NEWS and VIEWS

Although these notes must be produced before the match at Walsall, it would seem our promotion hopes are much higher, although, even if the result was right, the Crewe game from the football angle was very poor indeed.

Our home form for several weeks has been most disappointing, with spectators becoming more frustrated and anxious than even the players. Our away form on the other hand has been the best ever.

To date we have played 21 home games, of which 16 were wins, 4 draws and 1 lost. We have also played 21 away games with the following results: won 8, drawn 5, lost 8. The amazing thing is, however, that we have won 16 home games and scored 35 goals. Although we won only half that number away, we scored 30 goals. It would seem we take our opportunities better on our opponents' grounds. Included in the away goals are, of course, the wins at Northampton 6—2, Tranmere 5—3 and Barrow 3—0. On the other hand, at home we defeated Southport 5—1 and Oldham 5—1.

Our support has been tremendous, but it cannot have been very encouraging to our loyal supporters these last few games, especially the scarcity of goals.

However the outlook is quite pleasing. At the time of writing Luton have 57 points and two games to play. Assuming they gain maximum points, the total can only be 61 points. Swindon has 57 points and four games to play, plus a superior goal

average. Two home wins should clinch the matter, and end the tension.

Our next home game, against Barrow, is on MONDAY, 5th MAY. Please note change of day from our usual Tuesday. This arrangement has been made to avoid clashing with the televising of International matches on the Tuesday and Wednesday. Followers of football will have quite a feast that week but, of course, to us the important thing is promotion.

After the Barrow game there is one more important match at the County Ground, namely the second leg of the English Schools Shield on 10th May.

Swindon's opponents will be Liverpool, who on Tuesday last won at Barnsley — no mean feat. They must be a very strong team. The first leg will have been played and the result known to all supporters before the teams take the field on 10th May. Whatever that result may be, we trust the boys will have a record gate on that day. As we said of the League Cup Final — it is a great achievement to appear in such a game. May they emulate the Senior team, and gain the trophy.

Our opponents today are fighting to escape relegation, so the game will be as hard as all our matches of late.

Last season Mansfield occupied 20th place in the League table when they visited the County Ground on Saturday, 30th March, 1968. The game was very disappointing, and the score of 1—1 made it our fourth successive draw. Swindon opened brightly enough and took the lead through Joe Butler prior to half-time. The second half seemed to lack enthusiasm, and


