We often mention the "ups and downs" of football. One minute a team is on top of the world, and the next in the doldrums. Most clubs seem to go through the cycle, not exactly seven lean years, followed by seven fat years but, more often than not, a good season followed by a bad one.

A week ago we drew 1—1 at Shrewsbury, and that left them in bottom place with twenty-seven points from thirty-six games, yet only at the end of last season they missed promotion to Division II by one point. The final positions in Division III 1967/68 were as follows:

Notice their splendid defensive record, they lost only eight games out of a total of forty-six. To date they are striving to escape relegation with the following record: played 39; won 11; drew 7; lost 21; goals for 44, against 66; points 29.

So obviously they will be anxious to gain points tonight. We won at Crewe on Good Friday by two goals to one, but most of our supporters present at that game will agree we were a little fortunate to gain both points. Still that is football, when you are on top the ball seems to run well, and when a team is struggling the odds seem to go against them.

Crewe has never hit the high spots, although it was one of the original members of League Division II on its formation in 1892. Like Swindon, it is a railway town (or rather, should we say, was) and also like us play in red shirts and white shorts.

Until this season Crewe has spent most of its football life in Division III (North) and now Division 4. It has a struggle on its hands to escape relegation back to Division 4. We wish them every success in their endeavours (after tonight of course). It would be hard indeed to return after only one season in a higher league.

Crewe's geographical position, just north of the Midlands soccer hot-bed — Stoke, Port Vale, Derby, etc. — creates difficulties in the way of attracting large gates. We are bound to admire those responsible for running the club. They are certainly very dedicated men. It must be one long struggle, just a fight for existence.

Good news this week. Swindon has again been awarded the

John White prize for crowd behaviour. The Final at Wembley was mainly responsible for this. The authorities, and the League officials, were greatly impressed by the forty thousand Swindon supporters. Well done indeed, but I'm afraid this award would not have been given on the last two home games. Whether or not they were our supporters is hard to tell, but the incidents behind the Town End goal at those matches, has certainly marred the good name of Swindon supporters. We can only hope this unfortunate business has now ended. The police have certainly been kept most busy.

Good news again, however. We note with great pleasure the success of Swindon Boys at Newcastle. To win the semi-final by three goals to one was a great achievement. The Final, which is played on a home and away basis, cannot be arranged for the other finalist is not yet known. Liverpool and Barnsley play at Oakwell on Tuesday next. Should Liverpool win, their home leg will be played at Anfield (home of Liverpool F.C.). This should provide a great thrill for our boys, but St. James Park, Newcastle is almost as large. It is safe to assume our home leg will be played on the County Ground. It will no doubt draw a very large gate, and provide Swindon supporters with vet another outstanding match. What a wonderful season for the Town. Already the senior team has won the League Cup, and hope most earnestly for promotion. Now another Cup Final at least, with high hopes of more honour-winners. What a boost for football in Swindon if the "hat-trick" is completed.

After tonight's game, we have two more home matches — Mansfield Town next Tuesday and Barrow Tuesday, 6th May. May the promotion issue be settled by the time we play the latter fixture.

WILLIE MAILEY

Born Glasgow. A former Scottish Schoolboy International who started his league career with Everton, and joined the Crewe staff on March 15th, 1963. Although on the small side, he makes up for his lack of inches by his agility and daring. A most consistent performer who made maximum appearances last season with a total of 186 first team appearances to date.

PETER LEIGH



HALF-BACKS STEVE ARNOLD

Was spotted playing for Cheshire Schoolboys and was signed in the face of keen competition. A young player still to make his first team debut but he is a regular member of the reserve side either at wing-half or outside-left.

ERIC BARNES

The longest serving member of the staff. After amateur service he signed professional and made his debut in the 1957/58 season. During last season he broke the club record of league appearances which had stood for 30 years. Although mostly appearing at centre-half he has also played at wing-half and full-back. A keen sportsman, is a league cricketer and a fair golfer. 346 first team games to date.

ALAN BRADSHAW

Born Blackburn. A schoolteacher by profession and a part-time player, now starting his fourth season at Crewe. He is a very versatile player who has appeared in all the forward positions and also at wing-half. A tireless worker and usually amongst the goals.

KEITH STOTT

Born Atherton, Lancs. First joined Crewe as an amateur in season 1964/5 and signed full-time forms later the same season. He started as a centre-half with the occasional game at centre-forward but is now firmly established at wing-half. A strong player with a total of 107 first team games to date.

MICK GANNON

Born Liverpool. Started his career with Everton then moved to Scunthorpe. He joined the Crewe staff during season 1964/65 and soon established a firm place in the side. A very popular member of the staff who has just completed two successive seasons with maximum League appearances. 159 appearances to date.

NEIL TURNER

Formerly with Blackpool and one of the close season recruits to the staff. Although mainly appearing in the Central League side he has also had some first team experience. A six-footer who should prove a useful acquisition.

FORWARDS

TOMMY CURLEY

Born Glasgow. An experienced player who has been with Celtic, Portsmouth and Brentford. He joined the Crewe staff on the opening day of season 1967/68. Plays either at wing or inside-forward. 18 first team appearances.

After many years of faithful service with Huddersfield Town he joined the Crewe staff in January, 1968. A very experienced player making 20 appearances last season, scoring 3 goals, the last of these proving to be the one which assured promotion.

DON RATCLIFFE

Born Newcastle, Staffs. A seasoned campaigner having been with Stoke City, Middlesboro' and Darlington. Also joined Crewe in January, 1968 making his debut the same day as Kevin McHale. In his 20 games last season he showed his versatility appearing at full-back, wing-half, wing and inside-forward.

JOHN REGAN

Born Worcester. After previous service with Shrewsbury Town and Brentford he joined the Crewe staff in November, 1966 and scored on his debut against Aldershot. A deceptive player with an eye for goals. 45 first team appearances to date.

ALAN TARBUCK

Now starting his second season at Crewe. A teenager who came from Everton and quickly established a place in the League side. He is a busy type of player who never gives up and who finished high up on the goals list. 31 first team appearances.

GORDON WALLACE

Formerly with Liverpool and joined the Gresty Road staff in October, 1967. Son of a former Scottish International, he has proved to be a most useful acquisition. Scored 9 goals in 29 appearances besides creating many others for his colleagues.

WAYNE EMMERSON

Born Ontario, Canada. Formerly with Manchester United, he also joined the club in the close season. Another young player who should do well.

JOHN INGLIS

Born Leven, Fife. Formerly with Aston Villa, another new recruit to the playing staff. Whilst at Villa Park he played mainly in the reserve side. He should also prove to be a useful signing.
