PEN PICTURES, 1971-72

PETER DOWNSBOROUGH (Goalkeeper)—Born Halifax. Signed in August 1965 from Halifax Town where he was a product of local football. A fearless agile player who has done much to strengthen the Town's defence. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners cup-winning team of 1969. Played in Anglo-Italian Inter Club Competition winning team Season 1969-70.

ROD THOMAS (Full-back)—Born Glyncorrwg. A former youth player with the club. He was signed from Gloucester City in July 1964. Has gained Welsh Under-23 caps and full Welsh caps. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final Winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners cup-winning team of 1969 and played in Anglo Italian Inter Club Competition winning team season 1969-70.

JOHN TROLLOPE (Left-back)—Born Swindon. A local player who joined the Swindon ground staff from school. He was selected for the first team at the beginning of the 1960-61 season when he was just 16 years old, and was ever-present during that season. Together with his partner that year, who was also 16, they were the youngest full-backs ever to appear as a pair in League Football. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners Cup winning team of 1969 and played in Anglo Italian Inter Club competition winning team season 1969-70.

DAVE MACKAY (Defender)—Born Edinburgh. He commenced his professional career with the Scottish club Hearts in 1951. Was subsequently transferred to Tottenham Hotspur in 1953 and left them to join Derby in season 1967-68. He was capped 26 times for Scotland and is the holder of a Scottish League Cup Winners medal, the Scottish Football Association Cup Winners medal and the England Football Association Cup Winners medal. In addition he is also the possessor of a European Cup Winners medal which he obtained with Tottenham. He is probably the only player who has played both for the Scottish League team and also the English Football League team. Signed by Swindon in May 1971. His experience and ability is expected to do much for the Town in their quest for First Division status.

JOE BUTLER (Full-back)—Born Newcastle. Joined Swindon from Newcastle United in August 1965 where he graduated to the senior ranks through the club's Junior team. A tenacious player whose speed and ability amply make up for his lack of inches. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners cup-winning team of 1969 and in Anglo-Italian Inter Club Competition winning team season 1969-70.

ROGER SMART (Right-half or inside forward)—Born Swindon. Another local player who joined the club direct from Swindon Schoolboys team. At 17 he was appearing regularly at centre-forward in the Reserve team, but he excels as a deep-lying inside forward. A versatile player who is able to play at wing-half. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners Cup winning team of 1969, and played in Anglo Italian Inter Club competition winning team in season 1969-70.

FRANK BURROWS (Centre-half)-Born Larkhall, Scotland. Joined the club from Scunthorpe United for whom he played three seasons. Formerly with Raith Rovers. A strong defender who has made his mark in the first team. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners cup winning team of 1969, and played in Anglo Italian Inter Club

competition winning team season 1969-70.

STAN HARLAND (Left-half)—Born Liverpool. Was signed from Carlisle United in July 1966. Formerly with Everton and Bradford City. He has been a regular choice at left-half since making his debut at the beginning of the 1966-67 season. A forceful player who likes to go forward to back up the forwards in attack. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners cup-winning team of 1969 and played in Anglo Italian Inter Club competition winning team season 1969-70.

DON ROGERS (Outside right or left)-Born Paulton. He was signed by Swindon when only 15 and quickly came to the fore. Gained many England Youth International caps and subsequently played in the England Under-23 international team. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69. Played in League Cup Winners cup-winning team of 1969, and played in Anglo

Italian Inter Club competition winning team season 1969-70.

PETER NOBLE (Inside forward)—Born Sunderland. Joined the club from Newcastle in January 1968 for whom he played for four seasons. Prefers to play an attacking role. Regular member of promotion-winning side of season 1969 69. 1968-69. Played in Football League Cup Final winning team of season 1968-69.

Played in League Cup Winners cup-winning team of 1969, and played in Anglo Italian Inter Club competition winning team season 1969-70.

ARTHUR HORSFIELD (Inside forward)—Born Newcastle. A close season signing from Newcastle United. Previously played for Middlesbrough whom he joined as a Youth international. Top goal scorer last season. Played in League Cup Winners cup-winning team of 1969 and played in Anglo Italian

Inter Club competition winning team season 1969-70.

STEPHEN PEPLOW (Outside right)—Born Liverpool. Played for Liverpool Schoolboys, and joined Liverpool from school. Made three first team appearances season 1969-70 for Liverpool and was a regular member of the team which won the Central League for two consecutive years.

FRED FORD—Team Manager

Player 1935-46 Charlton; 1946-48 Millwall; 1948-50 Carlisle.

Injury finished playing career.

1950-53 Trainer Coach with Carlisle together with Bill Shankly who was manager of that club.

1954-60 Bristol Rovers (Coach)

1960-67 Bristol City (Manager). Club gained promotion from Third to Second Division during this period.

1967-68 Swindon (Coach).

1968-69 Bristol Rovers (Manager). Swindon (Team Manager).

Whilst with Bristol Rovers was Trainer England 'B' and Under-23 teams and for F.A. Teams.





BLACKPOOL A583 towards Preston following M6 Motorway signs via A5072, A59, A583 and A49 to M6 intersection 29 Bamber Bridge (21 miles); M6 southbound to intersection 12 junction with A5 (103 miles); Follow M6-M1 link signs via A5, A452 and A45 to M45 motorway (151 miles); M45 merges with M1 in 8 miles then follow "M1 London" signs to intersection 2, Hendon North London, Five Ways Corner junction A1/A41 (227 miles); Follow "A1 City" signs to A406 North Circular Road and go left with North Circular via Edmonton to Woodford junction with A104. Right with A104 then A114/A116 to East Ham junction with A124 (Barking Road) (244 miles); Right with A124 through Canning Town to Poplar entrance to Blackwall Tunnel crossing Thames via tunnel (248 miles); Exit Blackwall Tunnel bearing right via Trafalgar Road to New Cross (251 miles). 

There was very little interest by the supporters for the two matches played in Italy against Roma and Verona, but when Blackpool unexpectedly reached the final there was a sudden surge of interest and arrangements had literally to be made overnight

to fly about 100 keen supporters to Italy for the final.

Many more would have gone but for the expense of over £30 for a day out, and others would have gone except for knowing it was to be transmitted in full by TV. As Blackpool will be participating again next year about 80 of our supporters have decided to take their holidays for a fortnight in Italy next year and see the matches during that period. They have already commenced a Savings Club and Mr. Jack Procter, one of the committee, attends the Clubroom every Friday night to receive contributions. Anyone who would like to join in is welcome and should contact Mr. Procter.

Of course, definite arrangements cannot yet be given for dates, hotel bookings, etc. until the actual opponents and fixtures are known.

Another holiday project is a bit further ahead for the World Cup matches in Munich, but we will have to wait until we see whether England qualify first, as there would not be a great deal of interest otherwise.


