NEWS and VIEWS

Today we begin our season of League football. Our opening game last year, on 19th August against Brighton, resulted in a victory by two goals (Terry, Rogers) to one (Livesey), and attracted a gate of 15,790.

The game itself was not a good one, as both teams seemed to be feeling their way. The Swindon team was:

Downsborough; Thomas, Trollope; Harper, Nurse, Harland; Lowes, Penman, Terry, Smart, Rogers.

Unfortunately the New Stand project has had to be shelved for another year, but the matter will soon become urgent as the renewal of the insurance becomes more difficult each season.

The standard of football seems to be coming much more on a par, with quite a levelling of ability between the leagues. It would appear many matches will be evenly contested this season, and possibly low scoring. Did you notice the number of draws and small scores on Saturday last?

Defences are becoming much tighter with four defenders in the back row, and forwards are finding it much more difficult to break through. We only hope Swindon can get on the goal scoring standard very quickly. It's goals the spectators want. Clubs tend to play a little more open, but still goals are difficult to come by.

Our visitors, Stockport County, were strong candidates for promotion at one period last season, but like ourselves faded towards the end.

We played them on 25th August at Stockport — our third game of the season. Result — a defeat, 0—2. The return on 19th December was the beginning of our Christmas programme. It was played in the evening and was a most entertaining game.

A splendid lad and a great trier was Dennis — a credit to football both on and off the field. Our former captain, Mel Nurse, is now Swansea Town's centre-half, and our old friend Frank Large is still

hitting the headlines. This time a transfer to Fulham, at a fee estimated at £50,000. Swindon would have settled for half that amount. It is amazing the number of deals in which he has been involved without ever asking for a transfer. He must have gained financially, but he deserves it. A great club man, and one of the best.

One final note, and a very sad one. We have lost two (at least) of our finest supporters. Mr. Smith, of Avenue Road, a great worker (along with his wife) for the Supporters' Club. They were both members when that Club was first formed, and have worked indefatiguably ever since. We just cannot afford to lose men like this. Apart from his work with the Supporters' Club Mr. Smith, with his brother, was responsible for all the painting on the Club property. "Georgie" Cross, of Birch Street, also died in the close season. A most loyal supporter, and a great worker for the Club. We extend our deepest sympathy to the relatives of both these men, and hope especially, that Mrs. Smith will continue to work for the Club.



SUPPORTERS CLUB NOTES

I am sure all supporters would like to congratulate the lads on the win against Torquay United last Tuesday evening—the first round of the League Cup. We have seen, in the practice matches, goals galore, and of no mean accomplishment. Roger Smart's first goal of the season proper, I feel, was of the same high standard. Peter Noble's was a classic example of a goal coming from the follow-up in the middle when the ball appeared to be going out of play. Both were the result of teamwork, and this is the outstanding point to me—one which augers well in the future.

During the summer close season, in discussions with the Board, the problem of programme distribution was much to the front. Printing costs are always rising. Estimation of the number required is always a difficult point. It seemed that late comers in the stands — normally season ticket holders, because their seats were reserved — often couldn't get a programme, either because of the rush to get in, or because of a sell out. In an attempt to solve this, as far as possible, stand habituees will now find — at least for a reasonable trial period — one of Mrs. Tanner's attractive young ladies in each bay, with programmes. The idea is a more personal service. The Supporters' Club has found, from experience, that supporters tend to go to one person for their programme - probably because they know where to go, each match - with a strong possibility of getting one. It would help, very much, if the stand supporters would get into the habit of getting programmes from the young lady in their own particular block. The experiment will be closely watched.
