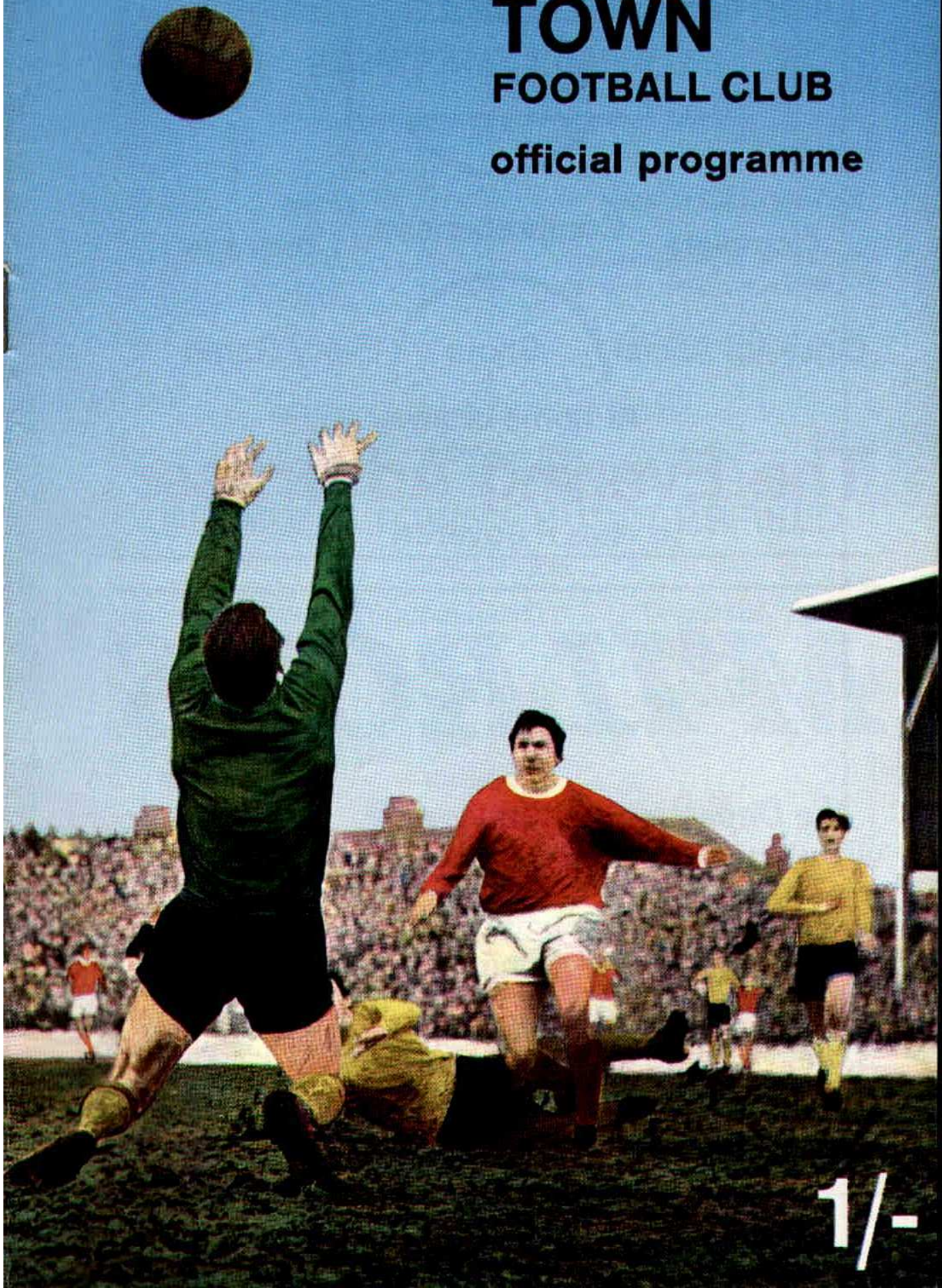


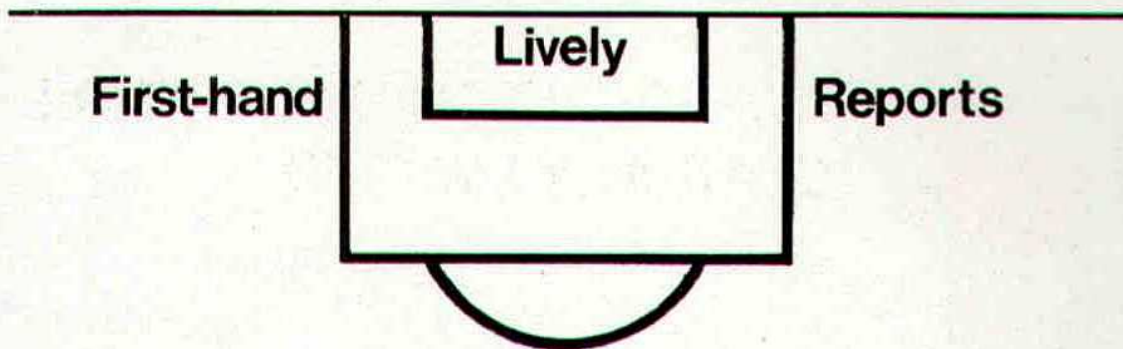

This afternoon it is with much pleasure we entertain the League leaders — Huddersfield Town. This season they are on the upgrade with several very good young players and a dedicated team boss, Mr. Ian Greaves (a Busby Babe), who has found a lot of young Yorkshire talent. At the beginning of the season, the critics tipped them as strong contenders for promotion.

Today Huddersfield, showing promise of a return to their former glory, proudly occupy top position with a splendid record:

However, Swindon are not far behind, and a great game should result from today's encounter.

When Huddersfield run on to the field in their original blue and white stripes, it will bring back memories to our older supporters of those glorious days in the early twenties, when Huddersfield was **the** team in the country, managed by the one and only Mr. Herbert Chapman, probably the greatest manager of all time; and what famous names one can recall: Mutch (goal-keeper), Sam Wadsworth (a great England left full-back), Islip (a fine centre-forward) and that wing pair of Clem Stephenson and Billy (W. H.) Smith.

Huddersfield Town started life in 1908, at a time when football belonged to the romantics. Within two years of being founded the Club was granted League status and by 1924 had won every honour then open to a club side — promotion from Division Two, the F.A. Cup, and the championship of the First Division. By 1926 they had established a record by winning the championship three seasons in a row. Just 16 years had elapsed (no football during World War I, 1914-18) since they had entered the League, and they had reached a point where they had no more worlds to conquer.

Yet in that short time they had also come to the verge of bankruptcy, and there was even a proposition to move the Club out of the town. One could recall many later famous names — Alex Jackson (outside-right), Bob Kelly (inside-right), Roy Goodall (right-back), Barkas Wilson (centre-half), Steele.

Huddersfield has been written off by many, but this season it appears most likely that they will return to their rightful sphere — namely Division I of the League.

Swindon last played Huddersfield on the County Ground on Saturday, 26th September, 1964. We had just suffered three successive defeats: 0—1 at home to Manchester City, 0—4 at Swansea, and 0—5 at Portsmouth, so it was a real tonic to win the game by 4 goals to 1. Swindon: Oakley; Dawson, Trollope; Morgan, McPherson, Smart; Leggett, Hunt, Summerbee, Skeen, Rogers. Huddersfield: Wood; Parker, McNab (now playing for Arsenal and England — remember him in the League Cup Final); Holden, Coddington, Dinsdale; Smith, Bettany, Guilliver, Balderstone, Lewis. in the return fixture played on 6th February, 1965, Swindon lost 1—2.

Supporters' Club Notes

The majority of the pro-formas sent out to those supporters and season ticket holders who went to Rome on the Club charter flight have now been returned. It would be much appreciated if those not yet returned could be dropped into the Social Club letter box when the County Ground is next visited.

The idea was to get some idea of the reaction to the first visit to European football by air, as organised by the Supporters' Club, and seek information which would be of value in any future flights.

Of those who went and returned the form, despite the snags which arose in Rome, it was very satisfying to find out that all would go again. About 35% indicated that an overnight stop, on long flights such as to Rome, would be supported. Obviously, this would give more time to see the place visited. This would, of course, pose problems for those who had to go to work next day — which applies particularly to mid-week matches.

What was encouraging was the high proportion of those who were in favour of flying to away matches in England. Carlisle springs to mind immediately, as such a flight would permit leaving Swindon about 9-10 a.m. on the Saturday morning instead of the previous evening or early morning.

I am informed that the colour photographs taken during the trip will come down from London by today, and anyone interested should call at the Social Club before today's match, provided they are Social Club members, or after the match in the Supporters' Club H.Q.'s, under the Town end stand, if not members.

Last Saturday, the 15th, marked a highly entertaining Fancy Dress dance in the Social Club. The judges — Mesdames Maureen Oliver and Peggy Jones, and Mick Blick, sustained by a former Swindon Town player, Mick Woolford (now playing for Andover) — had a difficult task, but ended with very popular winners. The winning child was Miss Jane Swatten (aged 4), in a charming "Roses (grow on you) Chocolate" costume; Mrs. E. Newman won the ladies' prize, as Monica (straight out of St. Trinians School); Mr. Vaughan Lovelock — a most impressive Vicar — was adjudged the winning gentleman. Mr. Mick Woolford (no relation to our judge), a sturdy infant dressed in a nappy and fully equipped with a bottle, was consoled by being christened there and then by the Vicar. As tribute to the liquid used for the ceremony, he is now officially known as "Son of Youngers".

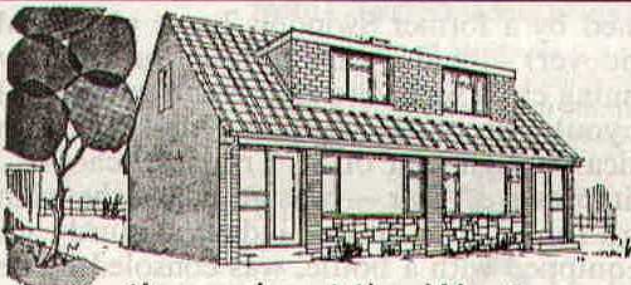

HUDDERSFIELD TOWN A.F.C. LTD.

TERRY POOLE (Goalkeeper)

Terry is 19 years old and Chesterfield born. He was Manchester United's fourth choice goalkeeper when Huddersfield's manager, Ian Greaves, persuaded his old boss, Sir Matt Busby, to part with him at the end of last season.

DENNIS CLARKE (Right-back)

Dennis joined Huddersfield from West Bromwich Albion 18 months ago for a fee of £25,000. He was born at Stockton on Tees.

GEOFF HUTT (Left-back)

Geoff was born at Hazelwood, and is one of the Yorkshire club's "home grown" products. Two years ago he was in Huddersfield's "A" team . . . now they regard him as one of the best full-backs in Division 2.

JIMMY NICHOLSON (Right-half)

An Irish international and captain of the Huddersfield side. He was born in Belfast, and joined the Town from Manchester United.

ROY ELLAM (Centre-half)

Joined Huddersfield from Bradford City before the start of the 1966-67 season. He was born at Hemsworth, and was a product of the City's junior side. He made 41 of the 42 possible League appearances last term.

TREVOR CHERRY (Left-half)

Born in Huddersfield, and joined the Club straight from school. He was the only member with an ever-present record last season.

BOBBY HOY (Outside-right)

Bobby, Huddersfield's 20-year-old outside-right, joined the Club straight from school four years ago. He was born at Halifax and, although only 5ft. 7½in. tall, is considered one of the chief danger-men in the Huddersfield attack.

JIMMY LAWSON (Inside-right)

Joined Huddersfield from Middlesbrough, where he was born. He made 39 appearances last season, scoring eight goals.

FRANK WORTHINGTON (Centre-forward)

Frank was an amateur two years ago and, indeed, retained that status well into last season when he started to become a first-team regular. The Halifax-born forward is very good in the air, and is currently leading the Town's scorers with nine to his credit.

JIMMY MCGILL (Inside-left)

Previously with Arsenal, Jimmy made 40 appearances last term. Born in Glasgow, he is a goal-maker rather than scorer, and likes to play deep in midfield.

COLIN DOBSON (Outside-left)

Joined Huddersfield from Sheffield Wednesday in 1966. The fee was believed to be in the region of £20,000. He is second highest goalscorer for Huddersfield Town at present, with eight goals to his credit.

The man in the middle

KEITH WALKER

Today's referee is Keith Walker, of Maidstone. Keith's hobbies include judo, fishing and cricket. During the week he is a senior administration officer with the Kent Estates department.

He took up refereeing 23 years ago after breaking his leg when playing for Lancashire Combination club Lytham F.C. and he won his way to the Football League list in 1960.

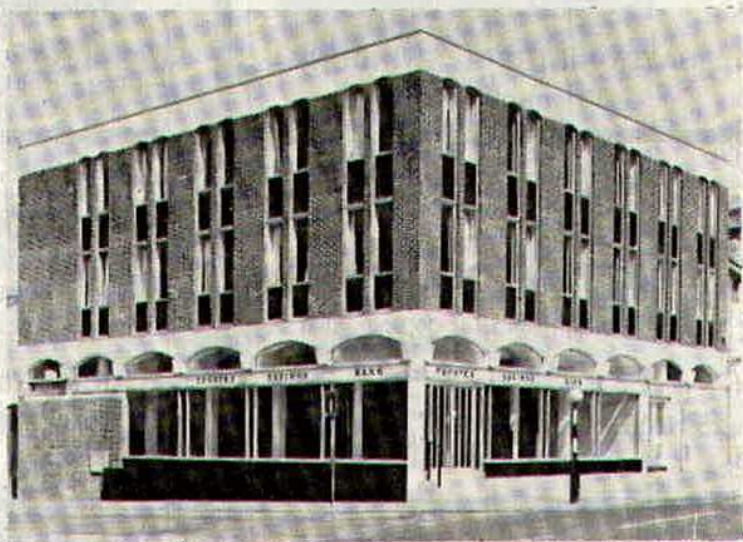
He considers ordinary League games every bit as important as big European competitive matches. "All games are important, whether on the local park or at the highest professional level", is his philosophy. And Keith has now refereed over 1,500 matches, some of them at the top professional level, including appointments in France, Spain, Portugal, Germany, Belgium, Iceland and Eire.

"Physical fitness is important, but positioning on the field is even more important for a referee," he says. "One does not have to be a greyhound to do a good job of control. Speed over short distances is necessary, but being in the right place at the right time is the most important part of refereeing — being able to read the game."

During his early refereeing days in Lancashire, Keith had to send off boxer Brian London. A few weeks later, following another incident, he sent off Brian's brother, Jack London!

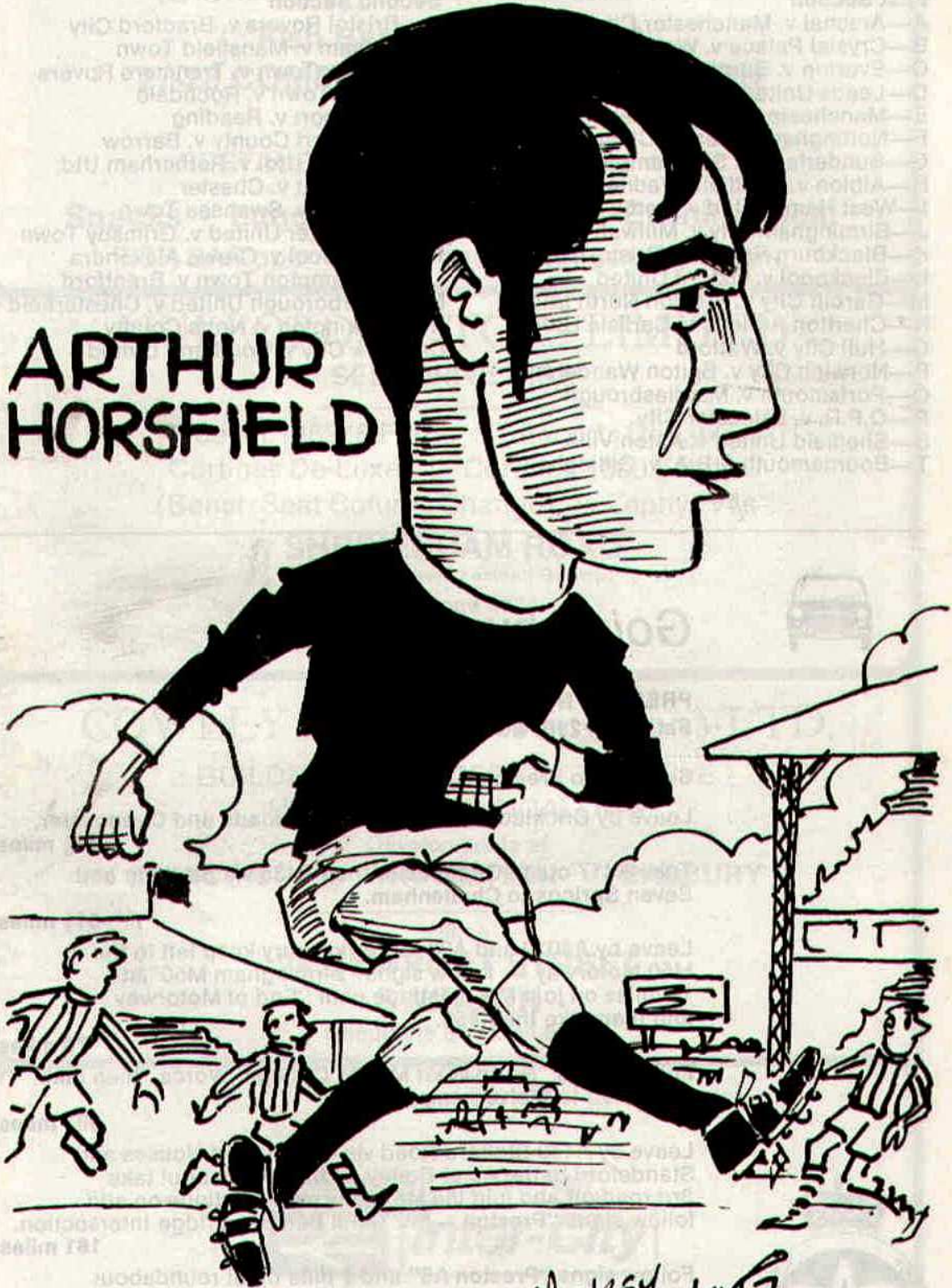
