職NEWS and VIEWS 語

Today we play our last home game of the season. A very eventful season, and in many ways one of the most exciting and entertaining for a long long time.

Certainly one of varying fortunes. On the 8th October, 1966, we were in bottom position having gained only 4 points from 9 games, and the goal average of 11 for and 16 against.

On the 5th January, 1967, we were fifteenth in the league table, with 22 points from 23 games, and a goal record of 44 for and 34 against. So the 14 games from 8th October to 5th January produced 18 points and 33 goals scored. During that period we lost only two games 0—1 away to Gillingham, on the 12th November, 1966, and 1—2 at Darlington on the 31st December, 1966.

Then came 5 league defeats in succession, and on 25th February, 1967, we were in the danger zone, in third place from the bottom with the following record, played 28; goals for 45, against 42; points 22. So compared with the position on the 5th January, we had not obtained another point, scored only one goal and had 8 scored against us. That figure in itself is quite good, considering 5 defeats. Nevertheless, the outlook was rather poor.

Yet during this latter period, we enjoyed one of our finest "cup-runs" ever, certainly the most famous. Swindon Town was talked of wherever football was played. Known throughout the country, not only for the fighting spirit, but the football displayed. Some of our games were the absolute high-

light of television seen and admired in all Britain.

Still in the minds of many of us there still persisted the

nagging fear of relegation.

With our final exit from the F.A. Cup at Villa Park in a second replay of the 5th Round on 20th March, 1967, we

just wondered what would happen-would there be a reaction after all the noise and glamour of the Cup? No, not a bit of it, our lads helped by the wonderful team spirit at the County Ground, from the manager down set about the job of rehabilitation, and improving our league position. Actually we played 15 games and lost only two, 1—3 at Shrewsbury, on 25th February and 0—1 at Torquay on 27th March, 1967.

Today, 4th May, 1967, we are tenth in League table having played 44 games and gained 45 points. Goals for 76, against 58. This was surely our finest hour, the peak period because from 25th February to 1st May, we played 15 games, gained 23 points, scored 33 goals and had 17 scored against

us. What is more we played some great football.

Why have we had such a feast of football, interspersed with two blue patches? Certainly our players are fit. They must be to have lasted such an exhausting season having played 44 Division III games, 5 League Cup and 8 F.A. Cup games. No team has outplayed us, no team is as fast or such runners as Swindon. No team lasts the full ninety minutes better. Surely a great tribute to the manager, his training schedule; and his assistants. Many work in the background, and are never in the limelight but contribute much to the success of a club. This season, we owe much to our new doctor, (probably the most enthusiastic supporter we have) for his service and attention. Whenever possible, although he is a very busy man, he has travelled with the team to away games. This has not only given the side greater confidence, but immediate and correct medical advice has helped considerably in keeping our players fit. Many others help in the smooth running of the club, the organization of the third and fourth team. Often players have to be found almost at the last minute for either of these sides. One man in particular, Eddie Buckley must have driven hundreds of miles, to help

BRIAN SHERRATT (Goalkeeper)

An injury to regular choice Jim Barron in January this year resulted in another opportunity for Brian to take over between the sticks. And his form has kept him in favour ever since. The 23-year-old 'keeper signed from Stoke City in 1965 but Barron's arrival in March 1966 temporarily cut short his first team career after eleven games. Born in Stoke. 5ft. 11ins, and 11st. 8lbs.

CYRIL BEAVON (Full back)

Now playing his eighth season with the club and since their entry into the League has never made less than 40 appearances—in fact has only missed nine League matches over the last four years. Launched his career with Wolverhampton Wanderers. Born in Barnsley 29 years ago. 5ft. 10ins., 11st. 9lbs.

JOHNNY LLOYD (Full back)

Started with the club on a month's trial in October 1964 after being on Swindon Town's payroll. Introduced to the first team last season when he had one dozen games and has developed so well this season that he is now automatic choice. He's 23.

RODNEY SMITHSON (Half back)

Due to positional changes in the side caused through injuries his first team chance has arisen at wing-half. Following his capture from Arsenal in 1964 he had been patiently understudying skipper Atkinson, although he did fit in a debut appearance in 1965-66. Rodney is 24.

MAURICE KYLE (Centre half)

Like the club skipper he is another member of the old brigade, having been at Oxford since 1959. Also made his soccer start with Wolverhampton Wanderers. Was absent from only one League match during the club's 1964-65 promotion year from the Fourth-Division. A native of Darlington, he's 6ft. and 12st. 8lbs.

RON ATKINSON (Half back)

Club skipper and has been the driving force in the team ever since his signing from Aston Villa in 1959. In the previous two seasons he never missed a match, He's a bulkily built player but has proved this is no handicap to his mobility. From Liverpool, he's a six-footer and 13st. 9lbs.

MICHAEL MORRIS (Winger)

Age 22. Only his second full season as a regular first team selection. Previously an amateur with Faversham Town. His untiring energy sometimes bewilders his own team-mates.

JOHN EVANSON (Half back)

Began as an amateur in 1964 after his form with Towcester in the Northamptonshire League had rated careful attention. Switched to pro' the following year and this is his first season to make the League grade.

KEN HALE (Inside forward)

Signed from Coventry City in March 1966, completing 18 League games for United last term and these produced nine goals. He was also with Newcastle United, and he is a north-easterner from Blyth. Will most likely finish the season as the club's leading goal-scorer. 5ft. 64ins., 11st. 2lbs.

GRAHAM ATKINSON (Centre forward)

Younger brother of the wing-half, he arrived at the Manor Ground one year later from another Midland's club, Birmingham City. He's 23 years old-four years younger than Ron and he became a first team regular last winter, missing only one match. In fact, he was leading marksman with 19 goals. Is 5ft, 10ins.

TONY JONES (Inside forward)
Holds the clubs' goal-scoring record. Another capture from Birmingham City and also a member of the club's long-serving group of players-he joined them in 1959. Made all the appearances in 1964-65, the promotion year, and was also ever-present in 1963-64. Aged 29, he's Birmingham-born and 6ft., 11st. 6lbs.

COLIN HARRINGTON (Winger)

The family tradition of sprint training and athletics undoubtedly makes 23-year old Colin the fastest player on the club's books. Spotted while playing for Wolverhampton Wanderers, his transfer was clinched in 1962. He has commanded a fairly regular place ever since. From Bicester, another six-footer in the side and 12st 6lbs.

COLIN CLARKE (Half back)

Has had limited opportunity for first team games due to the regular choice of Jones. Stepped into the side on three occasions last season, his first games for the club. Was on Arsenal's books until 1965. Aged 20, hails from Penilee, G.W. 6ft. 1in., 11st. 10 lbs.






