# news Eviews

Today we welcome our near neighbours Oxford United, who could well be in the Quarter-Finals of the F.A. Cup competition. Unfortunately these notes must be compiled before the result is known of the replay with Leicester City. Reports show they deserved to draw, and we trust they have won the return game, so qualifying to play at home the winners of the Manchester City v Arsenal tie. We wish them well, and look forward to the time when we may see them at Wembley. If they have won the replay (and we sincerely hope they do) they are just two games away from that great occasion. Well, who knows? Oxford are certainly enjoying Cup football this season having beaten Burnley, and then disposed of Watford in a replay, so last Wednesday's match was their fifth in the competition.

Oxford made a splendid beginning in the League this season, but have fallen back a little since then. They now occupy 14th position with 26 points from 26 games played. Swindon is in 9th position with 30 points from 28 games played. The records are somewhat similar, except for the fact that Oxford's away results are as good as the home, whereas until recently Swindon's away results left much to be desired. In fact, we did not gain an away point until we played at Oxford (result 0-0) on the 21st November 1970, our tenth away game. We have not looked back since then until last Saturday, when we lost 0-1 at Orient, after ten successive League matches without defeat.

Oxford has won five away games and drawn three, and have exactly the same record at home. Their away goal average is 15–17. Swindon on the other hand has won one game away from home and drawn four with a goal average of 13–21. At home however Swindon has won ten (compared with five by Oxford), drawn four, and lost none.

Today's game should prove interesting, with a team defending its excellent home record against a team with a splendid away record. Statistics show,

unfortunately, it could be a low scoring game. Apart from the League Cup last season (result Oxford 1, Swindon 0) the two clubs have met on nine occasions, and Oxford has yet to win, seven of the matches have been drawn (six 0-0 and the other 1-1). The other two were won by 3-0, both times, once at Swindon and once at Oxford. Oxford has scored only one goal and Swindon seven.

It looks almost like what the punters term a 'banker'. Oxford could of course be a little weary after their strenuous cup-tie, but that does not always follow. Success brings success, and match practice helps to sustain the rhythm and teamwork. However well they have done in the Cup competition, to Oxford today's game is sure to be one of great importance both from prestige and League position, and for Swindon too. Although unfortunately we lost at Orient last Saturday, we are not out of the hunt yet. Cardiff, in second place, has 36 points, just six more than ourselves. Points have still to be won, and a resounding victory today would put us right back on the promotion path.

The corresponding game last season resulted in a draw 0-0. The attendance was excellent - 21,907 spectators witnessed the match. Receipts: £4,898 14s. We hope to get that number today.

The composition of the two teams has altered little in a year.


