Today we stand in tenth position. Our highest place for a long time. While we are not quite definitely safe, it now appears we need not fear relegation. In fact, if we continue with this fine winning sequence, we shall finish higher in the league than last season. The team has certainly hit top form. To win five consecutive games is good going by any standards. There seems little doubt that but for our poor showings in the league games following Christmas we should be challenging for promotion, instead of fearing relegation.

This season, has been one of varying fortunes, or lapses of form. After our first two games, one draw and one win (4—0) we went from 27th August until 22nd October without a victory. In fact we only gained three points from three draws. We defeated Swansea 4—0, and followed that by probably our best game of the season, a win at Bournemouth 4—1. So we continued, gaining points almost every game right up to 26th December, when we defeated Peterborough 4—1. After that date our next six games resulted in six defeats, and the league position became serious, almost desperate.

Fortunately in the midst of our three fine games against Nottingham Forest, we began a second return to form, with a draw at Swansea. Our last twelve games have produced nineteen points, and we have lost only one of those games. One might easily say—Promotion Football.

We have frequently referred to the outstanding support we enjoy. All the party that made the long journey to Workington must have realised, what a great asset to any team, a full ground can be. Terraces seemed deserted with wide open spaces. Total attendance, 1,611 spectators. How can the home

club continue? as they have to pay Swindon £100, for last Saturdays game. Compare the attendance with that at our Reserve match—2,675.

Our visitors today revive memories of 26th August, 1963, when we played our first game in Division II. We won that match by 3 goals to nil but in the return encounter at Scunthorpe on 14th December, the result was completely reversed, the home team winning by 3 goals to nil.

At the time of that game, Swindon, after a brilliant start occupied 5th position in the league table with 29 points from 25 games, while Scunthorpe was bottom but one, with 15 points from 22 games, and unfortunately were relegated at the end of Season 1963-64.

Scunthorpe are comparative newcomers to league football, in fact it was in 1950 they were elected to Division III (North). Eight years later at the end of Season 1957-58 they gained promotion to Division II with a total of 66 points from 46 matches. They remained in this division until 1964.

Last season 1965-66 we were defeated 1—2 at Scunthorpe on Saturday, 11th December, 1965, the week after our fine cup win at Grantham by 6 goals to 1. This defeat ended a long run of high scoring games. In this match, the teams enjoyed a second break, as the lights failed due to an electrical fault. This seemed to give renewed energy to our opponents as they quickly scored two goals. Swindon's team — Downsborough; Dawson, Trollope; Morgan, Nurse, Shergold; Weaver, Brown, East, Smart, Rogers.

The return game was played on the 7th May, 1966, before a gate of 9,071 spectators. It was very much an end of the season game, no goals being scored. This year both teams need points, so we are certain to witness a keen game.

It seems amazing that in such an important match as the England v. Scotland International substitutes were not allowed. The injury to Charlton, disorganised the whole England team. When almost every other competition allows one substitute for an injured player we have a game played before an attendance of 100,000, spoiled as a spectacle. It is unfair to the player to try to continue (he could do untold harm to himself), and it is certainly not fair to the huge crowd which has paid something above 10 shillings each to witness an International game.

One wonders what is going to happen to our great National Game. Even in a First class Internation game we see players kicking the ball away, standing on the ball, and displaying gamesmanship in many ways. Such incidents do not help the image of the game. Very low in some peoples minds due to unpleasant incidents.

The scene at Wembly after the game did not create much goodwill. It is amazing to see people behave in such a manner, and makes one wonder sometimes if it is worth while to be associated with the game.




