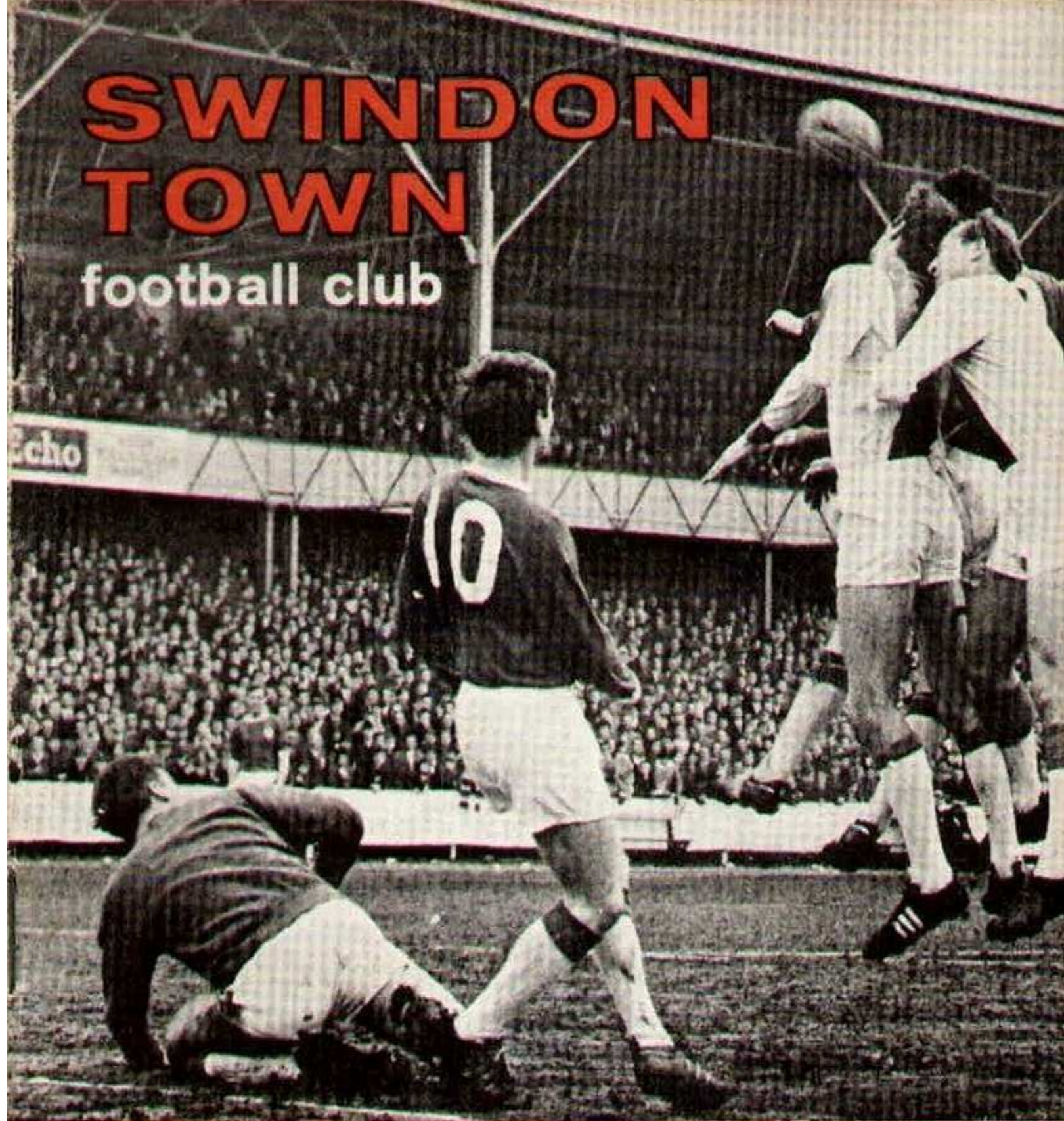

NEWS and VIEWS

We are still fighting to retain our league status. After all the excitement and glamour of cup football, right back to our very existence, league football, the life-blood of every club. At the time of writing we are in 4th position from bottom—those dreaded four places. Two points, gained at Grimsby (if only) would make a great difference. Would certainly relieve the tension at the next two home games. We cannot count too much on points from Grimsby as they themselves are very near the danger zone.

The game today and next Tuesday could have a great bearing on our position. The manager, Mr. Williams, has set a target of 40 points. Including today's game we have 6 home matches, and 4 away, remaining to be played. If we win the home games, we should finish with a total of 43 points (assuming we gained no points at Grimsby). One big factor in our favour is our goal average, still on the right side, more goals for than against. We have to go many places up the table to find a team in such a favourable position regarding goal average.

Points will be difficult to obtain as we face strong opposition even at home.

Our opponents today are enjoying a very good season and have conceded only 45 goals. The defence obviously is very strong, but the attack has scored 45 goals. The match could be a battle of defences, since Swindon has scored few goals in recent games. Earlier this season, we lost at Gillingham by the only goal scored (a penalty) when we were enjoying our best run for several weeks, having drawn 1—1 at Walsall, beaten

Swansea 4—0 (at home), won 4—1 at Bournemouth, and defeated Leyton Orient 5—1. After the burst of scoring on our part the defeat by one goal was most disappointing. The team on that occasion was Downsborough; Thomas, Trollope; Smart, Nurse, Harland; Rogers, Brown, Penman, Butler, Walker.

Gillingham has always been one of our “bogey teams” at the County Ground. Last season they won 1 goal to 0, and in the return game played on 1st January, they again defeated us by 1 goal to 0. To date then all three games have resulted in a 1—0 win by our opponents. Should today's score be 1—0 we trust it will be in our favour, but we earnestly hope for more goals. They have been very scarce at the County Ground of late.

Prior to that game, the last time the two clubs met was in Season 1957-58 the very last year of the Division III (South). Gillingham unfortunately finished in the lower half of the Division, and thus became a Division IV team for season 1958-59.

Other clubs, who became members of the new Division IV were Crystal Palace, Coventry City, Carlisle United, Watford, Millwall and Walsall. Much has happened in eight seasons. It certainly is not the end of the road for clubs in Division IV, as the names above prove. The results for season 1957-58 were: Swindon 1 Gillingham 1; Gillingham 2 Swindon 0.

Not a glut of goals and you notice Gillingham again took more than their fair share of the points. It is up to us to break the spell.

We print below an item which appeared in the "Football League Review". I wonder how many many of us does it refer to, how many are stated in the extract!

"Nobody likes to be told how to do his job—and certainly not from an outsider. Yet everybody tells a footballer how to do his. I'm pretty sure I couldn't do your job and I don't suppose you could do mine. Yet none of us has any hesitation in telling a footballer how to do his. When you think of it, it's funny isn't it. It's the same with barracking. You're not really doing much good. I know most of it is done through sheer misery, but it doesn't help the players when they're feeling down-hearted, and cheesed-off themselves, to have a lot of loud voices giving them the bird. But as one international footballer told us, They've paid their money, so I suppose they feel entitled to jeer if they're not happy with us. As entertainers we have to put up with it."

Be that as it may. Barracking certainly does not help in any way. That, however, is not as bad as hooliganism, which unfortunately is creeping into the game. Thank goodness, we in Swindon have not suffered in that way. We fear sometimes when crowds invade the pitch after the game. May we appeal once again most strongly. "Please **do not cross** the playing surface after the game, please leave by the proper exit. The ring-side seats can cause some disturbance, but we ask all who occupy those places not to move until the final whistle. Thank you."

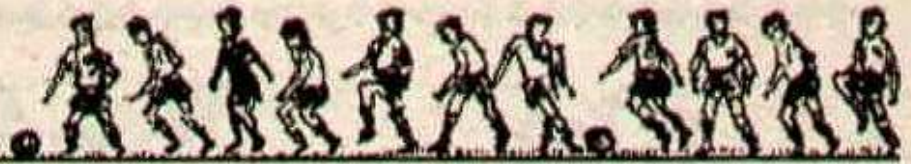

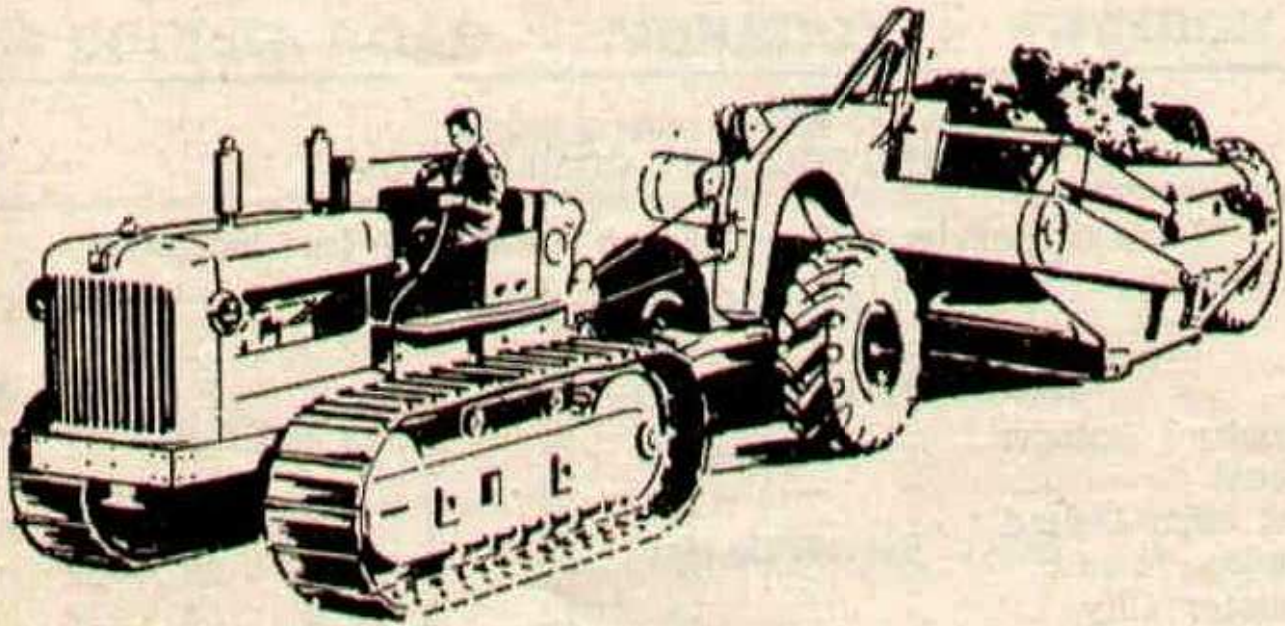
