

## news & views

The struggle for points becomes increasingly difficult, as both ourselves and our opponents today are finding out. Last season Millwall were at one time very much in the running for promotion to the First Division. They have found life much more difficult this season, and are in a very low position in the League table. Despite this fact, or maybe in view of it, they will be a difficult team to beat. Millwall, always a strong, hard side, have their backs to the wall, and will fight for every ball.

Although the two clubs have been in different Divisions of the league for a short period, we have missed them, and are pleased indeed to welcome them back to the County Ground. We are real old friends because, like us, Millwall has spent many seasons in Division 3, although they have had

several spells in Division 2 for much longer time than Swindon.

One is always assured of a great welcome (in many ways) at their tight little ground, "The Den", and one could recall many fine tussles between the clubs. Some of our older supporters can go back with me to one famous

occasion "in the fog".

We welcome the team and officials, and it will be a pleasure to meet their Chairman for some years, Mr. Purser. Like many others he has known the varying fortunes of football clubs. Also we welcome that doyen of managers, Mr. Benny Fenton, a real gentleman and a credit to football, even though he was tough and hard as a player. Many remember him at West Ham, and later Charlton, where we believe he was a colleague of our present manager, Mr. Fred Ford. There should be some wonderful stories and reminiscences in that little office after the match. Hope he doesn't do any cooking!

Most supporters remember Mr. Fenton as a highly successful manager at

Colchester, and now Millwall. Nice to know you, sir!

So we are out of the League Cup Competition, and our hopes of another run and a Wembley appearance have disappeared. But as one so aptly

remarked on Wednesday evening - "There is still the F.A. Cup".

The match at Oxford aroused little interest in Swindon. It is a long time since we returned over 2,000 tickets for a cup-tie, and that one only thirty miles distant. It seemed strange with our supporters so greatly outnumbered compared with those of our opponents. Nevertheless the gate was quite large, over 18,000, and the game itself was quite a thrilling one. Excitement in plenty, especially in the visitor's goalmouth. Chances were created, some missed, some producing splendid saves, especially by Peter Downsborough,

and two efforts headed off the goal line.

Most will agree Oxford deserved to win, despite the fact that Swindon produced a good fight back in the last quarter-of-an-hour, and could easily have equalised in that period. The only goal scored was a good one, in the way the centre was headed into the net, but the moves leading up to the final centre were somewhat fortunate. Naturally everyone connected with the Club is disappointed, but such is football, and after all, to hope for or expect a repetition of last season is surely too much. So now to League football. Next Tuesday, 7th October, we travel to Carlisle, and that concludes the midweek games, and the team can settle down to Saturday matches up to Christmas, and those will be quite difficult enough with visits from many outstanding teams.

#### MILLWALL FOOTBALL CLUB

#### Season 1969/70

BRYAN KING (Goalkeeper)

Born at Bishops Stortford this 22-year-old 'keeper joined Millwall via Chelmsford City in June 1967. In his first season he made 17 First Team appearances, but last season was the regular custodian and altogether had 45 outings in the Senior side. Height

JOHN GILCHRIST (Full back)

John is the longest serving member of the Millwall staff having been with the Club since April 1961. A Scot from Wishaw, John has had 308 First Team appearances since joining the Club, in spite of injury.

HARRY CRIPPS (Full back)

Like Gilchrist, Cripps has been with the Club for 8 years, having arrived at the Den a couple of months later than John. His previous club was West Ham United. He has had 226 First Team appearances for the Millwall Club. Height 5ft. 10ins. Weight 13st. 8lbs.

BRIAN NICHOLS (Full back)

Age 24, he joined Millwall in July 1968 after 5 years with Fulham. Has yet to make his League debut with Millwall. KEN JONES (Half back)

Now in his sixth season with Millwall having joined them from Southend United in September 1964. A useful stalwart who started his career as an inside forward and was converted to a wing half when he joined Millwall. Height 5ft. 111ins. Weight 12st. 3lbs.

GEORGE JACKS (Half back)
George, who is 23, joined the Millwall staff in July 1965 on a free transfer from Queen's Park Rangers. Since the Club gained Second Division status three seasons ago has gained quite a reputation for marking the opposition key man out of the game.

Height 5ft. 61 ins. Weight 10st. 131bs.

BARRY KITCHENER (Half back) Barry is a product of the Millwall Youth scheme. Now 21 years of age he became an apprentice in August 1964 and turned full-time in August 1965. With the departure of Brian Snowden he took over the role of centre half in the League side and has not missed a League game during the past two seasons. Height 6ft. 11ins. Weight 13st. 8lbs. Born in Dagenham.

DEREK POSSEE (Forward)

Bought from Spurs in August 1967, Derek, who is 23, was leading goalscorer for the Club last season with 16 goals. Cost the Club a record transfer fee. Born in Southwark.

RON HOWELL (Forward)

Yet another product of the Club's youth policy. Signed as an apprentice in August 1965 and became full-time in March 1967 making his debut for the First Team a couple of days later.

EAMONN DUNPHY (Forward)

Born in Dublin. Has been many times capped for Eire. Began his career with Manchester United in 1960. Moved to York City in 1965 and was transferred to Millwall in January 1966. Height 5ft. 8ins. Weight 8st. 13lbs. Clever mid-field player. Age 24.

WILLIAM NEIL (Forward)

A Scot, age 24, who joined the Club from Scottish Junior club, Bonnyrigg Rose in March 1964. Also had a season with Hibernian in 1962/63. Height 5ft. 7ins. Weight 10st. 10lbs

KEITH WELLER (Forward)

London born at Islington. Previously with Spurs. Transferred to Millwall in May 1967. Joint leading goalscorer last season. Age 23. Toured New Zealand and Far East with F.A. Touring Party during last close season.

GORDON BOLLAND (Forward)

Began his career with Chelsea in 1959. In 1962 moved to Leyton Orient. In 1964 moved to Norwich City and in 1967 to Charlton Athletic. Transferred to Millwall in October 1968. Height 6ft. Weight 12st. 4lbs.

BRENDAN MULLEN (Forward)

Born Oleraine. Irish Under-23 International. Two seasons with Fulham. Joined Millwall July 1969.



Stay on A6 through Kendal and via Shap to the M6 Motorway.






