leigh (2) and Gray scoring. It was an excellent game and our young side played some grand football.

Last weekend Martin Ferguson, who joined us last summer from Barnsley, left the Club, the contract being cancelled by mutual consent. We understand he is returning to Scotland.

OUR VISITORS

Welcome once again to our visitors from Swindon; this being the fourth meeting of the teams this season. Noted Cup fighters, it will be remembered that they drew at Belle Vue in the Football League Cup earlier in the season and won the replay at Swindon by 4-2, after a really hard tie. In this competition they had already defeated Portsmouth but their high-light was twelve days ago when they defeated West Ham United in a Third Round replay of the F.A. Cup, after drawing at Upton Park. They now meet Bury at Swindon in the 4th Round. On the evening they met West Ham they had a fine attendance of 25,789, but this was not their record "gate," this being, curiously enough, three years ago exactly, when they met West Ham previously in the F.A. Cup; the attendance then being 28,582. The Rovers only League win away this season was at Swindon, but our visitors away record is wins at Bournemouth and Peterborough; draws at Brighton, Oxford and Walsall and defeats at Bristol, Colchester, Darlington, Gillingham, Middlesbrough, Queens Park, Reading and Watford. Here are pen pictures of their players:-

HICKS, TONY (Goal) - Has been with Swindon for five years. Joined the club as a schoolboy and progressed through the ranks of the junior teams before becoming first team goalkeeper.

THOMAS, ROD (Right back) - A former youth player with the club, whose speed and strength has made him a reliable defender. Made his first team debut last season.

TROLLOPE, JOHN (Left back) - A local player who joined the ground staff from school. Was selected for the first team at the beginning of the 1960/61 season when he was 16 years old, and has been a regular player since.

MORGAN, KEITH (Right half) - A tall fast attacking player who also progressed through the club's junior teams. Has been a regular player for the Town's first team.

NURSE, MEL (Centre half) - Signed from Middlesbrough at the beginning of last season. A strong forceful player and is an International with Wales.

HARLAND, STAN (Left half) - Signed during the close season from Carlisle. He is a forceful player and is able to go forward to back up the forwards in attack.

BROWN, DENNIS (Outside right) - Joined Swindon from Chelsea for a very large fee in November, 1964.

PENMAN, WILLIE (Inside right) - Transferred from Newcastle United during the current season.

SKEEN, KEN (Centre forward) - Played originally as an amateur for Swindon, but subsequently joined Trowbridge Town and rejoined Swindon as a professional in September, 1964.

SMART, ROGER (Inside left) - Another local born player who joined the club direct from the Swindon Schoolboy's team. At 17 he was appearing regularly at centre forward in the reserve team.

ROGERS, DONALD (Outside left) - A player of outstanding ability. He has long been the target of many of the English First Division Clubs. Has played for England Youth Team and England under-23's.

BUTLER, JOE (Substitute) - Joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August, 1965.

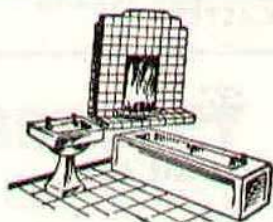
