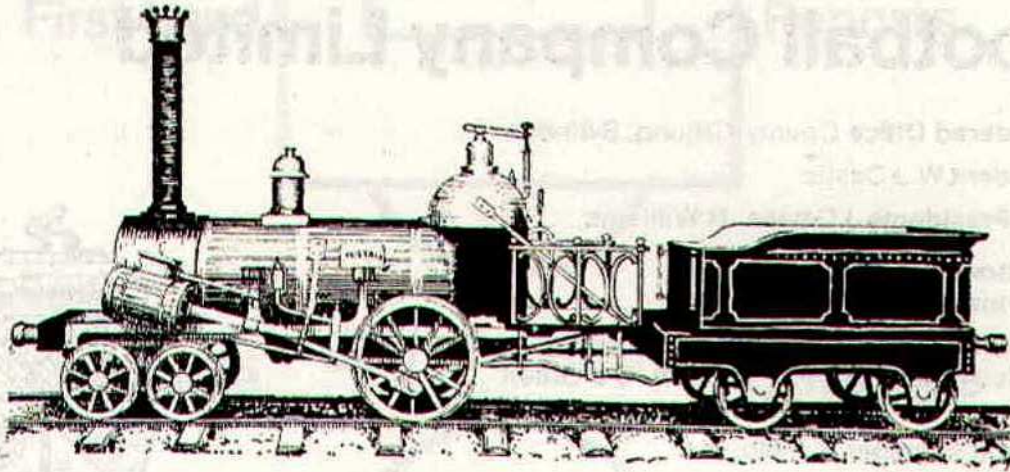

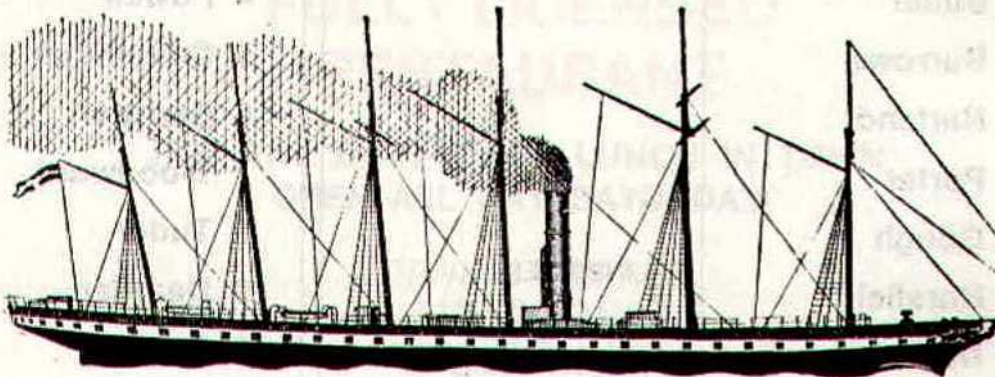

# news & views

This afternoon we entertain one of the strongest teams in Division 2. At the present time Sheffield United occupy fifth position in the League table with twenty-seven points from twenty-one games and are within striking distance of the top two clubs - Leicester City with thirty-one and Luton Town with thirty points.

Sheffield has scored the highest number of goals in Division 2 (thirty-eight), and conceded twenty-four goals, so obviously they play attacking football. Their record is really quite impressive. They have won five and drawn five of their home games, whilst away they have won four, drawn four and lost only three in all.

Swindon has scored twenty-seven goals but have had only twenty scored against, so the game could resolve itself into a fine battle between a strong defence and a real attacking force.

Last season's match, played on Saturday, 11th October, 1969, produced a really fine game watched by 21,770 spectators, and resulted in a win for Swindon by two goals to one. Peter Noble scored after twenty minutes, and Don Rogers in the seventieth minute. Woodward scored for Sheffield in almost the last minute of the game. Swindon: Downsborough; Thomas, Trollope; Butler, Burrows, Harland; Heath, Horsfield, Smart, Noble, Rogers. Sheffield United: Hodgkinson; Badger, Heaton; Barlow, Colquhoun, Powell; Woodward, Addison, Tudor, Currie, Reece.

Sheffield United are one of the original members of the League and have a fine ground at Bramall Lane (also one of the main grounds of Yorkshire County Cricket Club). It has a capacity of 55,000, with 7,200 seats. They have only played in Divisions 1 and 2 of the Football League, and they still retain their original playing colours of red and white vertical striped shirts and black shorts.

They have won the F.A. Cup four times in all, the last time in 1925, but they

were runners-up in 1936.

Our older supporters will remember such famous names as Billy Gillespie, Jimmy Dunne, Harry Johnson, Jimmy Hagan, Joe Shaw, and Fred Tunstall. The last-named was in the news on Saturday as still working for Boston United, defeated in the F.A. Cup by York City. Long-serving Alan Hodgkinson (who made his first appearance in August 1956) will almost certainly be playing as goalkeeper today.

A special welcome to manager Mr. John Harris, whose family lived in Shrivenham Road during the war. He still has many friends in Swindon, and his mother kept in touch with Mrs. and Mr. Martin (the former Swindon Town Trainer) and "Addy" Loveday, "mother" to so many of Swindon Town players from 1930 to 1950.

From time to time we write of former and older players. Supporters of the period 1920 to 1930, will remember the one and only Jack Ing - a part-timer, and not a great player, but the finest servant any club ever had. He would play anywhere in any team and do anything for Swindon Town. A real one hundred per cent man. We are sorry to say he is very ill in the Princess Margaret Hospital. He has been in ill health for some time, and has not visited the County Ground for several seasons. We send him best wishes, especially at this time of the year.

This is the last programme of 1970, and our next home game will be on the 16th January unless we draw at Queen's Park Rangers, and a replay could then take place at the County Ground on Tuesday, 5th January, 1971. May we therefore wish all our supporters a very Happy Christmas and a successful New Year. Thank you for your support and also for purchasing the programmes.

Remember we visit Cardiff City on Boxing Day. See you all then, and the Best of Luck. I also hope to see you all in London on the 2nd January, 1971.

## **Sheffield United**

### **Alan Hodgkinson**

Now in his 18th season at Bramhall Lane, was signed from Worksop Town, a Midland League club. Ex-butchers boy who became an England International goalkeeper. Under-23 International, then full caps against Scotland in 1957 and against Eire and Denmark. Many other appearances, the last against Wales, 1961. Went to Chile with the World Cup squad. Is also a first-class cricketer as wicket-keeper and batsman. At start of the season had made 552 League appearances and played in 58 F.A. Cup-ties for United.

### **David Powell**

Joined United from Wrexham on the 11th September, 1968. The next month played for Wales against Italy and has kept his International place ever since. Last year played against Scotland, England and Ireland.

### **Len Badger**

Took over from Cec Coldwell as right-back and skippered the team until Eddie Colquhoun arrived. Has many Under-23 caps and has played for the Football League. Debut in Division 1 against Leyton Orient on the 26th April, 1963. Played for Sheffield Boys, England Boys (four times) and Young England. Toured Holland and Germany when 16 in 1962 and was the youngest member of the England Youth team.

### **Ted Hemsley**

Signed by Arthur Rowley from his former club, Shrewsbury Town, on 21st August, 1968. Has played right-half and left-half, but is now settled in the left-back position. First appearance against Millwall on 24th August, 1968. Plays cricket for Worcestershire.

### **Eddie Colquhoun**

Took over the captaincy from Badger. Was signed from West Bromwich Albion on the 11th October, 1968. Was previously with Bury. Born in Preston Pans. A Scottish Under-23 International. Debut at Huddersfield on the 19th October, 1968.

### **Mick Heaton**

Joined as an amateur in the Spring of 1962. Debut against Bury on the 16th November, 1968. Has since made 33 League and Cup appearances.

### **John Barnwell**

Signed from Nottingham Forest on the 24th April, 1970. Former amateur with Bishop Auckland. Made 138 appearances for Arsenal and joined Forest in March 1964. Was an England Under-23 International.

### **John Flynn**

Transferred from Workington on the 17th July, 1969, and has played wing-half and full-back.

### **Frank Barlow**

Gave up chance to go to University to join United. At Mexborough Grammar school he had six "C" level and three "A" level passes. Played for Yorkshire Boys and was captain of England six times. Has played at inside-left, inside-right, outside-left, left-half and right-half.

### **Colin Addison**

Signed from Arsenal on the 28th November, 1967. Played for York Boys and York City, moved to Nottingham Forest for six years and then to Arsenal. Has played for United at all inside-forward positions and at right-half.

### **Gil Reece**

Another Welsh International. Signed from Newport County on the 17th April, 1965. Made debut the following season. Born in Cardiff, formerly played for Pembroke. First cap against England, 2nd October, 1965. Last played as substitute against Rest of U.K. last July.

### **Tony Currie**

Signed from Watford on 1st February, 1968. Played for England Youth against France and Eire. London-born, he had short spells with Queen's Park Rangers and Chelsea. In his debut against Spurs on the 26th February, 1968, he scored one of United's three goals.

## Bill Dearden

Transferred from Chester on the 17th April, 1970, and played in the County Cup. A native of Oldham, he played for Athletic but did not turn "pro" until he was 20 after completing his apprenticeship as a plumber. Then went to Crewe for 18 months and moved to Chester in June 1968.

## Graeme Crawford

Reserve goalkeeper. Signed from East Stirling on 5th September, 1968. Did well in following close season tour of Italy.

## David Staniforth

Another former junior, from Chesterfield. Has played five times in the first team and scored two goals.

## John Tudor

Transferred from Coventry City on the 14th November, 1968, for United's record fee. Scored two goals on his debut at Bury two days later, and finished second highest scorer with 11 League goals in 19 appearances. Has suffered from injury and after scoring seven goals from centre-forward in his first 16 games, came in for the final six and scored two more.

## Geoff Salmons

Has come up through junior teams. Made League debut at West Bromwich on the 30th September, 1967. Born at Mexborough, near Rotherham. Can play any inside-forward position.

## Alan Woodward

Has been top scorer for the past two seasons. He scored 12 goals in the 1968/69 season and 18 in the League and 3 League Cup goals last season. A "teenager find", he played for Barnsley Boys when they won the Schools Shield in 1961. Also played for Yorkshire Boys, and England Youths against Belgium, Spain and Scotland in 1965. Was Reserve for the Football League v League of Ireland in September 1969, and played as substitute when Everton's Colin Harvey had to go off.

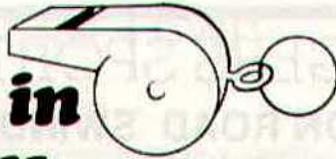
