CLUB NEWS AND NOTES

This afternoon we give a warm welcome to the Directors, Officials and Players of the Swindon Town Football Club, our visitors for today's Football League fixture. Since Swindon were relegated from Division Two at the end of the 1964-65 season we have met five times in the two previous seasons. Swindon have completed the double over us, but this bad record was broken when we picked up a point at Swindon this season as a result of 0-0 draw. In the 1962/63 season when Swindon won promotion to the Second Division we did the double over them, winning 3-1 at London Road and 3-2 at Swindon. With these records in mind we can look forward to a good, hard, entertaining game today.

The club have received a letter of thanks from Mrs. Martin expressing her thanks and gratitude to all the supporters at Peterborough for the cheque for £154, received as a result of the collection taken for Freddy Martin. Hopes that we would play a friendly match v. Nottingham Forest have not materialised, but we are pleased to note that the Nottingham Forest Club have decided to send a donation to Freddy.

Last Saturday our first team travelled to Shrewsbury who lay third in the league table, and put in a very good performance to earn a point as a result of the 1-1 all draw. Graham Ricketts netted our goal, his first for the club, for which we didn't have to wait long. This was a good all-round effort against very strong opposition, and we are now only 4 points

behind Shrewsbury who are still third in the league table.

On Monday evening we entertained Corby Town in the Semi-final of the Northants. Senior Cup and won through to the Final by winning 1-0. Our goal came as a result of good work by Stuart Brace whose centre was turned into his own goal by a defender.

Our Reserves played second in the table Birmingham City in a Football Combination game last Saturday and went down 1-0.

The drastic drop in attendances is causing great concern and it is with regret that we note that in the four home league fixtures played at London Road since the F.A. Cup tie v. Portsmouth only 2,190 more fans have watched these league games than we had turn up for the one Cup Match. Now is the time that our supporters should be rallying round the club and if the gates for our remaining home league games, inclusive of today's, fails to get back to around the 7,000 average, we can estimate an additional loss of some £2,000 extra before the end of the season. At a time when our losses are already causing grave concern it is essential that our supporters do not let us down further.

Our next League fixture at London Road is v. Torquay, the League leaders, on Saturday, April 6th, and we hope that this attractive fixture will pull in the crowd it deserves.

SWINDON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

OWEN DAWSON (right back). Born Hatfield. Joined the club from Portsmouth in June 1962. He was a regular first team player until he was unlucky to lose his place through injury. A fast tenacious player. He was a former Youth International. Height 5ft. 10ins. Weight 11st.

JOHN TROLLOPE (left back). Born Swindon. A local player who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. He was selected for the first team at the beginning of the 1960/61 season when he was just 16 years old, and was ever present during that season. Together with his partner that year, who was also 16, they were the youngest full backs ever to appear as a pair in League football. During last season he celebrated 300 consecutive League appearances for the club. Height 5ft. 10ins. Weight 11st.

ROD THOMAS (full back). Born Glyncorrwg. A former youth player with the club. He was signed from Gloucester City in July 1964. Took over the full back position last season when Owen Dawson was injured, and maintained his position throughout the season. Last year was a successful one for this player as he gained a Welsh Under-23 Cap against Scotland, and also a full Welsh Cap against Ireland. Height 6ft. 1in. Weight 12st.

MEL NURSE (centre-half). Born Swansea. Signed from Middlesbrough in August 1965. He played for Wales 12 times, gaining 9 of his Caps while with Swansea Town where he did 7 years service before being transferred to Middlesbrough in September 1962. His ability and experience has done much to strengthen the Town's defence. Height 6ft. 0½in. Weight 12st. 12lbs.

JOE BUTLER (full back). Born Newcastle. Joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August 1965 where he graduated to the senior ranks through the club's Junior Team. A tenacious player whose speed and ability amply

make up for his lack of inches. Height 5ft. 7½ins. Weight 9st. 13lbs.

STAN HARLAND (left half). Born Liverpool. Was signed from Carlisle United in July 1966. Formerly with Everton and Bradford City. He has been a regular choice at left-half since making his debut at the beginning of the 1966/67 season. A forceful player who likes to go forward to back up the forwards in attack. Height 6ft. Weight 12st. 7lbs.

BOBBY JONES (outside left). Born Bristol. A West Country man who commenced his career with Birmingham City and joined Bristol Rovers while still a young player. He was formerly a member of the successful Bristol Rovers team and was signed by Swindon from Northampton when D. Brown joined that club. Height 5ft. 8ins. Weight 12st. 7lbs.

WILLIE PENMAN (inside forward). Born Wemyss, Fife. Signed from Newcastle United in September, 1966, for a considerable fee. Formerly with Glasgow Rangers. A clever ball playing inside forward who has also appeared at centre-forward with the club. Height 5ft. 8ins. Weight 11st. 7lbs.

DON ROGERS (outside right or left). Born Paulton. Probably the most sought after player in the team. He was signed by Swindon when only 15 and quickly came to the fore. Gained many England Youth International Caps and subsequently played in the England Under-23 International team. Was the club's top goal scorer last season with 33 goals.

PAT TERRY (centre forward). Born Lambeth. Signed last season from Reading where he was the leading goal scorer. Prior to this he played for Charlton, Swansea, Gillingham, Northampton and Millwall. A forceful leader who is particularly dangerous in the air. Height 5ft. 9½ins. Weight 12st. 6lbs.

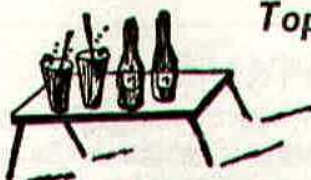
